The first year spawned interest with a number of landowners in the community and resulted in some rezoning and the addition of several landowners to the Fire District. This 4th year (2009) should result in the completion of Phase II of the original plan on file with www.larimer.org/wildfire. This year's project will cover acreage running along Larimer County Rd 18 E in a north/south access to the top of the hill opposite Pinewood Reservoir Campground. The details of this last phase are documented in the Plan established with Wendy McCarthy of the CSF in 2005. A copy of this plan was never provided to the Pinewood Reservoir Fire District Board.</p>

(If applying for a fuels reduction project, identify vegetation types)</p> <p>The project will take place within the Pinewood Fire Protection community WUI zone in Larimer County west of Loveland, Colorado. Work will be located on several private properties on Green Mountain Drive for a total of 11 acres of fuels treatment which will help protect the community in the event of a wildfire. This area planned for treatment has been identified as high priority for mitigation in the CWPP. The treatment is located in an area of very high fire hazard.</p> <p>Dominant vegetation is ponderosa pine with some Douglas-fir and occasional Rocky Mountain juniper. In many locations ponderosa pine have current infestations of dwarf mistletoe and/or mountain pine beetle. Understory shrubs are primarily mountain mahogany and alpine currant. Stands are multistoried with mostly closed canopies and occasional openings. Basal area ranges from 80-120 sqft/acre. The pinewood reservoir community is located on a hillside above the main road and most properties have slopes greater than 30%. Elevation ranges from 5,000 to 6,000 feet.</p>

The prescription for this project will be to create an 11 acre fuelbreak to CSFS standards on several private properties located along Green Mountain Drive. Basal area will be reduced to a maximum of 60 sqft/acre. Canopy will be opened to create an average of 10 to 15 feet of space between tree crowns and ladder fuels will be removed. This work will expand on previous work completed during the CWPP development. Work will take place on private properties and will mitigate fire risk on those properties as well as serve as an ingress/egress fuel break that protects the homeowners living on Green Mountain Drive. Grant funds will be utilized to hire a contractor to cut and/or chip materials created by project activities. Property owners and residents will volunteer to do some of the work themselves, including stacking and collecting firewood for residents to use.

Describe all planned long-term maintenance (grant funded or other).

Treatments will be inspected and maintained yearly by residents with oversight from the Pinewood Reservoir Fire District. Long range plans to reduce wildfire risk are included in the CWPP and future efforts will include assisting with the creation and maintenance of defensible space on individual properties and maintenance of this and previous fuel treatments.

Pinewood Reservoir Phase 3 Fuel Mitigation- 11 acres

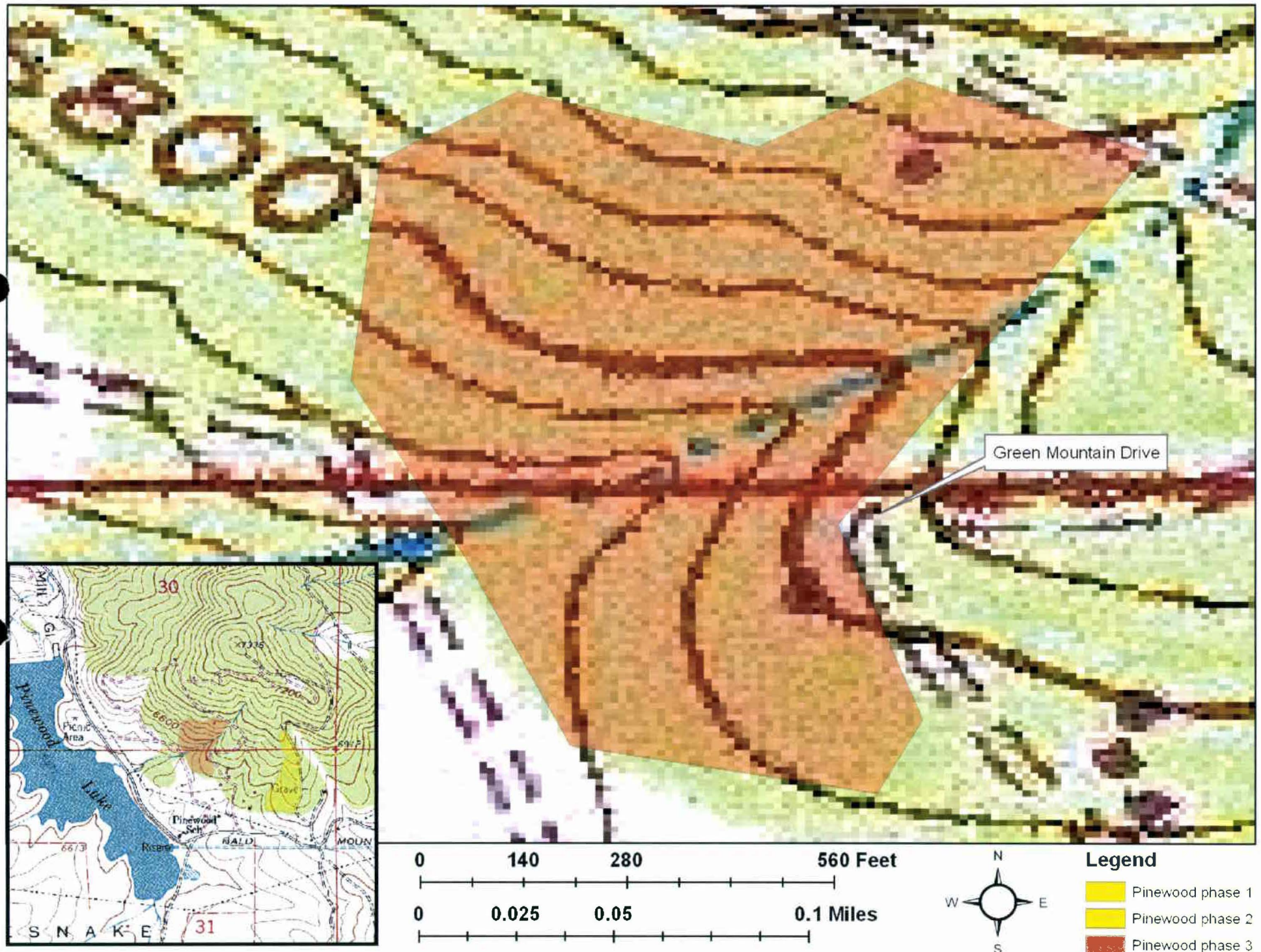

The results spurred the interest of other landowners in the community. Due to rezoning, the community also expanded its property to include several interested landowners with significant acreage. This phase II project will reduce stand density from approximately 100 basal area to approximately 70 basal area over 30 acres, as well as remove trees currently infested with Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and a majority of those infested with dwarf mistletoe. The stand is dominated by ponderosa pine, with some Rocky Mountain juniper, Douglas-fir, and lodgepole pine in the understory. The aspect of the proposed treatment area is SW-facing, and is primarily Fuel Model 9.</p>
