The Mendelssohn Trio was formed in 1988 and is named for Thiem's great grandfather, Franz von Mendelssohn, a nephew of Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy and an important supporter of artists and musicians in the Berlin of the early 20th century. The trio is in residence at Colorado State University in Fort Collins, Colorado. The trio members give frequent concerts and work closely with the students on chamber music projects.

In addition to concerts in the US the trio has performed on three tours to several European countries including Germany, Austria and Switzerland. The last in 2012 included an appearance at the International Mendelssohn Festival in Berlin.

While performing the standard repertoire of the 18th and 19th centuries the trio has also made an effort to introduce its audiences to works by 20th century composers such as the Americans Muczynski, Copland and the young Suzanne Sorkin, as well as the Europeans Martinu, Bridge, Martin and Bloch. In one of the latest program they premiered a trio by the little known French composer Theodore Gouvy (1819-1898) together with the well known one by Maurice Ravel.

PROGRAM NOTES:

Johann Nepomuk Hummel (1778-1837) was born in Bohemia, but soon moved to Vienna, where he became one of Mozart's best students. He subsequently studied with Albrechtsberger and Salieri. He became the most celebrated piano virtuoso and composer of his day both in Vienna and internationally. He eclipsed the fame of Beethoven, with whom he was on friendly terms. He really didn't appreciate Beethoven's storminess but instead saw himself as the link to the classically restrained style of his mentor Mozart.

He wrote prolifically for all musical media (sacred instrumental and vocal music, secular works, chamber music, operas.) The only form he did not attempt was the symphony (maybe because of the huge shadow that Beethoven cast). He produced a huge number of piano works, including 7 concerti, most of which are today ignored, except for some facile pleasantries (e.g. the "Septette Militaire"). We hope that we can bring some appreciation to this elegant composer with today's performance of this lovely piano trio.

Martinu composed his duo for violin and cello shortly before his death. The prolific composer changed his style several times. Towards the end he favored inserting folkstyle elements from his native Czechoslovakia. His music always includes lively rhythms. This piece shows rather virtuoso writing for both instruments in cadenzas for each.
