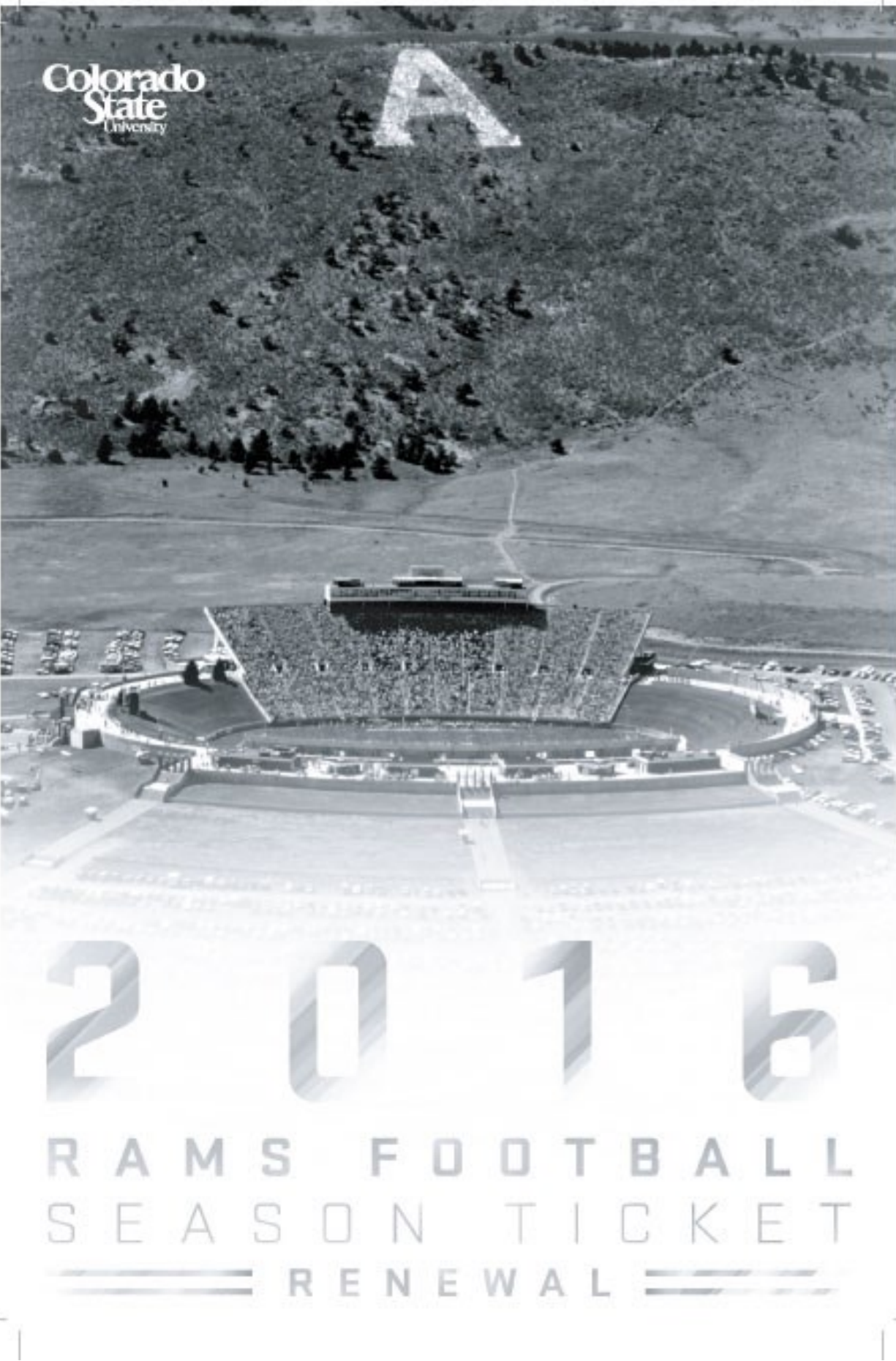


Figure 2: 2016 FB Renewal Brochure Cover.

STADIUM QUICK FACTS

- Capacity of 41,000 Rams fans, including 10,000 student seats.
- 78,000 square feet of covered concourse, an increase of 53,300 square feet of space.
- 208 men's toilets, an increase of 97 toilets over Hughes Stadium.
- 314 women's toilets, an increase of 186 toilets over Hughes Stadium.
- Colorado sandstone, metal panel and glass make up the primary material palette, the majority of materials coming from locations within 500 miles of the stadium site.
- LEED Certified
- Project is financed by donors and investors and does not rely on any funding from tuition. Bond payments will be made from stadium revenues and private donations.

40+ Loge Boxes with 4-6 seats with access to the stadium club.

Over 800 club seats supported by 11,600 square foot Stadium Club.

140 indoor club seats.

22 luxury suites with 16 seats in each.

An increase of 70 concession points of sale.

Sideline field club which opens up to the field where fans can view the action from the sideline. This is a completely unique space, unlike anything in collegiate athletics.

5,800 square foot Hall of Champions with views into the sideline field club. Custom branding to depict CSU's history and accomplishments.

112 concession points of sale, an increase of 70 over Hughes Stadium.

78,000 square feet of covered concourse space, an increase of 53,300 ft. over Hughes Stadium.

A new plaza on the north side of the building will welcome fans to the site and provide landscaped space for the community to gather year-round.

CSU earned national recognition in December 2014 from the NCAA and Minority Opportunities Athletic Association's Award for Diversity and Inclusion for its efforts to promote diversity and foster a culture and environment of inclusion on campus.

In 2013, Colorado State became the first athletics program in the state of Colorado to win a men's basketball NCAA tournament game and a bowl game in the same calendar year. Men's basketball defeated Missouri in the opening round in Lexington in March 2013 and the football team defeated Washington State in the New Mexico Bowl on Dec. 21, 2013.

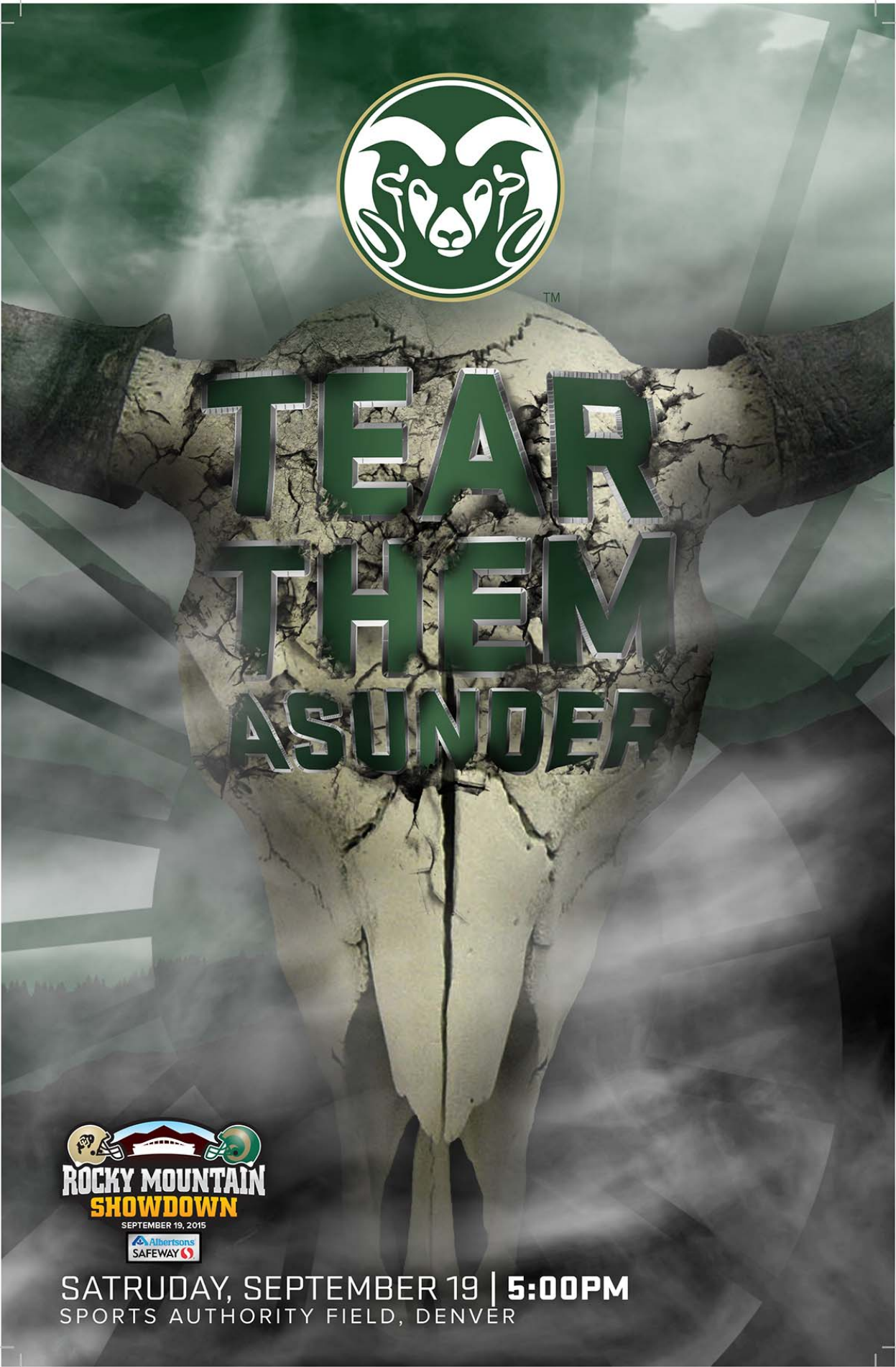


Figure 6: Rocky Mountain Showdown Poster.

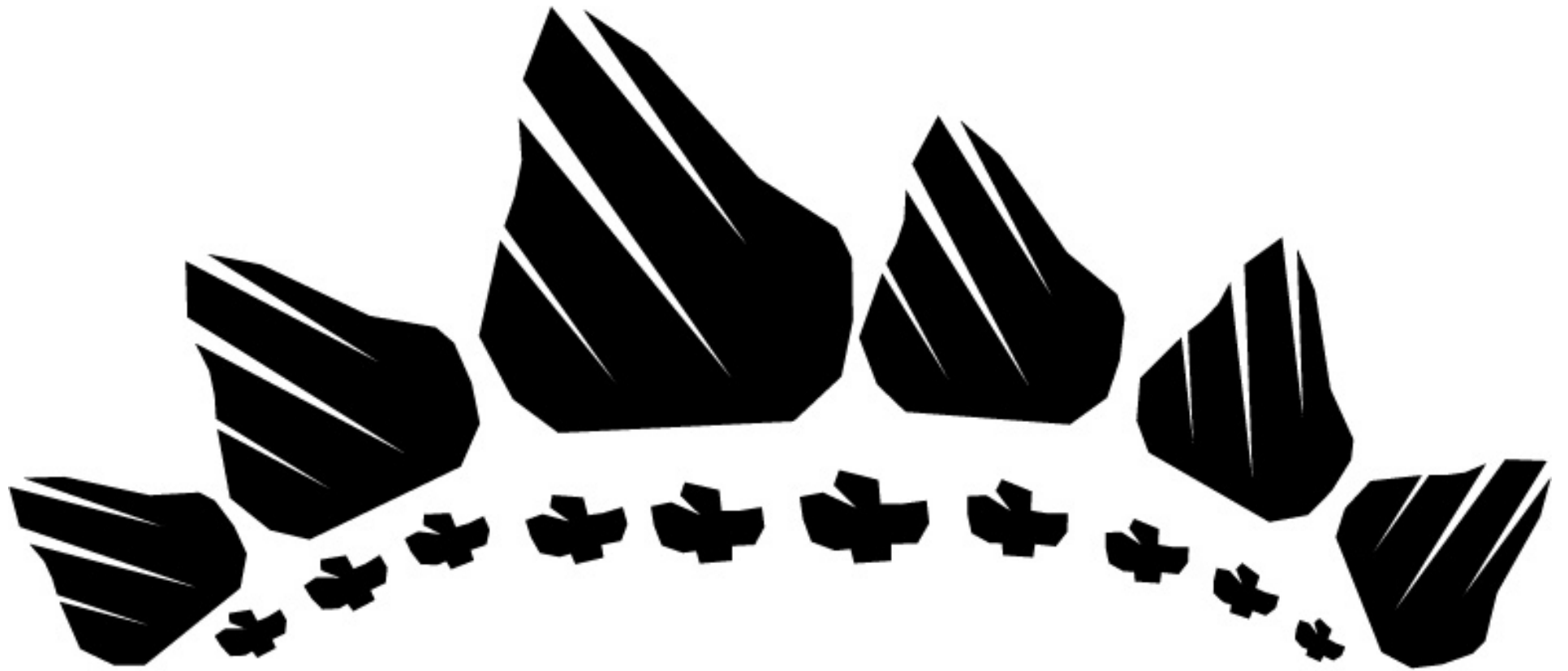

Played in 10 games on a veteran-laden Northland Lulea squad... Team advanced to the Damligan final, upsetting the regular-season champion, Umea, in a best-of-five championship series... Played for the U19 BG Lulea team, in 10 games, she posted 14.0 points and 8.6 rebounds per matchup, while shooting 83.9 percent from the line and over 40 percent from the field... Also played six games with BG Lulea BK, averaging 17.5 points per matchup... During the 2013-14 regular season, she played in nine games, averaging 14.6 points...
