DENVER, Colo., Jan 31 -- One retirement and eight promotional transfers in managerial personnel of The Great Western Sugar Company were announced today by Fred G. Holmes, vice president-agricultural administration.

Lyman H. Andrews of Denver, southern district manager, will retire April 1 after nearly 48 years of service with the company. A graduate of the University of Nebraska and naval officer in World War I, Mr. Andrews was first employed as a fieldman at Scottsbluff, Nebr., in 1919. In subsequent promotions he became assistant Nebraska district manager and manager of factories at Lyman, Nebr.; Sterling, Greeley and Eaton, Colo.; and Billings, Mont. In 1948 Mr. Andrews came to Denver as assistant vice president. In 1949 he was appointed northern district manager and since 1957 has been southern district manager.

Succeeding Mr. Andrews as southern district manager will be L. E. Butler of Greeley, Colo. Mr. Butler, a graduate of CSU and lieutenant colonel in World War II, came to Great Western in 1946 as fieldman at Eaton. He has served as assistant manager at Brighton,

assistant to the southern district manager and manager of the Colorado factories at Ovid, Longmont, Eaton and Greeley.

LaMar C. Henry, manager of the Brighton, Colo. factory since 1958, is named manager of the new "Tri-County" factory under construction near Goodland, Kan. A graduate of CSU, Mr. Henry came to Great Western in 1946 after five years of duty with the Air Service. He was first employed at the CW experiment station at Longmont and held subsequent posts as ^{Fieldman at Longmont} assistant manager at Scottsbluff and Gering, Nebr.; ^{assistant to the} ~~Fieldman~~ ^{southern district manager, Ilwaco; manager at Ovid and} ~~at Longmont,~~ ^{Denver.} assistant to the president of the company, ~~and manager of~~ the ~~Ovid factory.~~

Succeeding Mr. Henry as manager at Brighton is John Stewart, manager at Windsor and Fort Collins. Mr. Stewart, a graduate of Utah State Agricultural college and lieutenant-colonel during the war, first came to Great Western in 1936 as ^{Fieldman} ~~field~~ at Longmont. Following war service he was assigned to the Brighton district in 1945, served as assistant manager at Brighton and Fort Lupton and became manager at Ovid in 1948, going to Fort Collins as manager in 1952.

Don Redman, assistant to the southern district manager, Denver, since 1965, is appointed manager of the Eaton factory. A graduate of CSU and captain in combat artillery during the war, Mr. Redman came to the company in 1946 as fieldman in eastern Colorado and became assistant manager at Fort Morgan in 1960.

Waldo Peterson, assistant manager at Billings, Mont., is appointed manager at Greeley. Following war service he was graduated from CSU and came to Great Western in 1950. He served ^{as fieldman} ~~with field forces~~ at Brighton, Kimball, Nebr., and Laurel, Mont., before going to Billings in 1963.

James Gonyou, fieldman at Powell, Wyo., the past 14 years, is appointed assistant manager at Billings. Following military duty he was graduated from CSU and came to Great Western in 1948.

William Nelson, fieldman at Mitchell, Nebr., is appointed assistant manager at Bayard, Nebr. He is a graduate of Kansas State University, an Air Force veteran and entered company service in 1957.

George Lapaseotes, Windsor, Colo. fieldman, comes to Denver as assistant to the southern district manager. He is a graduate of the University of Wyoming and came to Great Western in 1958.
