

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. BIDDER'S QUALIFICATIONS: Before a bid is considered for award, the bidder may be required to submit a statement regarding the Bidder's previous experience in performing comparable work, business affiliates and technical organizations, financial resources, intended product processing facilities and its timber exporting history.

....

- 2. PREPARATION OF SEALED BIDS: Bids shall be manually signed, bid prices entered in the "Bid" column (Box 14f) for all material subject to bidding and all fill-in blanks completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialled by the person signing the bid.
- 3. SUBMISSION OF SEALED BIDS: Sealed bids, with the accompanying bid guarantee, must be submitted to the Forest Officer, designated by the advertisement as the receiving officer, at or prior to the time established by the advertisement. Such bids must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the designated receiving officer. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and the date and time of opening bids as shown by the advertisement. Bids received after the time specified in the sale advertisement are late bids, Forest Service Handbook 2409.18, Chapter 60 will govern acceptance of such bids.
- 4. PUBLIC OPENING OF SEALED BIDS: Sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set for opening in the advertisement.
- 5. ORAL AUCTION BIDDING: If the advertisement provides for Sealed and Oral bids, each bidder to participate in the oral auction must submit a sealed bid in accordance with these instructions. All parties who submit a satisfactory sealed bid will be permitted to continue bidding orally following opening and posting of the sealed bids. The Apparent High Bidder must confirm it's oral bid in writing immediately upon being declared the Apparent High Bidder.
- 6. BID GUARANTEE: A bid guarantee in the form of a bid bond on form FS-6500-13 (4/82 or later version), certification of annual bid bond allocation on form FS-6500-13a (4/82 or later version), an irrevocable letter of credit, the format of which has been pre-approved by the Forest Service Regional Forester, a certified check, bank draft, cashier's check, bank money order payable to the Forest Service, USDA, or cash, in an amount no less than that specified in item 15(a), must accompany each sealed bid. Failure to submit an acceptable bid guarantee with the sealed bid will require rejection of the bid as non-responsive unless there is no other acceptable bid, or unless the Forest Service, in its sole discretion, decides to briefly delay a sale advertised for sealed bids followed by oral bids in order to allow any bidder to cure any deficiency in its bid guarantee prior to oral bidding. Bid bonds must be accompanied by a power of attorney indicating that the person signing the bond for the surety has the power to do so. Bidder agrees that bid guarantee shall be retained by the Forest Service to satisfy any damages that may be assessed if the bid is accepted and bidder subsequently fails to furnish a cash downpayment when required or return the executed contract and performance bond as required (See Instruction 10). Otherwise, the bid guarantee shall be returned to each bidder whose bid is not accepted.
- 7. SET-ASIDE SALES: If the advertisement or prospectus states that Small Business concerns will receive preferential consideration in award of this sale, bidders must qualify for preferential consideration by completing and signing the attachment to this bid form "Certificate of Small Business Status." Small Businesses which have been determined by SBA to be ineligible for preferential award of set-aside sales cannot so qualify. - 8. AWARD OF CONTRACT: (a) Award of contract will be made to that responsible bidder whose bid, conforming to the invitation for bids, is most advantageous to the United States on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. (b) The Government may, when in its interest, reject any or all bids or waive any informality in bids received. (c) A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party. (d) If timber is advertised as set-aside for competitive bidding by Small Businesses, award will be made to the highest bidder qualified as a Small Business and who has not been determined by the SBA to be ineligible for preferential award of set-aside sales. If there are no qualified Small Business bidders, award may be made to highest bidder not qualifying for preferential award.

- 9. DOWN PAYMENT: The bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment at the time the bidder signs the contract and returns the contract to the Forest Service. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in Item 20 of this bid for advertised timber. Only cash or effective purchaser credit may be used to meet this requirement. Cash deposited must be in the form of bank draft, certified or cashier's check, bank or postal money order, or company check. After receipt of down payment and executed contract with required performance bond, the bid guarantee will be returned to the successful bidder.
- 10. DAMAGES: Bidder/purchaser agrees that its failure to execute a timber sale contract, furnish a Downpayment, or furnish a satisfactory performance bond within 30 days of receipt of the award letter, shall result in termination of this contract for breach pursuant to paragraph 19 of this bid form and the terms of the sample contract. Purchaser agrees that it shall not be entitled to cure this breach and that it will pay damages pursuant to the terms of the sample contract. The primary component of these damages shall be the difference between purchaser's bid value and the resale bid value. If, in its sole discretion, the Forest Service decides not to reoffer the sale, purchaser agrees that damages shall still be assessed by appraisal as provided in the sample contract.
- 11. PRIVACY ACT: All personal information is requested on a voluntary basis; however, if you do not provide this personal information, your bid will not be accepted and the contract will not be awarded to you. Solicitation of this information is necessary for the government to conduct its sale program and thus is authorized under the National Forest Management Act of 1976, (16 U.S.C. 472a). The principal purpose for collecting this information is to allow for proper award of a timber sale contract and to provide for administration of that contract after award. Other routine uses of this data include: (1) compilation of Small Business data to determine needs for set-aside sales, (2) determination of volume purchased in any specific time period by a single purchaser, and (3) determination of volume under contract by a purchaser.
- 12. ROAD COMPLETION DATE: Bidder hereby acknowledges that Bidder is aware of the road completion date of the sample contract. Bidder also acknowledges that if Bidder is a Small Business and elects to have Forest Service construct specified roads, Bidder is aware: (a) that the Forest Service expects to contract for road construction, (b) that the timber sale contract will not be awarded unless a satisfactory road construction bid is received and a road construction contract is awarded or, if the Forest Service fails to receive such a bid within a maximum period stated in the advertisement, the bidder agrees to perform road construction, (c) that the Forest Service may extend the maximum award delay time by the amount of time needed to confirm either sale or road bidder's size status or by any time in excess of 40 days from timber sale bid opening needed to begin solicitation of construction bids, and (d) that if the Forest Service extends the maximum award delay period because solicitation of the road contract is delayed, the bidder may withdraw its bid without penalty.

Bidder who does elect acknowledges that Bidder is aware of and agrees to the conditions stated in Item 12 above and that Bidder is a Small Business concern.

14. DEFINITIONS:

Affiliates: Business concerns or individuals are affiliates of each other if, directly or indirectly, (a) either one controls or has the power to control the other; or (b) a third party controls or has the power to control both.

Bidder: A Bidder is any individual, organization, or other legal entity that submits a bid for, or may be expected to submit a bid for, a National Forest timber sale.

Small Business: In sales of National Forest timber a Small Business is a concern that: (1) is primarily engaged in the logging and forest products industry; (2) is independently owned and operated; (3) is not dominant in its field of operation; and (4) together with its affiliates does not employ more than 500 persons.

15. CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH EXPORT RESTRICTIONS: Certain restrictions on the purchase and export of unprocessed logs cut from National Forest timber apply in various parts of the country. Pursuant to the Forest Resources Conservation and Shortage Relief Act of 1990 (P.L. 101-382) bidder acknowledges that the bidder is aware of the applicable export restrictions. Bidder is aware that these restrictions affect the disposition of the included timber and is aware that the restrictions may reduce the potential value of the timber.

NOTICE TO BIDDERS ON SET-ASIDE SALES

Section 15 of the Small Business Act of 1958 authorizes preferential award of this sale to a small business concern. Bidders desiring such preferential consideration must certify as to their status by signing the Certificate of Small Business Status and attaching it to the bid. Forest products industry under item (1) refers to an industry that utilizes the wood obtained from trees that serve as the principal source of raw material. 

I represent the Colorado State Board of Land Commissioners who manage 320 acres of land west of your property that lies north of Rustic, Colorado. As you know, their charge is to manage the state trust lands to benefit public schools.

Harvesting of selected trees is necessary both for the management of the forest resource and for providing revenue to benefit Colorado's public schools.

A management plan for the 320 acres was completed earlier this year by one of my employees. The Board of Land Commissioners has approved that plan. We are now beginning the implementation stage of the "Manhattan Half-Section" Plan.

I am writing you because I need your assistance in providing access to the state trust land to conduct management activities. The primary access is through private land from Larimer County Road 68C. You are listed on county records as one of the owners that adjoins this private road.

Could I meet with you to discuss the proposed activities? I am also interest in obtaining a temporary access agreement over the road that borders your property.

Access is needed for 12 months starting September 1, 1992. Traffic would include a log truck, a low-boy, and pickup trucks related to timber sale activities on the state land. Period of use by the trucks can be controlled to meet with your wishes (i.e., no more than once per day, or only during Monday-Friday, etc.).

Requirements will be made of any logging contractor that will protect all roads, soil, wildlife, trees not selected for harvest, vegetation, and aesthetics. I know you will be pleased with the end results.

- Title to all timber included in this contract shall remain in the SELLER until it has been paid for and felled or scaled, measured or counted, whichever is later. All dead or live timber marked or designated for cutting by the SELLER or his agent shall be cut and removed. No timber shall be cut until paid for, nor removed from the place agreed upon for scaling, until scaled, measured or counted, and stamped by the SELLER or his agent.
- Sawlogs shall be scaled by the Scribner Decimal C log rule and other products shall be scaled, measured or counted as prescribed by the SELLER's agent or as specifically provided in this contract.
- 3. The PURCHASER, his contractors and sub-contractors, shall make every reasonable effort independently or in cooperation with recognized fire protection agencies to prevent, control and put out any fires starting on, burning on, or threatening the contract area. As used herein, "every reasonable effort" consists of using all available employees and equipment under the control, direct or indirect, of the PURCHASER, his contractors and sub-contractors. U.S. Forest Service approved spark-arrestors shall be used on all internal combustion engines. Operable fire extinguishers shall be available at landing sites for use if needed.
- 4. The PURCHASER, in all phases of construction and logging operations, shall protect, insofar as practicable, all telephone lines, ditches, fences, and other improvements and, if such improvements are damaged by his operations under this contract, he shall restore them immediately to a condition satisfactory to the SELLER.
