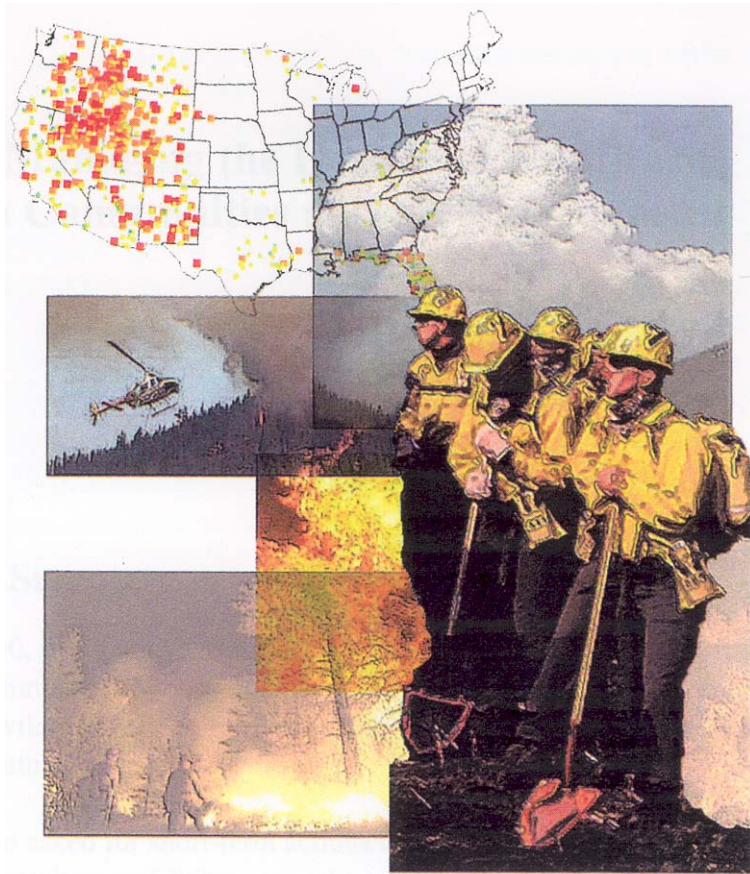

Forest Fire Factors

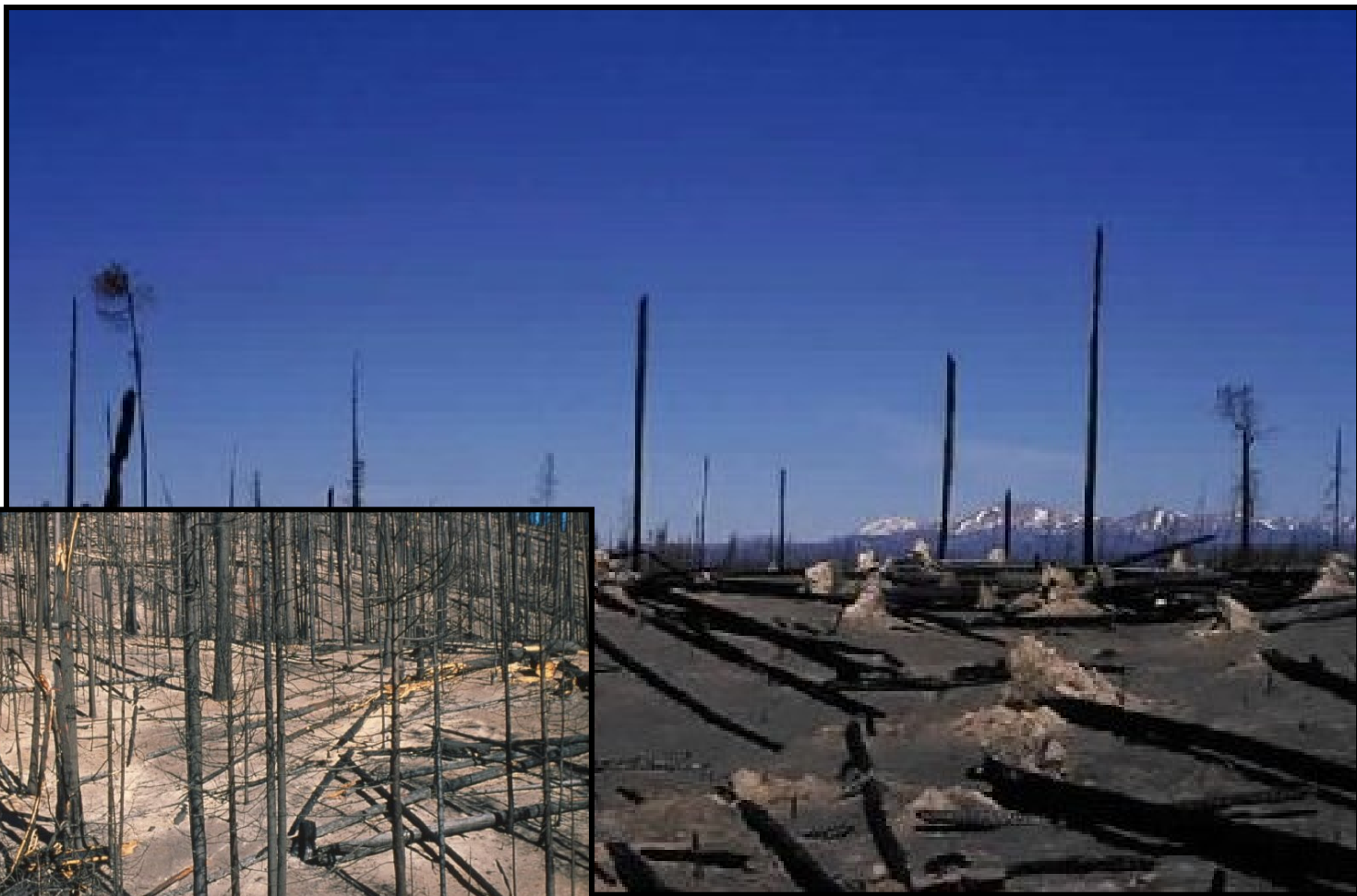


Fire Behavior in a Dense Forest

- Fire burns up into the tree crowns and spreads rapidly. Even centuries-old forest giants are destroyed.







Fire Behavior in a Healthy Forest

- Fire stays close to the ground, doesn't move up trees and through the canopy. It takes out the brush and smaller trees, but leaves the large fire-resistant trees intact.
