

Your Wildland Urban Interface Incentives D-Space Program (WUI) grant application has been reviewed and funding approved as shown on the attached copy of your application. Our office received over \$67,000 in grant requests. Needless to say we were not able to fund all projects. In most cases, we were able to partially fund a project.

OBJECTIVES: What do you want to achieve by this practice? (If more than one objective, list in order of priority).

Example: To reduce the risk of mountain pine beetle, and with the proper slash disposal, improve forest health.

The two main objectives are to:

- 1) Reduce the spread of IPS beetles in lodge pole pine.
- 2) Reduce the possible spread of fire along County Road 162 on private property

CURRENT NATURAL RESOURCE CONDITIONS:

Vegetative cover (trees, shrubs, grasses) on the property:

The requested thinning on property contains primarily lodge pole pine interspersed with several stands of aspen on the N.W. Minimal ponderosa pine is found on subject property.

Fire hazard rating and risk factors of the area:

The fire hazard rating is serious. The last fire to come through the area was in the 1780's. No thinning has occurred on the 40 acres

Summary of insect and disease presence, damage, or risk, including information on significant incidents, historical and current:

The land owner has for the past six years pursued a vigorous policy of cutting diseased Ponderosa and lodge pole on the 173 acre parcels. Significant slash burning occurs each year during the winter.

Soil Type(s) and limitations:

The soil is highly acid because of the buildup of nearly a century of needles.

Wetlands present:

Wetlands border the north side and eastern boundaries of the 40 acre parcel

Wildlife (or sign) present:

At any time deer, elk, moose, ~~and~~ bear and beaver can be observed along the Elkhorn Creek watershed.

Threatened or Endangered plants or animals that may inhabit the property:

Because the owner has a conservation easement with the Legacy Land Trust, one species of rare willow has been documented.

Noxious weeds present:

The land owner maintains active weed spraying along County Road 162 and subject property for Canadian, star and musk thistles

Cultural or historic resources on the property:

The property was homesteaded by Frank and Mary Ayers. The patent was issued to Mary Ayers in 1913. The remnants to the homestead house are on the 173 acre parcel.

Recreational use on the property:

Hiking and fishing.

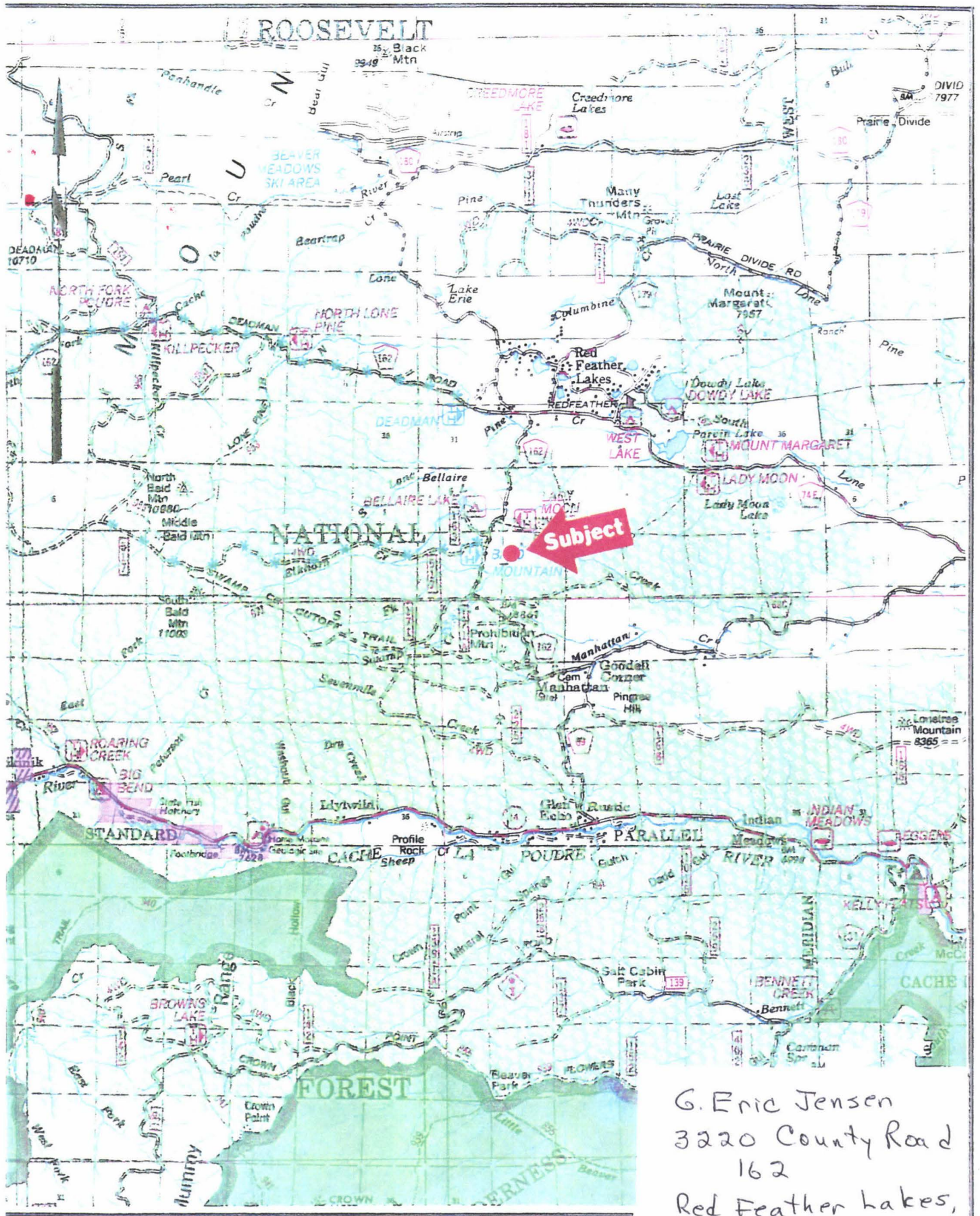

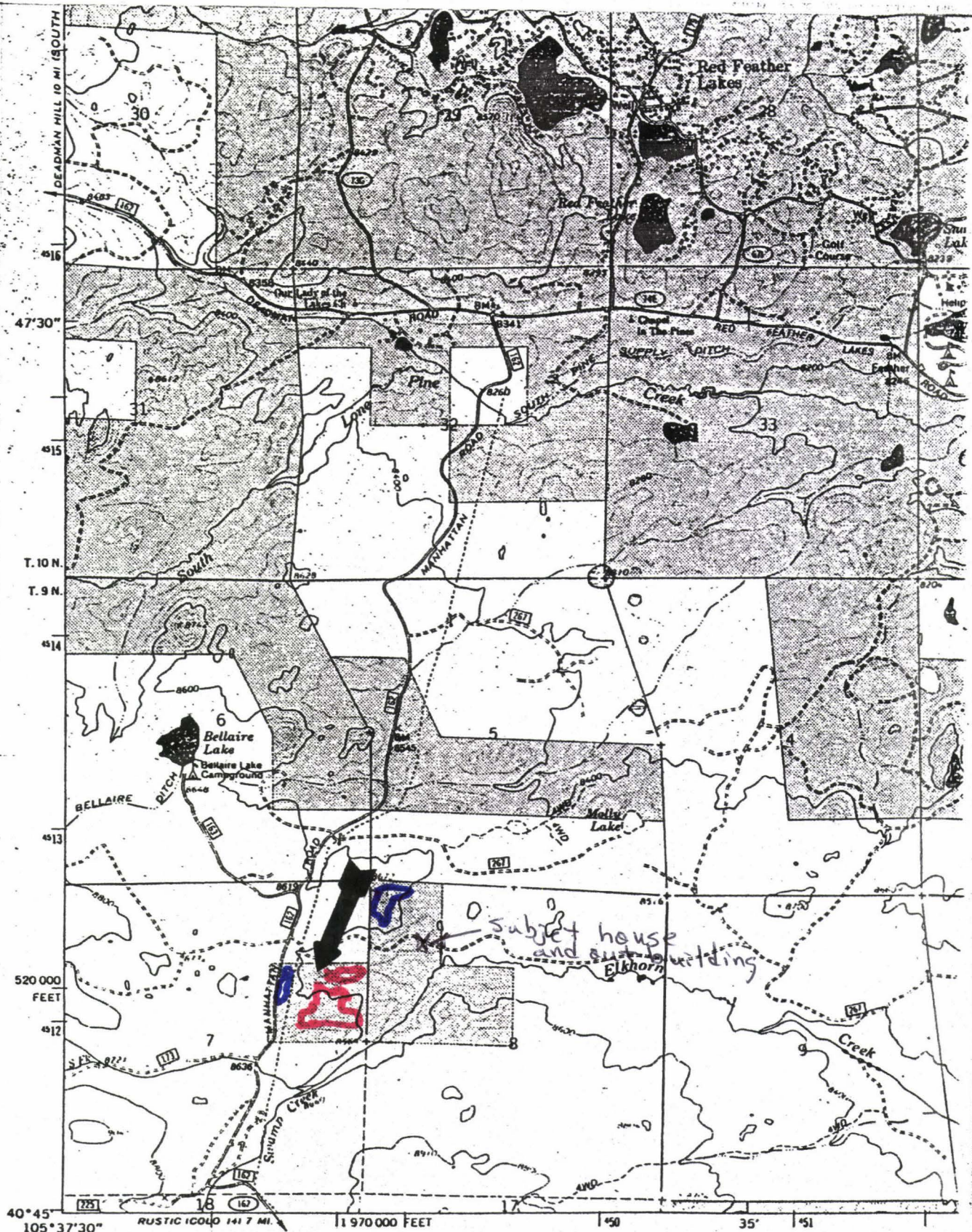

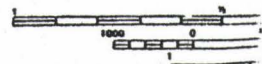

National Forest Map



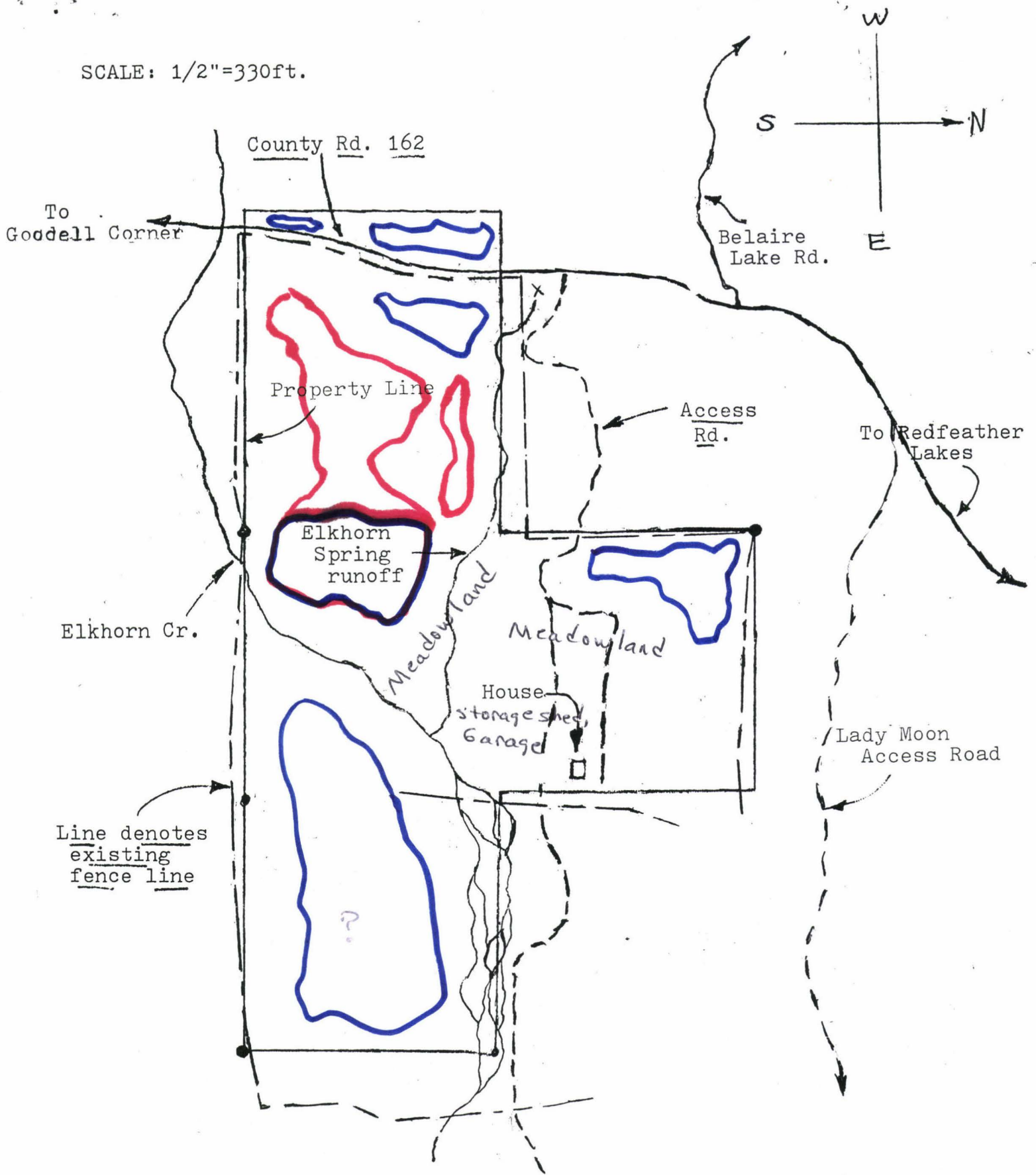
