**The RFP will open to applications on June 30, and proposals are due by August 5, 2022. The program will make up to \$150,000 available and award one to two research teams.**

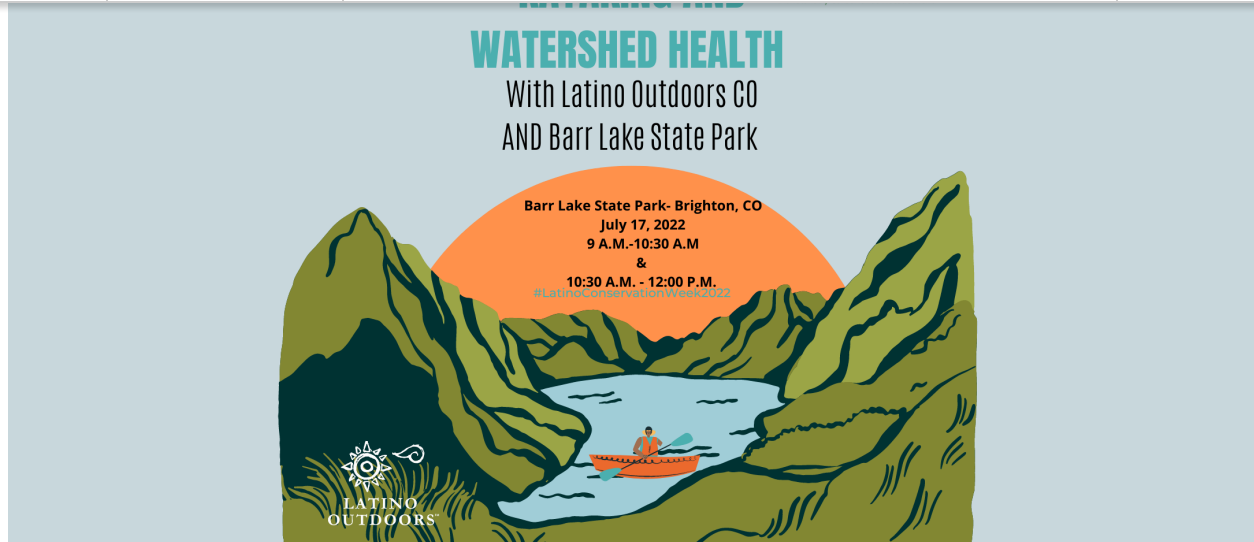
