## BIOGRAPHIES



ANGELLA AHN enjoys her success as the violinist for the Ahn Trio. Her trio, comprised of Angella and her two twin sisters, was born while all three studied at the Juilliard School of Music, and now tours the world, playing in such venues as The Kennedy Center in D.C., New York's Lincoln Center, Vienna's Musikverein, Leipzig's Gewandhaus, Argentina's Teatro Colon, and The Beijing Concert Hall.

In 2011, President Obama invited the Ahn Trio to perform at the White House for a State Dinner honoring South Korea.

Angella and her trio have taken it as their mission to expand the piano trio repertoire, and have commissioned over 30 new works by composers including Pat Metheny and Mark O'Connor. They recently were guest performers at TED: Ideas worth spreading. The trio has six highly acclaimed recordings, one of which won Germany's highest musical honor, the Echo Award. The latest, "Lullaby for My Favorite Insomniac" made No. 8 on the Billboard Charts for 26 weeks in the Classical album category.

A Professor of Violin and Viola at Montana State University, in Bozeman, MT, Angella shares the much sought-after technique of her mentor, the late Dorothy DeLay. She plays a 2013 violin made especially for her by renowned luthier Sam Zygmuntowicz of Brooklyn, New York.

Violinist CARRIE KRAUSE's, "elegant, sparkling performance brought audience cheers," as described by the Seattle Post-Intelligencer. From Fairbanks, Alaska, Carrie Krause performs as a baroque violinist with groups across the nation and on numerous international series. She recently performed as soloist in Alice Tully Hall, Jordan, Hall, and the Thomaskirche. She served as concertmaster of New Trinity Baroque, as guest concertmaster of Pacific Baroque and the San Francisco Bach Choir, as associate concertmaster of Apollo's Fire, and with such groups as American Classical Orchestra, Concert Royale, Chatham Baroque, Portland Baroque, the Baroque Chamber Orchestra of Colorado, and Spire in Kansas City. Festival engagements include the Spoleto Festival, Belgrade Early Music Festival in Serbia, Sastamalla Gregoriana in Finland, Utrecht Early Music Festival, and the BBC Proms with Apollo's Fire. She founded the I-90 Collective, a baroque ensemble, which performs a house concert series across Montana and Baroque Music Montana, which offers a concert series and workshop with visiting teaching artists. Carrie serves as concertmaster of the Bozeman Symphony, and just completed her masters studies in The Juilliard School's Historical Performance program.

### BIOGRAPHIES (CONTINUED)



DR. JULIA CORY SLOVARP is the Assistant Teaching Professor of Cello at Montana State University. She is the principal cellist of the Intermountain Opera Company, Montana Ballet Company, and Assistant Principal of the Bozeman Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Slovarp holds degrees from Indiana University (Bachelor and Masters) and the University of Texas at Austin (Doctor of Musical Arts), and has completed Suzuki and Mark O'Conner Teacher Training. She is the Artistic Director of Noon Notes at the Library (a chamber music series under the auspices of the Montana Chamber Music Society), Director of the annual MSU Cello Festival, and Director of the MSU Mountains and Minds summer music program. She has served as faculty for the Longhorn and Red Lodge Music Camps, performed with the Columbus, Laredo, Round Rock, Temple, Terre Haute, and Waco Symphonies, and the String Orchestra of the Rockies. She is an active member of ASTA, NAFME, and the Suzuki Association, and is on the Arts Without Boundaries board of directors. Dr. Slovarp frequently performs chamber music, collaborates with dancers and painters, has worked with groups such as Cirque du Soleil and Willie Nelson, and in

2013 led the MSU Cello Ensemble on a concert tour of Spain and Morocco. Her principal teachers were Emilio Colón, Ilse-Mari Lee, Bion Tsang, and Tsuyoshi Tsutsumi.

One of JULIE GOSSWILLER's greatest passions in life is making music with other musicians and for that she is in high demand. Ms. Gosswiller has collaborated with many of her colleagues at Montana State University and with renowned musicians including Adam Barnett Hart of the Escher String Quartet, the Ahn Trio, Dallas Brass and more. In June of 2015, Ms. Gosswiller and Angella Ahn performed for and worked with students in Busan, South Korea. This year they will be featured on the 2015-16 PBS Series, 11<sup>th</sup> and Grant with Eric Funk.

For more than 16 years Ms. Gosswiller and Elizabeth Croy have performed art song throughout Montana and the United States. The two have been featured twice now on the Emmy Award Winning Series, 11<sup>th</sup> and Grant with Eric Funk. They won numerous awards in the Cybersing Competition including the Nancy Babcock award for best pianist and were one of ten teams chosen nationally to participate in the Cleveland Art song Festival. They continue to promote art song in venues around Montana. In summer of 2015 they collaborated with Montana composers and MSU faculty promoting local talent.

Ms. Gosswiller earned a masters degree in piano performance from the University of Colorado where she studied with Angela Cheng, Robert Spillman and Doris Lehnert. She paid her way through school on an accompanying assistantship and went on to be a student coach accompanist at the Aspen Music Festival. There she served as rehearsal pianist for voice faculty in addition to her work with peers. After college she served as pianist for Colorado Children's Chorale on regional tours and for sold out shows in Boetcher Concert Hall in Denver before moving to Bozeman, MT with her family where she enjoys cross-country skiing, fly fishing and backpacking the mountains of Montana with her husband, two sons and dogs.

MARGARET MILLER is Assistant Professor of Viola and Coordinator of the Graduate Quartet Program at Colorado State University. Prior to joining the faculty in 2004, Ms. Miller was violist of the Da Vinci Quartet for eighteen years. During that time the Quartet toured throughout the US and recorded three CDs for the Naxos American Classics label. Ms. Miller is also on the faculty for the LEAP Institute for the Arts at Colorado State University.

An active performer and teacher, she has given recitals and master classes at Kansas State University, the University of Iowa, the University of Nevada-Reno, and the University of Wyoming. She is active in state organizations, giving clinics at conferences for the Colorado Music Educators Association, the Colorado American String Teachers Association, and the Colorado State Music Teachers Association.

Ms. Miller has been honored for her teaching by the Colorado chapter of the American String Teachers Association and the Colorado Springs Youth Symphony Association. She plays a viola by California maker Thomas Croen.
