Landowner Assistance Program

LOA-9 Fire and Catastrophic Risk Reduction

Purpose

Establishment of practices primarily to reduce the risk from wildfire and other catastrophic natural events. Practices should reduce the intensity of wildfire should it occur. Practices can increase the potential for defensibility of structures in the event of wildfire.

Eligible Components

The list below contains each component and its respective cost-share amount. These amounts are not to exceed 50% of actual cost, with total cost-share not to exceed \$1,000 per acre. This does not apply to the implementation of a defensible space.

314 -1	Brush Management (chemical)	\$ 100.00 per acre
- 314-2	Brush Management (mechanical)	\$ 200.00 per acre
338-2	Prescribed Burning (interface broadcast burn)	\$ 200.00 per acre
338-3	Slash Treatment (pile burning)	\$ 100.00 per acre
394-1	Firebreak	\$.10 per linear ft.
- 394-2	Fuelbreak	\$1,000.00 per acre
595-1	Pest Management (herbaceous)	\$ 20.00 per acre
660	Tree/Shrub Pruning	\$ 75.00 per acre
- 666-1	Forest Stand Improvement (thinning)	\$ 500.00 per acre
666-2	Slash Treatment (chipping)	\$ 300.00 per acre
- 666-3	Slash Treatment (hauling)	\$ 300.00 per acre
666-6.3	302 Defensible Space ¹	\$1,200.00 per defensible space

¹ Removal of both horizontal and vertical fuels around a home to reduce fire hazard. CSFS standards will be used and completed projects approved by CSFS. Cost-share includes tree cutting, pruning and slash treatment.

Cost-share Requirements

- Landowner acreage and eligibility requirements are met.
- A management plan is required to be eligible for cost-share.
- Practice must be maintained for a minimum of 10 years.
- Chemicals used must be Federally, State and locally registered, and be applied according to registered uses, label directions and other federal or State policies and requirements.
- Prescribed burning will be performed in accordance with State and local laws and regulations.
- The value of wood products generated from forest improvement activities and sold by the landowner must be deducted from total project cost to determine actual landowner cost. Cost-share payments are based on 50% of actual cost.

Landowners should contact a Colorado State Forest Service (CSFS) representative prior to applying for LOA cost-share. CSFS can provide information about LOA practices, status of available cost-share funds and application procedures. CSFS will approve practices and certify that they have been completed

Program Policy
