Additionally, sound recommendations and solutions will provide the stakeholder group with a multi-year plan for wildfire mitigation. These tools will support the BFPD with ongoing efforts in:

The result of the completed BFP CWPP and the initiation of the mitigation recommendations will be to facilitate this much larger, multi-jurisdictional, planning area and the ability to synergistically approach fire prevention, hazardous fuel reduction and community assistance for wildland fire protection.
