The Great Western Sugar Company will host nine leaders of the French sugar industry during their three day visit to Denver (May 5-7). Their stay in Denver is part of a tour of the U.S., during which they will visit several American sugar companies.

On Tuesday, May 6, they will be taken on a tour of part of Great Western's Northern Colorado facilities, including the sugar factory at Brighton and the MSG Plant at Johnstown. On Wednesday, May 7, they will visit the Kemp sugar factory, near Goodland, Kansas.

Wives of the delegation will be taken on a tour in the mountains, including a trip to Central City, and a trip to a typical American shopping center.

Heading the delegation will be Charles Boinet, chairman of the Epenancourt sugar factory. Paul Mathieu, chairman of the Vauciennes sugar factory and vice-president of the French National Sugar Manufacturers Union is also a member of the delegation.

Guiard, engineer of the Solesmes sugar factory; Frederic Lanvin, chairman of the Bresles sugar factory; and Roger Saunier of the French National Sugar Manufacturers Union.
