Your trees arrived at my office on April 8th. I have been holding them in the lath house ever since.

I could deliver them if you want; just call and tell me where. Also, you could pick them up; give me several days' warning so I can measure out your weed barrier. I am usually in my office from 8:00 to 8:30 each morning. That would be a good time to call.

The sooner these seedlings are planted, the better survival will be. Also, if you do not get them planted before the practice expiration date (June 15, 1993), you will lose the cost-sharing money, as well as eligibility for future cost-sharing (You can still get cost-sharing with a pre-paid planting agreement with CSFS, but you won't be able to get it for doing the work yourself.). Time is of the essence.

If you are unable to complete the work, and need help, CSFS can do it. Planting would cost \$217.00 and weed barrier application would cost \$220.00.

Also, gaps that were supposed to be planted with seedlings, were not planted.

I am terminating the practice. The money (\$553) should be reallocated.

We need to get the paperwork done if you are going to use cost-sharing money this year. Enclosed are three different proposals for how to go about maintaining the planting. Option I: This is the minimum maintenance you can do without getting Uncle Sam worried that perhaps you haven't kept up your end of the bargain. Fourteen more pines died over the winter, making a total of 69 replacements needed. Also, many trees were never mulched and winds have carried some mulch away. 110 trees will need plastic mulch. Option II: This assumes that the pine row is being maintained under Option I. In the example, Rocky Mountain junipers replace Russian-olives called for in the plan. This option treats these two rows as if they were entirely new plantings that had never been cost-shared before. The advantage of this option is that it permits three additional maintenance practices under costsharing, while Option III only permits two. The disadvantage is that this option costs more to install. Option III: The combines Options I & II. It treats the juniper and plum rows as if they had been cost-shared before. By combining the maintenance into one practice, the surplus costsharing money from the pine row can be applied to the other rows. The advantage of this option is that it costs less than the other two options. The disadvantage is that only two additional maintenance practices can be cost-shared. I would choose Option III. If we do a good job, we won't need a third maintenance practice and this one gives the best financial result. If you can complete the job to standard, doing the work yourself produces the lowest out-of-pocket cost. I imagine that, having done some of this work, you might want CSFS to do it. possibility is that you work with my crew as time allows and I reduce the labor charge accordingly. The cost-sharing program will consider your labor as a qualifying expense.

Please call. We need to get together to decide what to do so you can get signed up before January 15th.

Dear Rudy:

When I carried out the inspection for your windbreak planting, I found:

- The plum row entirely lacked weed barrier or carpet called for in the Stewardship plan.
- The Russian-olive row had not been planted.
- Most ponderosa pines were not protected by either carpet or weed barrier.

For these reasons I cannot authorize payment of the entire amount of the cost-sharing.

The pine rows were sufficiently complete to make a minimum-specification-windbreak. I found:

- The south row was 232 feet long and contained 23 trees (It should have contained 29, but several were dead.).
- The west row was 816 feet long and contained 76 trees (It should have contained 102, but several were dead.).
- The north row was 360 feet long and contained 20 trees (It should have contained 45, but several were dead.).
- 4. The east row, south end (The north end was completely dead and/or missing.), was 752 feet long and contained 73 trees (It should have contained 94, but several were dead.).

Altogether, a single-row pine windbreak 2160 feet long, containing 192 trees was planted to specifications. Allowing a 15-foot buffer strip on each side, this comes to 1.5 acres.

On the condition that the 78 dead and/or missing trees are replaced next spring, I can authorize partial payment. I recommend that you reapply for cost-sharing and complete the planting at that time, switching the Russian-olives to Rocky Mountain junipers to give better winter protection while doing so.

The following actions are taken with regard to the list of expenses you submitted (Numbers correspond with line numbers in your letter.): \$300.00 HAND PLANT 150 R. OLIVES AT 756 28TH REJECTED because trees were planted at a different location than the one agreed to in the plan. PROCURING AND INSTALLING 6' WIDE ROLLS OF COMMERCIAL WEED \$220.00 \$110/RL 2-6' WIDE ROLLS BARRIER I have the original invoice (CSFS #25387). It shows four rolls purchased at \$97.09 each, with \$2.91 each, sales tax, making \$100.00 per roll. Your invoice says that only two rolls were used. This comes to \$200.00. \$200.00 is accepted. Line 4 also shows \$24 labor for installing weed barrier. This amount is accepted as is. From CSFS Invoice #25345: 330 Large-pot ponderosa pines were purchased for \$297.00 (\$0.90 per tree). A 10% bulk discount was applied, reducing the cost to \$267.30 (\$0.81 per tree). A 4% sales tax was applied, bringing the final cost to \$0.8424 per This brings the purchase price of the 192 trees meeting specifications to \$161.74, including sales tax. CSFS charged \$0.40 per tree to plant these 192 trees. The labor charge, thus came to \$76.80.
