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Executive Summary

This summary and tables referenced are compiled from the list of projects submitted by the individual Colorado State Forest Districts involved with forested state trust land management. For project detail, refer to the individual projects, but the overall 2015 Forested State Trust Land Work Plan is as included in this Executive Summary.

The 2015 Forested State Trust Land Work Plan proposes a mix of forest product sales and state land improvements that are consistent with existing management plans. Objectives stressed in these plans include the improvement of forest health, which at this time has increased the need for insect and disease prevention and suppression activities, along with harvests to salvage wood from insect killed stands. Colorado State Forest Service (CSFS) foresters actively monitor the health of the State's forests, and in the case of forested state trust lands, they propose projects as needed to protect and improve forest condition and to generate revenue for the various trusts.

The availability of mills and resultant markets for our timber resources has improved marginally with the restructuring and reopening of a couple large mills. This is reflected in an increase in forest product revenue in 2014 (Appendix A) over the past few years. Estimated gross revenue (Table 2) from projects continued shows a significant increase over the past years. Potential businesses continue to seek a sustainable supply of biomass and other wood products to justify the substantial investment in infrastructure it takes to start up wood utilization companies. Our Colorado Wood Marketing and Utilization Program works with potential businesses to help generate demand for Colorado forest products.

Revenue generated from forest products sales is dynamic, since many projects are implemented over multiple years. Projected gross revenue from 224 projects to be initiated or continued in 2015 is approximately \$2,567,417 (see Table 1); 40% of this (less any funds approved by the Land Board on an annual basis to be provided for stewardship and insect outbreaks) will be Land Board receipts. This revenue should be realized as projects are completed over the next 3 years. As in any land management and economic activity, completion of projects is dependent on markets and resources being available. Having any of our major purchasers of State Forest production suffering financial problems could impact projected revenue significantly.

A portion of the revenue comes from state land improvement (SLI) activities where the cost of doing the activity is more than revenue generated from it. These SLI projects are needed to protect the forest resources from fire, insects and disease, and to improve product potential from the various forest stands. Other SLI projects do not generate revenue, but are proposed for the same reasons. In addition, other non-revenue generating SLI projects are proposed for a variety of purposes including planning, monitoring, and general stewardship of the state trust lands. In the 2015 work plan, CSFS districts proposed SLI projects with an estimated cost of \$228,900 (see Table 1).

Fuels management funds provided through state legislation, along with federal funds provided for fuels mitigation and insect and disease suppression are utilized extensively by our districts to protect and manage our forested state lands. Managing these projects and administering the various grants is time consuming, but well worth the benefit when applied to the ground. The value of the funds leveraged for these purposes is at least what the estimated costs of the SLI projects are, thus doubling the management potential for forested state trust lands. For example, CSFS has begun to implement a

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Pre Disaster Mitigation Grant to conduct fuels mitigation over 854 acres within 2 miles of structures on the State Forest. With match being provided by State Parks and Wildlife there is \$622,923 worth of treatment occurring on the State Forest at no cost to neither the State Land Board nor the State Land Improvement funds.

With the statewide scope of insect and disease impacts on forested state trust lands and limited opportunity for revenue from forest product sales, as a result of State Land Board direction, CSFS retained all the revenue generated from forest harvest activity in 2014. These funds helped to monitor, plan, and implement bark beetle suppression and prevention on the State Forest as well as in other areas of the state. This greatly enhanced CSFS ability to leverage other funds to benefit the forested state trust lands.

Several ongoing activities are intended to continue the land stewardship and public education mission of the CSFS and partners. Ongoing water quality and other monitoring, intended to assess ecosystem health and the impacts of management, continues on the State Forest. This monitoring insures the management activities carried out on forested state trust lands continues to support and enhance a healthy forest ecosystem. Public education activities on the State Forest are funded through CSFS program funds.

Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife, the State Land Board and Colorado State Forest Service continue with a cooperative approach to addressing forestry on the State Forest. This approach demonstrates how proper forest management can address commodity, as well as recreational, aesthetic and other forest amenities provided by our State Forest. The portion of the work plan for the State Forest reflects this program.

The district wide forested state trust land management planning initiated in 2007 continues. Durango, Golden, and Woodland Park Districts are progressing well on theirs. Boulder, Granby, Montrose, Steamboat Springs Districts are planning to conduct forest recon surveys of multiple parcels to begin their potential district wide management plan needs. An increased awareness of product potential from these planning efforts has potential to increase state land revenue. Thorough forest reconnaissance and inventory information provided by these plans will be essential to sustained management of the forests on state trust lands. These large scale plans will be shared with the SLB staff.

The following tables provide an overview of treatments and SLI projects proposed for 2015. Table 1 summarizes proposed treatments and State Land Improvement projects, while Table 2 summarizes treatments continued from 2014. The remainder of this document provides a project-by-project review of proposed CSFS district activities on forested state trust lands. It is not intended to be a comprehensive review of each project, but rather it provides a summary of the extent, variety and distribution CSFS activities on state trust lands. All estimates of direct costs and project values are based on the experience of field staff. Exact amounts are established through agency contracting and product sale advertisement procedures.

Introduction

Projects are listed by CSFS district or field unit and are categorized as follows:

Proposed Treatments: Forest product harvests that are consistent with the parcel's forest management plan. These projects are intended to create positive cash flow.

Continued Treatments: Forest product harvests, approved in a prior *Annual Work Plan*, which are consistent with the parcel's forest management plan. These projects are intended to create positive cash flow.

Proposed State Land Improvement Projects: Vegetation management, access development or other projects intended to protect or enhance forest health and productivity. These projects are a program expense and are funded by available forest product sale revenue.

Continued State Land Improvement Projects: Vegetation management, access development or other projects, approved in a prior *Annual Work Plan*, intended to protect or enhance forest health and productivity. These projects are a program expense and are funded by available forest product sale revenue.

Previously Approved Projects, Postponed Until Later Date: Any project approved in a prior *Annual Work Plan* that has been postponed for any reason. Postponement may result from changes in forest product markets, agency staffing changes, planning priorities, or other unforeseen factors.

Each listing provides a brief project description. **Proposed Treatments** include a number of traditional and nontraditional forest management activities. These activities carry various labels and will be employed to meet stewardship objectives. Most of the proposed practices are intended to manage existing forest vegetation. "**Improvement** and **sanitation thinning**, as well as **Timber Stand Improvement** (TSI) are intended to minimize insect and disease damage and to stimulate forest vigor. **Salvage** projects harvest standing dead or dying trees both to utilize available material and to reduce fuel loading, thus reducing wildfire hazards. **Group selection** and **shelterwood** refer to the harvest of some portion of the overstory trees (usually 1/3 or less) to stimulate new seedling growth in preparation for forest regeneration sometime in the future. **Transplants** refers to the practice of removing small, live trees to be replanted in a landscape setting. This practice is generally used in overcrowded forest stands to reduce competition and to stimulate growth of residual trees. **Patch cuts** and **clear cuts** refer to harvests ranging from less than one acre to numerous acres that are commonly used to regenerate over-mature or declining forest stands.
