Provide a brief overview of the project and the project area. (If applying for a fuels reduction project, identify vegetation types)

Girl Scouts of Colorado has developed a year round camp facility at Magic Sky Ranch. The camp serves as a summer resident camp for 200 campers and staff and as a year round facility for girl scout troops, leaders and families. The project includes a total infrastructure build out with water treatment, waste water treatment, telephone, data etc. Primary buildings include the dining hall/ office building, an activity center, equestrian center, year round cabins and both seasonal and year-round housing facilities. Girl Scouts of Colorado has developed and implemented a Fuels Reduction Program and a long-term Forest Stewardship Plan. We currently are in the third year of contracting with the Wildfire Safety section of the Larimer County Sheriff's office to implement the Fuels Reduction program. We have focused on removing dwarf mistletoe-infected trees and fuel reduction thinning around the building sites and also in forest stands. This project, if funded, would allow us to complete the project by thinning trees in the remaining diseased area on the northern portion of the property that will be used to promote outdoor activities and education for the girls and their leaders. Continuing to treat these areas will reduce wildfire hazard and improve forest health as well as provide for educational and/recreational opportunities for Girl Scouts while maintaining and improving wildlife habitat. Vegetation Type

The primary vegetation type in this project area is ponderosa pine that is lightly to heavily infected with dwarf mistletoe along with some Douglas-fir and Rocky Mountain juniper. This unit is rated as very high fire hazard by the USFS.

4	Grant funds will be used to pay for half the actual cost of tree cutting and pile burning. The Girl Scouts of Colorado will contract with the Larimer County Sheriff's office for their fuel mitigation crew to thin approximately 12 acres between September 1 st 2008 and May 1 st 2009 and burn the resulting slash piles the winter of 2009. The Larimer County fuel mitigation crew charges for labor and materials plus a fuel cost per work day.
	Thinning will include the removal of dwarf mistletoe-infected trees and Douglas-fir ladder fuels, and breaking up the tree canopy. The residual basal area will be an average of 60 square feet per acre or lower. Logs will be bucked into firewood lengths and stacked, slash will be piled, and piles will be burned. The firewood will be collected by community volunteers and given away to local residents in need of wood for heat.

The camp serves as a summer resident camp for 200 campers and staff and as a year round facility for girl scout troops, leaders and families. The project includes a total infrastructure build out with water treatment, waste water treatment, telephone, data etc. Primary buildings include the dining hall office building, an activity center, equestrian center, year round cabins and both seasonal and year-round housing facilities. Girl Scouts of Colorado has developed and implemented a Fuels Reduction Program and a long-term Forest Stewardship Plan. We currently are in the third year of contracting with the Wildfire Safety section of the Larimer County Sheriff's office to implement the Fuels Reduction program. We have focused on removing dwarf mistletoe-infected trees and fuel reduction thinning around the building sites and also in forest stands. This project, if funded, would allow us to complete the project by thinning trees in the remaining diseased area on the northern portion of the property that will be used to promote outdoor activities and education for the girls and their leaders. Continuing to treat these areas will reduce wildfire hazard and improve forest health as well as provide for educational and/recreational opportunities for Girl Scouts while maintaining and improving wildlife habitat. Vegetation Type The primary vegetation type in this project area is ponderosa pine that is lightly to heavily infected with dwarf mistletoe

along with some Douglas-fir and Rocky Mountain juniper. This unit is rated as very high fire hazard by the USFS.

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
