

AVERY JONES started dance lessons at Danza Dance Academy in Castle Rock Colorado around the age of five. At age ten, she began competitive dance and trained extensively in ballet, jazz, lyrical, and contemporary. Under the tutelage of Denise Danzo, creative director, as well as instructors Laura Hinton, Laura Brown, and Amber Shipps, she continued through middle school. At 15, Avery moved to a studio owned by her former instructor, Laura Hinton, where she continued her training until graduating high school. She performed as both a soloist and a member of an ensemble in monthly regional competitions, as well as in her studio's annual recital and ballet productions.

Avery's university training began at Colorado State University in Fort Collins, Colorado in 2015. As a dance major Avery trained with faculty Judy Bejarano, Chung-Fu Chang, Melissa Corr, Madeline, and Mathew Harvey, Amber Mazurana, Lisa Morgan, Lindsay Pierce, Carol Roderick, Jane Slusarski-Harris, and James Wallace. She completed a number of courses in ballet and modern technique, pedagogy, teaching creative movement, dance history, choreography. Apart from her involvement in coursework, she also took advantage of almost all performance opportunities that were presented to her during her time at school, performing in the Fall, Spring, and Capstone Dance Concerts throughout her time at CSU. Additionally, she performed in CSU Dance's Spring Dance Tea in 2016 and the Chinese Spring Festival Gala with Southwest University of China in 2017. She also attended several master classes throughout her university experience, including one taught by Artistic Director of BODYTRAFFIC Lillian Rose Barbeito, former principal dancer of Martha Graham Dance Company Jennifer Depalo Petersen, and Artistic Director of Ormao Dance Company Jan Johnson.

Avery was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to attend the American College Dance Association conference during her Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior year where she performed in the adjudication concert, the informal concert, and the closing Gala. In addition to performing, she was presented with a number of choreography opportunities by the faculty at CSU, one of which was a solo titled Chapter II, selected for performance in the Spring Dance Concert at CSU. She is currently working on choreography for a group piece and a solo in the Spring 2019 Capstone Concert. All of this was made possible by the Creative and Performing Art Dance Scholarship that she was awarded during the Fall Semester of her senior year as well as being selected for the College of Liberal Arts Dean's List.

Avery would like to thank her friends and family, as well as her dance professors and instructors, for helping her to grow as a dancer and a person. They have provided her with a tremendous amount of support which fostered her love and passion for dance while instilling hope and optimism for her future. None of her accomplishments would be possible without the efforts of these incredible individuals.



MARY RODGERS (BOGUS) was born and raised in Fort Collins, Colorado. She began her early training at Westin Arts Academy and Mary Constantine Nelson Dance Studio, which later became The Studio Co. Transitioning to Canyon Concert Ballet in 2010, she became serious about her craft and took extensive technique classes, also performing in *The Nutcracker, Cinderella*, and *Snow White*. She was privileged to learn from Kitty Bloch, Laurel Brubacher, Richard d'Alton, Erica Mugoye, Daniel Simmons, and Margaret Willingham.

Since attending Colorado State University to study dance, Mary has received quality instruction in ballet and modern technique,

pedagogy, improvisation, repertory, choreography, and dance history. She has received instruction from Judy Bejarano, Chung-Fu Chang, Melissa Corr, Madeline Harvey, Matthew Harvey, Amber Mazurana, Carol Roderick, Jane Slusarski-Harris, and James Wallace. Mary has taken masterclasses from Aspen Santa Fe Ballet, Baker & Tarpaga Dance Project's co-founder Esther Baker-Tarpaga, BodyTraffic, Complexions Contemporary Ballet, Martha Graham Dance Company, MOMIX, Northwest Dance Project, Ormao Dance Company's founder Janet Johnson, PUSH Physical Theater, and Verb Ballets. She has performed in multiple faculty works including *American Lullaby* by Judy Bejarano, *Cloudless* and *Silver Coin Moon* by Chung-Fu Chang, and *Excerpts from Le Corsaire* by Madeline Harvey. She appeared as a featured dancer in *Silver Coin Moon* and as an odalisque soloist in *Excerpts from Le Corsaire*. She diligently understudied and assisted rehearsal for the pieces *Last Night I Dreamt I was the Moon* by Lindsay Pierce and *Ubuntu* by Madeline Harvey. She was selected to perform a trio choreographed by Madeline Harvey and collaborate with live musicians in the production, *Color of Change*.

Mary attended the 2018 American College Dance Association conference at the University of Colorado in Boulder and appreciated the many classes that helped improve her skill. She was inspired by the performances from other universities. One of Mary's professors recommended her to cast and choreograph for dancers in CSU's opera, *Orfeo ed Euridice (The Myth of Orpheus)* directed by Dr. Tiffany Blake. This was an incredibly collaborative experience that furthered her artistic, creative, and directorial expertise. She served as Vice President and President of the CSU Dance Majors' Dance Student Advisory Committee, facilitating meetings, organizing fundraisers and events, and communicating with outside businesses. Currently, she teaches 1 to 5-year-olds and high-school-aged to adult dancers at Lighthouse Dance.

After graduation, Mary and her husband, Daniel, plan to teach English in Tunisia, Africa for two years. Following this, she would love to perform, teach, choreograph, and work with outreach programs bringing dance to the public. Several people have played a considerable role in helping her get to where she is today. She would first like to thank her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, for having a perfect plan for her life and providing her with the ability to dance. She wants to continue to use her talents for Him! Mary would like to thank her parents who have supported and loved her every step of the way, being her cheerleaders by attending every performance and making everything possible. TAYLOR WOOLUMS grew up in Lakewood, Colorado where she started her dance training at Little Theatre Cultural Center and later studied at RISE Dance Company. At the age of three, she studied ballet and tap. She later received extensive training in ballet, tap, jazz, contemporary, pointe, modern, lyrical, and hip hop. She was under the direction of Karen Cassel, Roberta Thornsberry, and Debbie Vecchiarelli. Her other instructors included Sarah Beacham, Allison Bray, Andrew Cassel, Caitlin Cassel, and Julia Musser. She was selected to compete at regional and national dance competitions with roles as a soloist in various works including jazz, contemporary, and a ballet. In 2015, she joined The Dream Project Dance company as a

principal company member while teaching dance.

During her two collegiate years at Colorado State University, she was trained by Judy Bejarano, Chung-Fu Chang, Madeline Harvey, Matthew Harvey, Amber Mazurana, Emily Morgan, Lisa Morgan, and Jane Harris-Slusarksi. These instructors taught her ballet technique, modern technique, contemporary ballet, pedagogy, dance outreach, choreography, and improvisation. She was selected and performed in six different faculty pieces choreographed by Judy Bejarano, Amber Mazurana, Madeline Harvey, Matthew Harvey, and Emily Morgan. She had a feature role in many works created by her professors, including solos. She performed in over 20 faculty, guest artist, and student pieces. She was one of three dancers who performed in Salvador Allielo's work *The Waiting Room* curated by Jerri Kumery. Additionally, she performed in a show demonstrating collaboration between musicians and dancers called *Color of Change*, performed in *Presenting Denver Wine* and *Works in Progress* and created a work with four other dancers to spoken poetry presented at *Crossing*, a multimedia poetry reading.

Taylor has taken master classes with the Martha Graham Dance Company, Parsons Dance Company, Aspen Santa Fe Ballet Dance company, PUSH Physical Dance Theater, Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo, Keigwen + Company, and Limon technique. She has also trained with LeeWei Chao, Dominic Walsh, and Morgan Sicklick. She received additional training from Christy O'Connell-Black, Monte Black, Jerri Kumery, Raffaele Morra, Jean-Philippe Malaty, and Denise Vale, along with notable others.

Taylor's choreography, which she was also selected to perform, was presented as a duet in a dance concert and at the American Collegiate Dance Association (ACDA) in 2019. She attended ACDA at University of Boulder in Colorado in 2018, and performed in two others works by Madeline Harvey, and Emily Morgan, at the University of Utah, in Salt Lake City in 2019. She attended the National Dance Education Organization (NDEO) in San Diego, California in 2019. Additionally, she was a part of the dance repertory outreach program in which she traveled around Colorado performing for elementary to high school students offering interactive workshops and lecture demonstrations in 2019. At CSU, she was a recipient of the Grace and Dwight Harris Endowed Dance Scholarship, and the Creative and Performing Arts Award between 2017-2019. Her future career goals include performing for a contemporary ballet or modern dance company and acting as an active outreach company member. During her time as a professional dancer, she wants to continue to teach dance. Post her performance career as a principal dance company member she wants to complete a Master of Fine Arts in order to teach in higher education, and then become a director of a collegiate dance program
