

# ESSENCE OF CAROID

A highly palatable solution of Caroid containing  $1\frac{1}{2}$  grains to the dram.

DOSE—for infants two months, and older, at least one teaspoonful, given preferably in the midst of feeding.

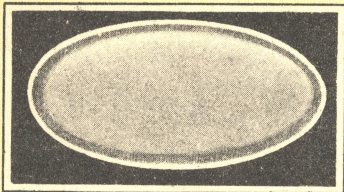
## A VALUABLE ADJUNCT IN INFANT FEEDING

Because it acts upon proteids in an acid, an alkaline or a neutral medium. Possessing great stability as compared with animal ferments it may be given by the mouth and depended upon to act throughout the whole digestive tract.

## DISSOLVES THE TROUBLESOME CURD

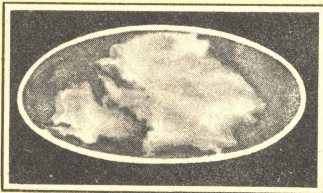
Casein of cow's milk frequently forms a tough leathery curd in the infant's stomach. Essence of Caroid forms a soft flocculent curd which is quickly decomposed in the stomach. It is not necessary to predigest milk (which renders it bitter) when Caroid is used.

## PRODUCES PROMPT RESULTS



### THE CAROID CURD

Soft and flocculent when formed. Is completely decomposed in 1 hour in a temperature  $100^{\circ}$  F.



### THE GASTRIC OR PEPSIN CURD

Tough and leathery after formation, and remains so for hours. Pepsin practically does not digest casein.
