Plant Health Care Workshop: The Rocky Mountain Chapter of the ISA is hosting a workshop scheduled for June 13th in Fort Collins. The title of this workshop is, "Preparing for the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Invasion." Since its discovery in June of 2002, this non-native insect has moved from Detroit, Michigan to most of the Midwestern states and as far south as the eastern half of Tennessee. In August of 2012, it was discovered in Kansas City, Kansas, just one state away from Colorado. The Kansas Department of Agriculture has implemented an emergency quarantine for Wyandotte County to prevent the spread of the EAB on all ash trees, which are in the genus *Fraxinus*. The quarantine is designed to prevent the movement of hardwood firewood, nursery stock of the genus *Fraxinus*, green lumber of the genus *Fraxinus*, and any other wood material (i.e., stumps, roots, branches, chips) of the genus *Fraxinus*. City officials estimate there are over 20,000 ashes on public property and up to 400,000 on private property in the Kansas City area. To help in the battle to slow the spread of EAB, most communities have stepped up public education on the insect's life history, how to properly identify adults and damage, and steps the public can take to help local government control EAB in their community.

The purpose of the workshop is to prepare Colorado communities. To quote an old cliché, it is not a matter of "if" but "when" EAB will show up in Colorado. The all-day agenda is full of expert presenters and practical information on EAB identification, control options, and community approaches to managing for EAB in a community. The deadline for early registration has passed, but registration is still open until June 6th. So there is still time to get registered for a limited number of seats.
