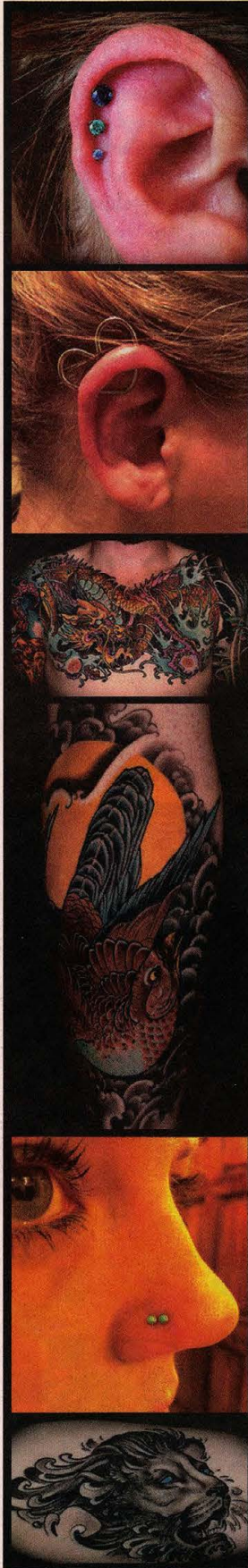

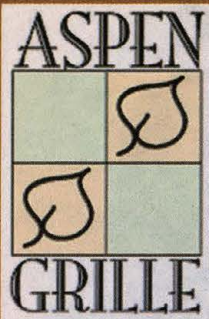

3. CSU Fashion

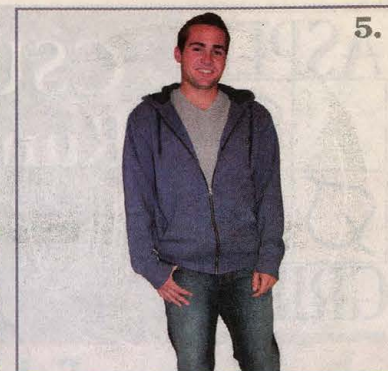

Layering is big in menswear this season. Slim-fit jeans, dress shirt, graphic tee and hoodie are all basics that can be worn in many different combinations.

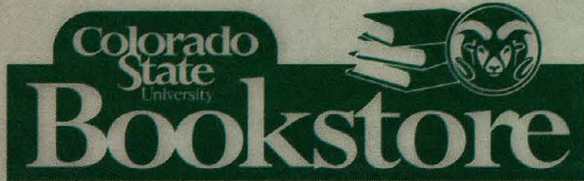

Sitting inside Walrus Ice Cream in Old Town, Fort Collins is reminiscent of going to an ice cream shop as a kid. The personalized, localized charm of the place has a different feel than the numerous Dairy Queens and Coldstone Creameries around the country. The walls are lined with thank-you artwork from children of Fort Collins, signed banners from various organizations at Colorado State University and posters advertising local events adding a sense of community to the family-owned establishment of 26 years.

Originally around the corner on College Avenue from its current location, Walrus Ice Cream was founded in 1987 with a niche to provide homemade, all-natural ice cream to customers. Walrus ice cream is made in-house and always offers an assortment of divine, unique flavors. A floor to ceiling dry-erase board behind the counter lists the flavors of the day, however, once one runs out, there is always a different one to take its place. The variety of flavors ranges from something as simple as Swiss Dark Chocolate to a more elaborate Butterscotch Oreo, to even one of the shop's most popular, Jack Daniels Chocolate Chip.

John Paugh, current owner of Walrus, and his wife bought the location in 1999, four years after it moved to its current location on Mountain Avenue.

According to Paugh, Walrus Ice Cream would not survive if not for the support of the Fort Collins community. They donate their one-of-a-kind ice cream to church

organizations, youth groups, sports teams and schools in the area, including CSU. Walrus works with CSU, more specifically, Residence Life and Fraternity and Sorority Life in providing ice cream for various events to show their support.

"In order to have the community support you, you have to support the community," Paugh said.

Since its opening, Walrus Ice Cream has expanded by adding another location on the south side of Fort Collins on Boardwalk Drive, as well as adding a wholesale service to provide ice cream to multiple restaurants in the immediate area.

Having previously won the "Best of CSU" for best ice cream, it gives Paugh and the Walrus family a sense of accomplishment for having a locally made, fairly priced, premium quality product that gets people to come through the doors.

the memory margarita

General Manager Jamie Zann says it's an escape in a glass — you can leave behind your problems for a while the moment you take a sip. So, what makes the Rio's margs so special? Zann, who has been general manager at the Rio for 20 years, answers all.

CA: What makes the Rio margaritas popular?

JZ: Well, they're pretty potent, and we've tried to keep the price pretty reasonable. They've got kind of a legendary following, also. A lot of it has to do with the vibe you feel when you're drinking them. It's not only that you're having a great margarita, it's that you're in a big cocktail party. The staff is having fun, the customers are having fun and you run into people you know. There are many stories after a night at the Rio.

CA: Has the Rio always had a goal of having a really popular margarita?

JZ: Originally, when there were the three partners, including owner Pat McLaughran, they were going for the Mexican food because the town was missing the TexMex they grew up with in Houston, Texas. They were craving that and saw an opportunity in Fort Collins. I doubt they foresaw what the margarita would really become.

CA: What do customers say they like about your margaritas?

JZ: Well, definitely the potency and the memories. They are also pretty crave-able and tasty. We have the classic rocks with salt and strawberry and mango flavors. It's become popular to get half-and-half of the strawberry and mango. We call it the manberry.

CA: How are they made?

JZ: They are made with Jose Cuervo Gold. We are also making some other drinks to expand our tequila offerings. We make what we call the Big Tex. That one is made with fresh squeezed citrus, a simple syrup and Jose Cuervo Tradicional Silver."

CA: Do you have a favorite?

JZ: You know, I've definitely switched to drinking the Big Tex a lot more often. You get a little bit more of the tequila taste to it. I'm definitely a frozen, no salt person.

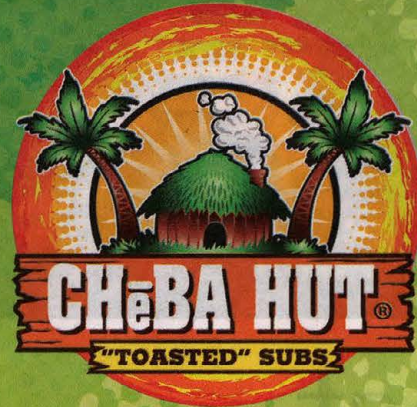

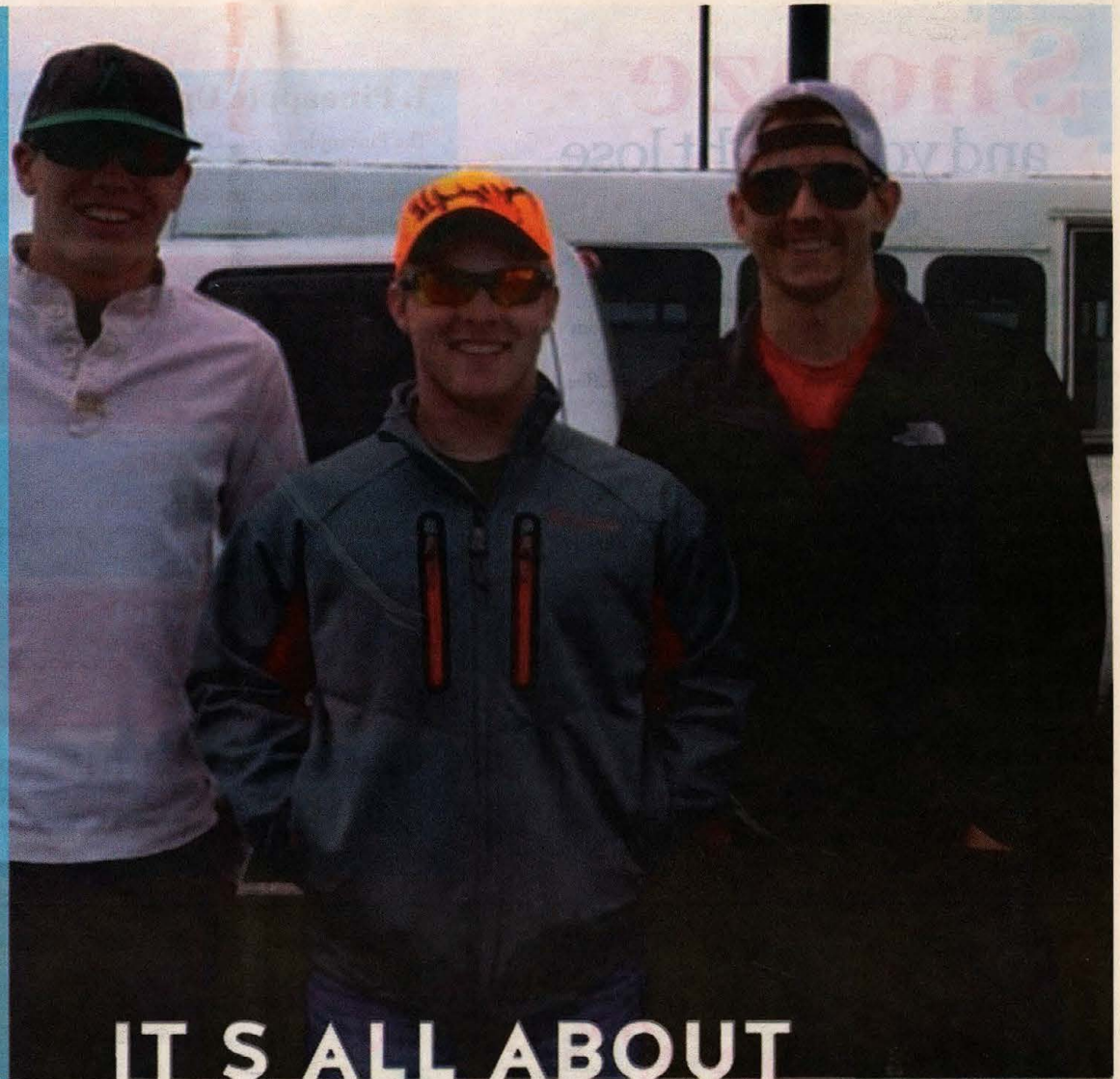

5. Blueberry Danish Pancake

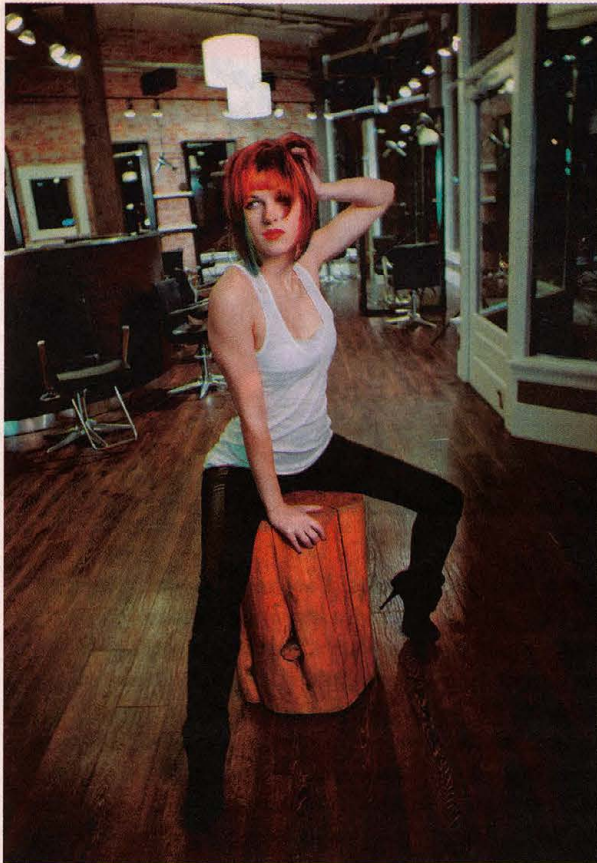

"New Belgium is a great company to represent, even though I'm not fully employed by them, yet," Fenner said.

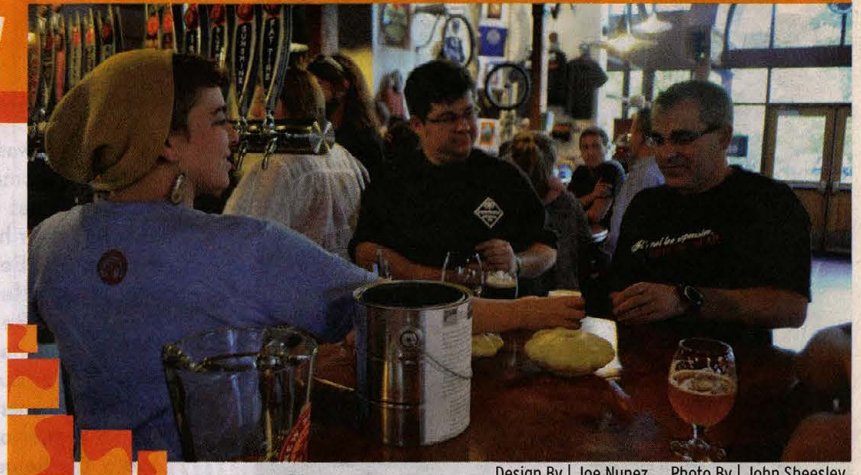
Since its founding in 1991, New Belgium has centered around its em-

ployees and the community. Now, 21 years later, the local brewery is doing more than ever to be a good neighbor.

"New Belgium is completely employee owned, so when you become an employee with New Belgium they give you a little bit of stock in the company," Fenner said. "They are so involved with the community. They represent Fort Collins in a certain way, being more sustainable and one of the most sustainable breweries. I think that draws a lot of people in."

New Belgium has committed to sustainable water, waste and greenhouse gas policies. They have also chosen to sustainably source all of the raw materials they use and to support many local charities.

"They are really conscious of their water usage and try to reuse water as much as they can. I know they reuse



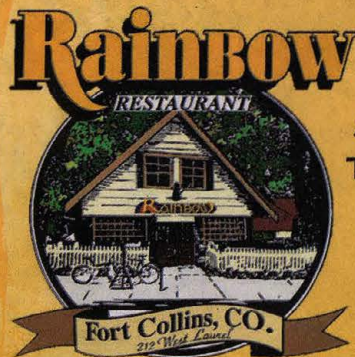

many materials and are able to compost a lot," Fenner said. "I love that all the tips go to non-profit organizations, if you choose to tip."

New Belgium diverts almost 95 percent of their waste from landfills and plans to reduce the water used in making a barrel of beer from 4.22 barrels of water to 3.5 by 2015. They also have philanthropic programs

focused on youth environmental education, sustainable agriculture, water conservation and restoration, sensible transportation and bicycle advocacy.

Through its great beer, strong sustainability practices and community oriented event planning, New Belgium has been a CSU favorite for years, and likely will be for years to come.

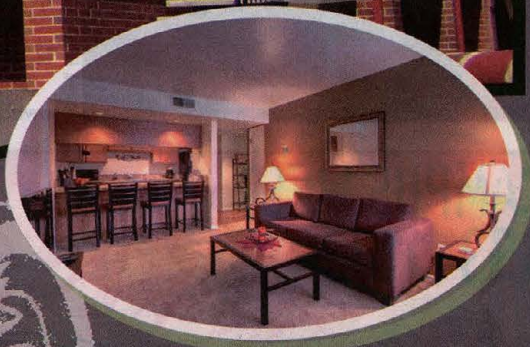

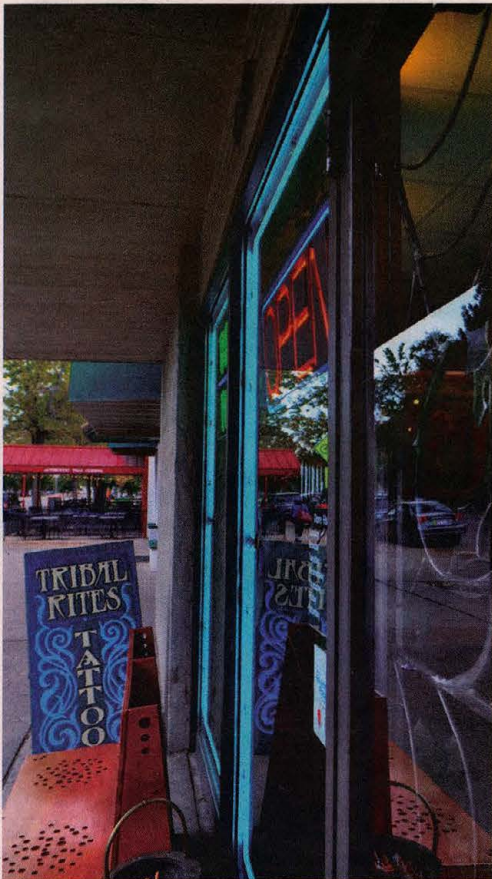

With a high-caliber staff, a clean studio and a vast selection of jewelry, there is only one choice left to make for a tattoo-inclined student: what to get.

"The most important thing I tell people who are looking to get tattooed is to look at the portfolio. Look at the artist's work, wherever it is you go to see the quality of the artist," Williams said. "A lot of people have this misconception that 'oh what I want is little — I want it just like that so anyone can do that.' I think you really need to find a really good artist no matter how big, little, important, not important."

Tribal Rites offers tattoos, personal consultations, piercings and walk-ins when there are cancellations. Tribal Rites does not offer lip tattoos, finger-mustache tattoos or other "fad tattoos."

"We are really into the art of tattooing," Williams said. "We really want to make good tattoos for people that will last a long time."

Stop by the shop between 12 p.m. and 7 p.m. on weekdays and 12 p.m. and 10 p.m. on weekends.

Be sure to check out this hotspot the next time your tastebuds are tingling for some spicy wings.

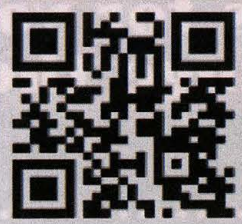
