














Welcome to Colorado State University!


Board members come from across the state and from many fields - business, public service, agriculture - and share a strong commitment to excellence, innovation, and student success.

Challenging academic programs and world-changing research are hallmarks of Colorado State, and it is our special commitment to service, outreach, and transforming our world through innovation that sets this university apart. Even more important, CSU's character is reflected in the quality of our students and graduates, who embody the university's mission of service and go on to make a significant impact on our world when they graduate.







olorado State University takes very seriously its role in educating student-athletes. Excellence is expected on the field and in the classroom.

The most recent NCAA academic statistics reveal that Colorado State leads the Mountain West Conference in graduation rate for studentathletes at 66 percent – well ahead of the conference's overall studentathlete graduation rate of 57 percent. In football, Colorado State is second in the MWC, graduating 68 percent of its student-athletes – again, well ahead of the conference average of 49 percent.

Colorado State, however, is not resting on its reputation for graduating its student-athletes. The state-of-the-art Anderson Academic Center,




which will greatly enhance the academic facilities available for studentathletes, opened in August 2009.

While the athletic department takes its role in the educational process very seriously, Colorado State's mission to provide a world-class education is at the core of academic success. U.S. News and World Report ranked Colorado State in its top tier in its annual "America's Best Colleges" report. The university offers 79 majors and 27 minors, and many of its programs are ranked among the best in the country.

Colorado State continues to push forward in its mission to provide the best possible education. Construction recently was completed on the state-of-the-art University Center for the Arts and Computer Science buildings, along with the indoor practice facility, academic and training center, and the Rockwell Hall expansion at the College of Business.

- CSU's Veterinary Medicine program ranks second in the country and is the national leader in federal research dollars.
- BusinessWeek ranked CSU's undergraduate College of Business program 67th (up from 73rd in 2008). The program ranks 30th among all public schools and 14th among all colleges and universities in the West and Southwest. The marketing and business law programs were ranked in the nation's Top 10 by the magazine.
- In December 2008, CSU conferred its 150,000th bachelor's degree and 200,000th overall degree.
- According to NCAA statistics, CSU's graduation rate for student-athletes is higher than the graduation rate for the overall student body.





The Denver Metro Area, with a population of 2.4 million, is less than an hour's drive from Fort Collins. A major-league metropolis, named by *Sporting News* the best sports city in the United States, Denver is home to three teams that have competed for their respective world championships in the past 14 years — the Super Bowl XXXII and XXXIII champion Denver Broncos (below), the 1996 and 2001 Stanley Cup champion Colorado Avalanche (right), and the 2007 National League champion Colorado Rockies (left), who lost the World Series that season to the Boston Red Sox. The Denver Nuggets, meanwhile, have mad the playoffs in nine consecutive seasons, including a trip to the 2009 Western Conference finals against the evential champion Los Angeles Lakers.

Sports fans in Colorado are among the most passionate in the nation, and for good reason — their teams are winners.

Denver has all the features of any big city, including great shopping and nightlife on the 16th Street Mall (Denver Pavilions, below), a one-of-a-kind concert venue in RedRocksAmphitheatre (below, right), anadrenaline-inducing amusement parkin ElitchGardens (right), and the world's 10th-busiestairport, Denver International.

Nicknamed the Mile High City because it is one mile above sea level, downtown Denver is home to the Colorado state capitol building, the 13th step of which is exactly one mile in elevation (above).















Moby Madness

Moby Arena is one of the most distinctive and effective homecourt playing facilities in the nation. The Rams are 241-117 (.673) in Moby Arena since the 1987-88 season.

The McGraw Athletic Center (right), which was built in 1998 and houses the CSU athletic department, is now accompanied by a pair of state-of-theart facilities: the Academic & Training Center (top) and the Indoor Practice Facility (opposite). Both facilites were shown off at the grand opening celebration on Sept. 18, 2009. n 1998, Colorado State enhanced its weight room and built an academic center as part of the McGraw Athletic Center project, but these facilities no longer meet the needs of its expanded student-athlete base, nor do they allow the Rams to compete for top-quality recruits.

Because of the heavy time constraints placed on CSU student-athletes through practice, travel, strength and conditioning, and community service, a quality learning environment is essential for the university's student-athletes to achieve the high standards of academic success expected of them.

The Academic and Training Center is the latest centerpiece for CSU's athletic program



and support its mission to recruit, educate, develop, and graduate Rams student-athletes within an environment that prusues excellence, values integrity and ethical conduct, promotes respect for all individuals, teaches sportsmanship, entertains our constituents and emphasizes championship performance.



Every CSU program benefits from the Rams' new facilities. The Indoor Prac-tice Facility will be used by all of the Rams' sports teams, whether they are in season or involved in offseason conditioning.






Rams on the Radio







Ryun Williams

Head Coach | First Season | South Dakota; '92, '97

Ryun Williams, a 19-year coaching veteran, begins his first season as the 12th head coach of the Colorado State women's basketball program.

With over 19 seasons in coaching, including 17 as a head coach, Williams has compiled an impressive 312-191 career record, with stops at South Dakota (2008-12), Wayne State College (1998-2008) and Sheridan College (1995-98), leading his squads to six campaigns of 20 or more victories, four postseason berths and one conference championship.

Williams joins the Rams after completing his fourth season as South Dakota's head coach in the spring of 2012. He led the Coyotes to a highly successful stretch during their transition to Division I competition, and helped them become one of the nation's premier defensive teams.

A staple of the Coyotes under Williams has been defense, and that was no exception in 2011-12. They ranked second nationally in blocks per game (7.3), eighth in field-goal defense (33.2) and 12th in scoring defense (52.3), leading the Summit League in all three categories. The Coyotes qualified for the WNIT for the first time ever last season as a Division I program, which was their second straight postseason berth after competing in the Women's Basketball Invitational in 2010-11. South Dakota finished with a No. 97 rank in the RPI, the second-highest of any Summit League team and the highest mark in school history.

Prior to arriving at USD in 2008, Williams spent 10 seasons at Wayne State, building that program into a perennial contender in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference.

Williams took over a program that had won just 13 games the previous two seasons and turned it into an NCAA tournament team. His team's recorded 20 wins or more in three of his final four seasons and made appearances in the NCAA Division II North Central Region tournament in two of the last three seasons. While at Wayne State, he compiled a 181-105 record (.632) and became the winningest women's basketball coach in school history.

In 2007-08, he guided the Wildcats to a 21-9 record, which included a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the first round of the North Central Region he led his team to an 85-78 upset of North Dakota for the first win in the NCAA tournament in the school's history. In 2005-06, Williams took Wayne State to its first-ever trip to the NCAA tournament, as the team notched its best season in school history by going 27-4. They were 13-1 in NSIC play and won the NSIC tournament to earn automatic berth to the NCAA tournament. That season Williams was named the NSIC Coach of the Year.

Williams' players have received plenty of postseason recognition. He has had players named WBCA All-America

Chad Lavin

Assistant Coach | First Season at CSU | South Dakota; '78, '83

Chad Lavin returns to women's basketball in 2012-13 after a four-year hiatus from coaching. In his first season with the Rams, Lavin brings with him 26 years of head coaching experience, including 12 years at the Division I level. He is in charge of player development.

A Division II Russell Athletic/WBCA National Coach of the Year and twotime Regional Coach of the Year, Lavin (56) opted for early retirement in 2008, after guiding his South Dakota squad to the NCAA championship game. The Coyotes finished the season 33-2, the best record in school history, and they received a No. 2 final ranking in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll.

Lavin ended his career at USD the all-time winningest coach (273-141; .659), and he was inducted in the South Dakota Sports Hall of Fame in 2011.

In between his first four year stint (1982-86) and his last 10 years (1998-2008) at South Dakota, Lavin was head coach of the Rams' Border War rival Wyoming for 12 seasons (1986-1998). While there he amassed a 175-162 (.519) record and led the Cowgirls to four top three conference finishes, including their only regular-season league title in 1989-90. That year the team went 24-8 overall and posted its best conference winning percentage in the history of the program at .900 (9-1).

All told Lavin has mentored seven national playoff teams and he has seven seasons with 20 or more wins on his résumé. He has been named North Central Conference Coach of the Year four times (1982-83, 1984-85, 2002-03, 2007-08), South Dakota Collegiate Coach of the Year (1984-85), High Country Athletic Conference Coach of the Year twice (1986-87, 1989-90) and was the North Central Region Coach of the Year in 2002-03.

He has coached five NCC MVPs and five CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including director of women's basketball operations, Mandy Koupal.



ASSISTANT COACH TIM MOSER



Tim Moser

Assistant Coach | First Season at CSU | CSU-Pueblo, '98

Tim Moser begins his first season with the Rams after a very successful stretch at Alaska Anchorage. As head coach at UAA, Tim Moser elevated the Seawolf program among the elite in NCAA Division II women's basketball.

With a 165-32 record, Moser compiled the highest percentage (.838) among active D-II women's coaches and the seventh-best among all divisions, following the end of the 2011-12 campaign. His Seawolf squads advanced to at least the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of his seasons, including consecutive Final Four appearances in 2008 and 2009, and another NCAA Elite Eight berth in 2012. Under his guidance, the Seawolves earned three NCAA West Region titles, two Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular-season crowns, two GNAC Tournament titles and three 30-win seasons.

In Moser's tenure, only two other D-II women's programs posted as many victories as the Seawolves and none were ranked in the WBCA/ESPN Top 25 Coaches' Poll for as many consecutive weeks (81). The Seawolves dropped no lower than No. 19 over a 5-year span (2007-12) - the only club in D-II to make that claim.

The 2011-12 Seawolves went 30-5 and won the GNAC title by two games, finishing No. 7 in the final

national rankings. With Moser capturing his third GNAC Coach of the Year award, UAA became the first basketball program - women's or men's - to sweep the league's major honors, with Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and Freshman of the Year accolades.

In 2008-09, Moser's squad won 31 games - a record for all UAA sports for the second straight year. Moser also received the 2009 WBCA Div. II West Region Coach of the Year honor as UAA captured a share of its first conference title in 20 years.

During Moser's tenure at UAA, the Seawolves were 97-7 at home, 14-6 in the NCAA Tournament and 9-3 against D-I opponents, including wins over Big East clubs Cincinnati and Syracuse.

As a D-II rookie coach in 2006-07, Moser was voted GNAC Coach of the Year after leading the Seawolves to 23-6 record and the team's first NCAA Tournament victory in seven seasons. UAA recorded the eighth-biggest turnaround in D-II from 2005-06 to '06-07 as he took over a program that had averaged just 10.7 wins the previous six years.

A former Seawolf player, Moser returned to UAA in April 2006 from Otero (Colo.) Junior College, where he coached against Head Coach Ryun Williams who led Sheridan College at the time. He won 74 percent of his games and captured nine conference coach-of-the-year awards, coaching both the women's and men's teams. He coached the OJC men exclusively the final two seasons, after leading the men and women simultaneously the previous six years.

In six seasons with the Lady Rattlers, Moser compiled a 137-41 record and won five straight conference championships from 1998-02. With the men, he registered a 172-68 mark, winning four league titles.

Moser's student-athletes at OJC compiled an even more incredible record of success in the classroom, with the men ranking among the nation's top five teams in terms of grade-point average for five straight years, and the women holding a top-10 academic rank for six years in a row. During Moser's 14 combined seasons as head coach, the Rattlers produced 15 Academic All-Americans, 52 Academic All-Region performers, and all but one player graduated from the two-year school.

In 20 seasons as a head coach, Moser has accumulated a 474-130 record, with 14 combined seasons spent on the junior college level (eight men/six women) and six on the D-II level. His tally on the women's side is 302-62.

Moser received his bachelor's degree in social sciences from Colorado State-Pueblo in 1998.

Kim Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba begins her first season with Colorado State women's basketball as an assistant for the Rams. She will be the recruiting coordinator on the staff.

Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba returns to her alma mater after six seasons as an assistant coach at Rice.

While at Rice, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba served as the staff's recruiting coordinator and worked with the Owl's perimeter players. She also oversaw the student-athletes academic progress in conjunction with the athletic academic advising team and compliance with the NCAA Clearinghouse and NCAA by-laws.

As a senior captain, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba helped lead Colorado State to the WAC Mountain Division title and a trip to the NCAA tournament second round in 1998 with teammates Becky Hammon and Katie Cronin. During her career the Rams won 20 or more games in three seasons, advancing the NCAA tournament twice.

After graduating from CSU, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba spent one season playing professionally for Salon Palloilidat Salpa in Finland where she averaged 18 points and nine rebounds. In high school, she was a 1993-94 Street & Smith's All-America Honorable Mention and a Basketball Congress International All-American.

Mandy Koupal begins her first season on the CSU women's basketball staff as the director of operations.

Koupal joins Head Coach Ryun Williams from the University of South Dakota. She was a part of the staff that helped guide the Coyotes to a 76-47 mark in their first four years of the transition to Division I competition.

While at USD, Koupal helped guide the Coyotes to a berth in the Women's National Invitational

Tournament for the first time in 2011-12 and the Women's Basketball Invitational tournament in 2010-11.

Koupal, a native of Wagner, S.D., spent her first two seasons as a graduate assistant on the USD staff before becoming a full-time member in 2010.

Before Koupal returned to her alma mater, she was an assistant coach for Watertown Arrows girls basketball team from 2004-2008. She helped lead the team to the State AA Championship in 2007 and a third place finish in state in 2008. While at Watertown High School, Koupal also taught fourth grade.

Prior to beginning her coaching career at Watertown, High School, Koupal enjoyed a decorated playing career at the University of South Dakota under current assistant coach Chad Lavin. She ranks as one of the greatest players in school history, finishing as USD's career leader in scoring with 2,142 points in just three seasons. Upon graduation, her 2,496 career points ranked sixth all-time in NCAA Division II. She also owns the top three single-season scoring marks (806, 740 and 596) and she is the only player in North Central Conference history to win three straight NCC MVP honors. A three-time all-American, Koupal was an academic all-American, atwo-time National Player of the Year and shewon three NCC MVP honors.

Koupal graduated from USD in 2004 with bachelor's degree in elementary education and completed her master's degree in educational administration in May 2010.



Director of Athletics John C. "Jack" Graham has boldly placed Colorado State's program on an ambitious path towards national prominence with his visionary leadership.

A successful business leader and former Rams guarterback, Graham has integrated the department under the motto, "Dream big, work hard and settle for nothing less than excellence."

University President Tony Frank believes Graham is the right person to move CSU's most visible department toward.

"In Jack Graham, we have the perfect combination of dedicated Ram fan, stand-out athlete and experienced business leader with the skills and business acumen to energize and advance our overall athletics program," Frank said. "I am excited about the enthusiasm he will generate among our students, coaches, alumni, donors and fans. He brings high standards, high expectations and a passion for winning that is infectious."

CSU's athletics department supports nearly 400 student-athletes competing in 16 varsity sports.

Graham, who played guarterback for the Rams from 1973-74, took on the duties of athletic director and quickly went to work. His first major initiative was to conduct a thorough evaluation of all athletic programs and to engage with donors and supporters about their goals for CSU athletics.

Shortly thereafter, Graham invested in CSU's future by hiring coaches with proven track records in the Rams' three biggest sports: football and men's and women's basketball. His expectation is to win at least 60 percent of games/matches and consistently participate and win in postseason competition.

With numerous ideas for improvement and expansion, Graham is overseeing a project that is already in progress. The Moby renovation will expand the north and south concourses, improving fan access to the ticket sales and will-call areas, as well as create a more logical setup of the concession stands. The project is slated to be finished in the summer of 2013.

Graham graduated from CSU in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in U.S. history. After playing football for CSU, he was drafted by the Miami Dolphins. He went on to a successful 30-year career in the international insurance and reinsurance markets, where he was known as an innovator and effective leader. In 1998, he founded ICAT Managers, a leader in catastrophic risk insurance products. He sold ICAT, including its Lloyd's of London business, in 2010 and remains on the company's board of directors. Graham also sits on the advisory board of the National Center for Atmospheric

Research.



"We have the same expectations for excellence in our sports program that we have for all areas of the university," Frank said. "With Jack's leadership, I see no reason why CSU athletics cannot and should not compete at the highest level. To get there, we have to dream big, work hard and settle for nothing less than excellence."

Graham introduced head football coach Jim McElwain to a packed house at Moby Arena during halftime of the CSU men's basketball team's eventual victory over No. 17-ranked San Diego State on Jan. 28, 2012.







2012-13 SEASON OUTLOOK

Head Coach Ryun Williams and the Colorado State women's basketball program will look to improve in the Mountain West conference and earn a postseason berth in 2012-13. Returning three starters and eight letter-winners overall, the Rams are turning over a new leaf on the road to national prominence.

Last year the Rams finished 13-17 overall, and 9-5 in conference play, the team's best league record since 2001-02, and CSU was picked to finish third in the final standings, which was the highest prediction for the Rams since the 2002-03 season. The team ended up finishing exactly where they were forecast, in third. Colorado State was undefeated at home in conference play for the first time since 2002-03.

The Rams will look to extend their undefeated streak on the Moby court that currently stands at seven games, dating back to Jan. 11, 2012. CSU earned regularseason sweeps over Boise State and Air Force, making the fourth straight season that CSU has swept Air Force. The team

finished first in the Mountain West conference in five categories: Free-throws (.746), field-goal percentage (.429), defensive rebounds (24.5 per game), rebounding defense (allowing just 33.7 rebounds per game), and assists (14.6 per game). This year Williams and his team have greater expectations. They are picked to finish fifth in the Mountain West and are eager to gain momentum with new coaches and players by their sides.

Senior **Meghan Heimstra** received Mountain West Sixth Player of the Year and is the first women's basketball player at Colorado State to ever earn the award. She played in 30 games, led the team with 34 blocks, averaged 5.5 rebounds per game, while scoring 8.3 points per contest.

Junior **Sam Martin** was honored with a second-team all-conference selection, while starting in a team-high 29 out of 30 games for the Rams. She averaged 13.1 points and a strong 5.8 rebounds per game. Martin is ranked fourth in the nation in free-throw percentage with .901. Sam will be a major leader and contributor this season.

Hayley Thompson will enter her third season as a Ram. She



started in 22 out of 27 games for the team after nursing an early-season ankle injury. Hayley averaged 5.1 points and 3.7 rebounds per game and will be a threat at the perimeter this season.

LaDeyah Forte will begin her second season for the Rams. The sophomore started in 25 out of 30 games for Colorado State, the highest among freshmen last year. She was ranked second in the Mountain West in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3) and fourth in assists (3.5.) in 2011-12. Forte averaged 5.6 points per game and 1.6 steals per game and will continue to be a threat to opposing teams this season.

Sophomores **Kara Spotton** and **Morgan Hunt** will see significant amounts of action for the Rams again this season. Hunt set a career high with eight rebounds and averaged 2.0 points per contest. Spotton averaged 4.3 points and 3.2 rebounds per game.

Redshirt sophomore guards **Amber** and **Mandy Makeever** are continuing to recover from their injuries and will be returning to the court this season.

Sophomores Hanne Mestdagh and Carlyn Chavez will return to play for the Rams this season. Mestdagh is also recovering from her injury sustained last season. Chavez averaged 0.6 points and 0.5 rebounds per game.

With the loss of seniors Kellly Hartig and the fourth-highest scorer in CSU women's basketball history, Kim Mestdagh, the Rams will have to fill the gap with help from these five newcomers for the 2012-13 season.

Freshman **Caitlin Duffy** (St. Thomas More, Rapid City, S.D.) a first team All-American, led her high school team to their first girls basketball state championship averaging 19.5 points, 6.8 rebounds, 3.8 assists, and 3.3 steals per game her senior year.

Freshman **Taylor Varsho** (Marshfield High School, Marshfield, Wisc.) was named allstate her sophomore, junior, and senior seasons. She averaged a team high 18.1 points, 3.9 rebounds, and 2.2 assists per game as a senior. Varsho ended her high school career as the Marshfield leading scorer with 1,364

Freshman **Emily Johnson** (Georgetown High School, Georgetown, Tex.) was named captain in both her junior and senior seasons, earing the MVP title during her senior campaign. Johnson averaged 13.2 points, 3.9 assists, 2.3 steals, and 5.6 rebounds per game. Emily was also Texas Girls Coaches Association all-state as a junior and senior.

Junior transfer **Katrina Ottesen** (Central Arizona Junior College, Chandler, Ariz.) lead the Vaqueras in scoring, averaging 15.1 points and 2.3 assists per game, made a team-high 84 threepointers, and was named female athlete of the year. Ottesen and the Vasqueras were undefeated in conference play and finished fourth in the junior college final four.

Junior transfer **Alicia Nichols** (Northeastern Junior College, Brush Colo.) was named an all-region IX player in 2011 and 2012. Nichols held high school records in career points (1,133), rebounds (924), steals (299), and assists (381.) She was named all-state during her junior and senior seasons and earned allconference accolades all four years.







The Colorado State women's basketball program made strides of improvement this past season under Head Coach Kristen Holt.

During the 2011-12 season, the Rams had an overall record of 13-17, and 9-5 in conference play, improving their conference record from the previous season's 7-9 finish in the Mountain West. CSU earned a third-place conference ranking. Colorado State rode a seven game win streak at home this season, going undefeated at home in league play for the first time since 2002-03. The Rams also had conference sweeps over MW opponents Boise State and Air Force.

Returning seniors Kim Mestdagh and Kelly Hartig helped successfully chief the team during their last season at Colorado State. Hartig was a great asset to the team averaging 5.1 rebounds per game and averaging 6.9 points per game during conference play. She scored a career high on Feb. 14, tallying 20 points against Boise State. Kelly ranked fourth in the Mountain West with a field goal pct. of .536 in Mw games.

Kim Mestdagh had another phenomenal season, leading the Mountain West in steals, averaging 2.6 steals per game, and in threepointers, and averaging 2.3 per game. In Colorado State's history, Mestdagh ranks fourth in points with 1,676, fourth in field goals made with 569, fourth in steals with 233, second in three-point field goals made with 290, and second in three-point field goal attempts with 823. Kim was voted First-team all-conference for 2012 and was named Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year.

Junior Meghan Heimstra was voted Sixth Player of the Year this season. Heimstra's steady play helped the team immensely with her averaging 8.3 points per game, 5.5 rebounds per game and tallying 48 steals and 34 blocks this season.

Returning sophomore captains Sam Martin and Hayley Thompson helped lead the team last season. Thompson averaged 5.1 points per game, 3.7 rebounds per game and had 25 steals this season, while Martin averaged 13.1 points per game and 30 blocks this season. Martin ranked fifth in the Mountain West in rebounding averaging 6.4 during MW play, and second with a field-goal percentage of .556. Sam was also named second-team all-conference. She finished fourth in the country in free-throw percentage with .901.

Colorado State added five true freshman to the roster this year: LaDeyah Forte, Hanne Mestdagh, Carlyn Chavez, Kara Spotton, and Morgan Hunt. Forte and saw substantial action for the Rams, taking the second-place rank in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3) and a fourth-place rank in the conference with 106 assists.

Mandy Makeever started in five of the nine games she played before falling prey to a shoulder injury, averaging 6.3 points per game, and 1.7 rebounds per game. Twin sister Amber Makeever took a medical redshirt for the season due to a hip injury.










1999 NCAA Tournament


2001 NCAA Tournament







Ashley Augspurger Kodak Honorable Mention 2003




Becky Hammon averaged 25.3 points per game during the Rams' 19-game winning streak in 1998-99





Media Credentials

- Media credentials are distributed on a season or singlegame basis. Requests should be made at least one week prior to an event.
- Credentials will be left prior to the game at media will call, located at the lower (ground level) southwest entrance of Moby Arena, adjacent to the Academic & Training Center and north of fhe Ram Field softball complex.

Photographer Credentials

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times.
- Photographer's boxes are located at both ends of the playing court, on the south side of each basket standard, opposite the team benches. Still and video photographers are allowed to be positioned in either of these boxes only.
- Photography is not allowed from any of the courtside media or donor seating along either baseline or the south side of the playing court, the team bench area, or official scorer's table.
- No photography equipment (i.e., cameras, strobes) shall be attached to the backboard, goal standards or tables located courtside without specific, prior written permission.
- Still photographers may not utilize flash attachments at any courtside location.
- Tripods may not be placed on or beside the playing floor, or on any table.
- Upper-level still and video photographer positions are located above the south side seating areas and in the press box overhead on the north side. Photographers are unable to use the south side location for any game that is being televised. Individuals seeking to use the north side location must be granted permission by a member of the athletic media relations staff.

Parking

- Access to the parking lot immediately west of the McGraw Center will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays
- Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: www.colostate.edu/ depts/parking.

Interview Guidelines

Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's women's basketball coaching staff and studentathletes must be coordinated through assistant media relations director Danielle Marshall.

- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media, by the coaches, student-athletes, or the athletic department. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail and cell number, but rather to contact Danielle Marshall.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of selected practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room.
- No pregame interviews will be granted on game days. Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through Danielle Marshall. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewee.

Postgame Guidelines

•

- At the conclusion of every game, Colorado State coach Ryun Williams will use the NCAA-suggested 10-minute cooling period to address members of the team.
- At the conclusion of the NCAA-suggested cooling period, Williams will address the media in the Adolf Coors Family Foundation Auditorium, Room 100, in the McGraw Atheltic Center.
- Colorado State's locker room is closed to the media at all times. Specific players will be brought to the press conference upon request.
- The media relations office will do its best to accomodate all properly made requests.
- Other than network contractual obligations, no student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the game from Danielle Marshall.

Broadcast Rights and Restrictions

Colorado State, its opponent and the respective conference designate the broadcast rights for all games. CSU follows the guidelines established by the NCAA Championship Events Committee, Radio and television stations and Internet sites that have not purchased rights shall not carry any broadcast report from the arena on a live basis or any live description, footage of any game action while it is still in progress. No pregame and, or postgame live coverage shall be permitted for two hours before and one-half hour after the sporting event without the express permission of the university. Per NCAA guidelines, stations are limited to three minutes of highlights per news show. Television stations also are prohibited from selling, loaning or giving away footage to any individual or agency for useon any non-sports-news program produced or aired by the station. Games that are broadcast by television networks may have additional restrictions. Also, per NCAA regulations, footage and photos of athletes with eligibility remaining may NOT be used to commercially promote any product, service or media outlet and may not be sold, loaned to other individuals, agencies for this purpose. Disrespect of credential privileges will result in withdrawal of all future credentials.

A native of Fort Collins, Hallisey graduated from Rocky Mountain High School before earning his bachelor's degree in technical journalism in 2012.

During his time as an undergraduate, Nic also gained valuable experience as an intern with USA Basketball and gameday assistant with the Denver Broncos, in addition to volunteering at several Mountain West and NCAA championship events.

THIS IS THE MOUNTAIN WEST

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 14th year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements over its first 13 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide stateof-the art basketball instant replay system.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State and New Mexico). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, while Fresno State and San Diego State add a West coast influence with their locations in Central and Southern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful Islands in the Pacific Ocean.

HISTORY

The Mountain West was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from a former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Three of the MW's eight original mem-



bers have been conference rivals since the 1960s (New Mexico, Wyoming and Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MW in 1999. TCU re-joined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. With conference realignment sweeping the nation in recent years, the MW has been proactive in addressing membership changes. Boise State University joined the Mountain West in 2011-12, followed by Fresno State and the University of Nevada on July 1, 2012. Also on July 1, 2012, the University of Hawai'i became a football-only member of the Conference. On May 4, 2012, the Mountain West announced the additions of San Jose State University as full-time members effective July 1, 2013.

When the Mountain West officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MW football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Craig Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three seasons (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl affiliations – the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, San Diego Country Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl and Gildan New Mexico Bowl.

An innovator in the postseason bowl structure, the MW engineered many "firsts," as league teams have participated in five inaugural bowl games (2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans, 2002 San Francisco (Emerald), 2005 Poinsettia, 2006 New Mexico), as well as placing the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS team into a BCS bowl game with Utah's appearance in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

ACADEMIC CONSORTIUM

From the outset, the MW's member institutions have been committed to creating strong academic relationships, as well as athletic competition. To that end, the chief academic officers of each institution have explored academic exchange programs, library crossovers and shared research. In addition, the faculty athletics representatives routinely provide academic assistance and test-taking services for student-athletes visiting from fellow member institutions for competition.

OPPORTUNITY

The Mountain West provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for more than 7,000 student-athletes each year. Over the past 13 years, 38 Mountain West student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 26 student-athletes have been named MW Scholar-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Three student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars (Jessica Mellinger, Wyoming and Delavane Diaz and Brittany Morreale, Air Force).

Conference student-athletes are also given a voice regarding pertinent issues within the MW and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The Mountain West SAAC consists of 19 representatives; two student-athletes from each full member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the Conference constituent groups or committees related to the student-athlete experience.

ACHIEVEMENT

The MW has produced 762 All-America selections among its 18 sponsored sports (men's swimming was discontinued as a conference sport following the 2010-11 season) in the last 13 years, including a league-record 83 All-America honorees in 2010-11. A total of 125 MW student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades in that span. The Mountain West has sent at least 28 teams to NCAA postseason events in each of the past 13 years, capturing three team national championships in men's cross country and producing 32 individual national champions in the sports of men's golf, men's cross country, and men's and women's indoor track & field.

Mountain West members have participated in 51 bowl games under the league umbrella, including four appearances in BCS games. The MW has earned 61 postseason

bids in men's basketball, including 33 NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT Final Four berths. MW women's basketball has tallied 57 postseason slots, including 31 NCAA bids, five Sweet 16 appearances and one Elite Eight berth since 2000. Wyoming won the MW's first WNIT championship in 2007 with a win over Wisconsin. In women's volleyball, the MW has had 34 NCAA bids with eight Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. Women's soccer has earned 26 NCAA bids since 1999, with BYU advancing to the Sweet 16 in 2000 and the Elite Eight in 2003. MW men's golf has had at least four representatives in each of the last 13 NCAA Golf Regionals, while women's golf has had at least three teams participate in NCAA Regionals 11 of the last 13 years.

SPORTSMANSHIP

Named a Sports Ethics Fellow by the Institute for International Sport in 1998, Commissioner Thompson has been a driving force for sportsmanship within intercollegiate athletics. As part of its continuing growth and development, the Mountain West implemented an extensive Sportsmanship Initiative, endorsed by both the MW Joint Council and MW Board of Directors. The program is made up of several elements, which are both practical and philosophical in nature. While the MW has significant penalties in place to deal with violations, the Sportsmanship Initiative is primarily promotional and educational in nature. The goal is to develop an environment that fosters appropriate behavior from all Conference constituencies.
