"Hospital Library Develops Automated Journal Holdings List"

Shirley Ting, VA Medical Center, Kansas City, MO

VA Medical Center Library in Kansas City, Missouri has had an inhouse system utilizing a PDP 11/34 mini computer since Spring 1982. The software is Information Management Processing System (IMPRS) developed by the Ruf Corporation and Written in Fortran. Three files, including journal holdings, subscription, audiovisual holdings, and circulation have been developed for the library. Future plans include computer searchable book catalog and inter-library loan statistics.

"The Downsizing of Medical Libraries: The Role of Health Sciences Library Consortia"

Karen T. Hackleman, MCRMLP, Omaha, NE

The transition of America's industrial base to one of microelectronics has had an analogous effect on medical librarians, changing independent entities involved with manual operations to facilities dependent on group configuration. Likewise, automated technology has affected the processes that medical librarians perform. In order to adapt to this new environment, a structure has emerged -- that of the multi-type library network. These networks, especially health sciences library consortia, are affecting the present and future of medical libraries.

"Stalking the Elusive Government Document: An Update"

Valerie Florance, University of Utah

The Reagan Administration has implemented policies which affect both the free distribution and sales of U.S. government publications. This paper will highlight the impact of those policies on the dissemination of federally-produced information. The presentation will conclude with suggestions for small libraries on how to acquire government publications in light of these changes.

"CHIC (Consumer Health Information Center) The Free Public Resource for Health Information"

Robert Bunnel, Salt Lake City, UT

A description of CHIC, its purpose, funding, development and success after a year of operation will be presented.

"Evaluation of audiovisuals for Patient Teaching"

Eris J. Kirby, VA Medical Center, Salt Lake City, UT

This study examines criteria used to acquire non-print materials for patient education. After viewing slide/sound programs, patient cognitive gain was compared against librarian preview evaluations. Correlations were made between the most effective program as evidenced by the patients gain and the librarian's opinion of how well educational design criteria was used in the development of the program.

WEDNESDAY, September 21, 1983:

MLA CE 464 -- ONLINE SEARCHING IN PSYCHIATRY (1981) .8 CEU

An intermediate level course on searching the literature of psychiatry; intended for librarians with some online searching experience or training.

- clarifying psychiatric terminology
- understanding the techniques used in psychiatry
- selecting MeSH headings
- constructing search formulations
- comparing the databases

MLA CE 668 -- CLINICAL LIBRARIANSHIP (1981) .8 CEU

A guide to developing a clinical librarianship program in the hospital setting.

- setting goals and objectives
- soliciting administration support
- choosing the "right" department
- developing policies and procedures
- evaluating the program

INTRO TO MICROS

To introduce the participants, through hands-on experience, to the operation and effective use of microcomputers. By the conclusion of this course the participants should be able to approach most microcomputers with confidence.

This course assumes no prior experience with microcomputers. Starting at the most basic point, how to turn on the machine, the course will survey the following:

- microcomputer design, operation and maintenance
- software acquisition and use
- BASIC programming language
- library applications of microcomputers

As each topic is presented, the participants will have an opportunity to perform practical exercises on Apple IIe microcomputers. Of necessity, the registration for this course is limited to 20.
