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

The opening movement of the *Trio of the Odalisques* from *Le Corsaire* is restaged here for a larger ensemble of students from the Ballet Reperetory class. The solo variations are presented in their original choreographic form. The full divertissment includes an opening trio, three solo variations, and a closing trio.

Le Corsaire was first presented in 1858, and has been restaged by major choreographers over the years, including Marius Petipa, Yuri Grigorovich, Pyotr Gusev, and Konstantin Sergeyev. The choreography presented in this performance is restaged from the Sergeyev version, which was first staged in the USA at Boston Ballet (under the direction of Anna-Marie Holmes), and later became a part of the reperotoire at Amercian Ballet Theatre.



nationally and internationally. A full evening of his work was presented at the X and IX Festival Internacional de Danza Contemporanea Avant Garde 2008 and 2009 in Merida, Mexico. In 2013, Verb Ballets of Cleveland premiered and performed an evening of his repertories, a sold-out concert at The Breen Center for the Performing Arts. This year, he has nine dances premiered and performed in Australia, Hong Kong, Mexico, Taiwan and USA. His newest piece which will première by Verb Ballets, partnering with Martha Graham Dance Company's *Lamentation Variations Project* in 2015.

Carol Roderick has taught, coached, and trained teachers and dancers for professional companies, universities, and prestigious schools in the United States, Canada, Japan and Europe. She received her early training in Boston, and later at Butler and Indiana Universities. Her formal pedagogical training was received from the late Jürgen Schneider (Bolshoi Ballet, Stuttgart Ballet, American Ballet Theatre) and Gabriela Komleva (Kirov/Maryinsky Ballet). She was Principal Teacher at AIS International Ballet in Japan, and a member of the professional division faculties of Boston Ballet School and The Royal Winnipeg Ballet School. She directed the Colorado Ballet School, Tulsa Ballet School, and Academy of Ballet Idaho. She was the Program Manager for the



Bolshoi Ballet at Vail, and also served as ballet mistress for the Cleo Parker Robinson New Dance Ensemble. For many years, she ran her own pre-professional training program in Denver: Classical Ballet Ensemble. She has coached and prepared students for the Prix de Lausanne, Japan Grand Prix, New York International Ballet Competition and the USA International Ballet Competition, as well as local and regional scholarship competitions throughout the USA. Many of her students have gone on to professional performance, choreographic, and teaching careers.



Jane Siusarski-Harris is a Professor at Colorado State University. Since 1988, she has been the Director of Dance at CSU where she teaches ballet and modern dance technique, history, pedagogy, and all levels of classical Pilates. Slusarski-Harris has choreographed and performed in numerous works for the concert stage, musical theatre, and opera and for a number of years danced with IMPACT DANCE. She received her MFA in dance from the University of Colorado.

Judy Bejarano, teaches Improvisation, Choreography, and Modern Technique at Colorado State University. She is also well known for her innovative evening length productions as the artistic director of IMPACT Dance Company, a dance/theatre company whose performances speak to issues in our everyday lives. She collaborates and creates custom events with area art groups as well as for private events. Bejarano is increasingly interested in redefining the relationship between performer and audience. Therefore, IMPACT's work can be found in nontraditional spaces, from art galleries, to storefronts, to airplane hangars. Bejarano explores the use dance as a collaborative outreach tool and has a long term relationship

with the arts programs at Pathways Hospice. The company also has a well established integrated arts outreach program, Every Voice Matters. Bejarano's work has been selected for many regional and national festivals including National American College Dance Festival, Colorado Choreographers Showcase, and Gala Concert for the National Dance Association Festival. Her "topic driven work" often uses original text, dance and projection and continues to be commissioned at the university level and by independent dance, theatre and music groups. Bejarano is an enthusiastic and demandinginstructor, and teaches throughout the region. She received her Master of Fine Arts from

C.U. Boulder in dance with an emphasis in choreography.

Chung-Fu Chang is an associate professor at CSU Dance Division. He has received an Outstanding Faculty Award from The Tau Iota Omega Chapter of Mortar Board in 2008 and The 2009 Best Teacher Award from The CSU Alumni Association. His professorship biographical profile is honored and listed in Who's Who in America. He was a Chancellor's Fellowship recipient from the University of California, Irvine, where he completed his M.F.A. in Dance. He has taught contemporary dance and choreography throughout the U.S. and overseas. Born in Taiwan, he danced professionally with the country's internationally renowned Cloud Gate Dance Theatre and Kaohsiung Contemporary Dance Company. His solo performances and choreographic works have been



showcased nationally and internationally. He has received over fifty choreographic commissions from professional ballet and modern dance companies, educational dance institutes and festivals
