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The project will take place within the Pinewood Fire Protection community WUI zone in Larimer County west of Loveland, CO. Work will take place specifically at Green Mountain Drive and James Park Trail where 10 acres of fuel treatment will be implemented to protect the community from a wildfire. This area planned for treatment has been identified within the community CWPP as a high priority for mitigation. The treatment is located in an area of very high fire hazard and will be visible to residents within the community. Additionally, hazardous trees will be removed along the road system that will provide increased ingress and egress throughout the subdivision. Dominant vegetation is ponderosa pine with some Douglas-fir and occasional Rocky Mt. juniper. Some ponderosa pine is infested with dwarf mistletoe. New mountain pine beetle infestations have also been found in 2008 and 2009. Understory shrubs are primarily mountain mahogany, alpine currant, chokecherry and other berry bushes. Stands are multi-storied with mostly closed canopies and occasional opening. Basal area is approximately 100 sqft/acre. Slopes are greater than 30%. Elevation is 5,000-6,000 feet.

regarding budget details in this section.) The prescription for this initial project will be to create a 10 acre fuel break to CSFS standards along a portion of Green Mtn. Drive and James Park Trail. Basal area will be reduced to a maximum of 60 sqft/acre. Canopy will be opened to create an average of 10-15 feet of space between tree crowns and ladder fuels will be removed. A fire break recommended by Loveland Rural, will be created along James Park Trail. Rocky mountain juniper, Douglas-fir serving as ladder fuel, and dead, dying or bark beetle and/or dwarf mistletoe infested ponderosa pine trees will be targeted for removal. Remaining stand should be of mixed species and age classes with large openings and no ladder fuels.

Work will take place on private properties and will mitigate fire risk on those properties and serve as an example and teaching tool to other residents. Grant funds will be utilized to hire a contractor to cut and chip or remove materials created by project activities. Property owners and residents will volunteer to do some of the work themselves.

Pine beetle infestations will be treated and removed annually when found, as was done in 2009 by Summit Forestry.
