Cooperator: Redstone Canyon Wildfire Mitigation Group

Work to be completed: Implement 20 acres of ponderosa pine restoration according to Dr. Reynolds' Rocky Mountain Research Station ponderosa pine restoration guidelines for the Intermountain area. Thinning around homes will follow CSFS guidelines for WUI areas. Reforest 15 acres and spray leafy spurge across 5 acres of drainages within the High Park Fire burn area. Coordinate and facilitate a one-day workshop on living in fire prone areas. The Larimer County Conservation Corps will be employed to help implement this project.

**Standards or Guidelines:** Will meet CSFS guidelines appropriate for treatment. Will comply with standards in *Colorado Forest Stewardship Guidelines to Protect Water Quality: Best Management Practices* 

Project Period: June 12, 2013 to April 30, 2015.

Thining and pruning will create both vertical and horizontal discontinuous fuels, such that the stand could not carry a crown fire under most conditions. Future wildfire would underburn and not damage the watershed nor create hydrophobic soils. Planting will help stabilize the upper drainage. The drainage has seen excessive ersion and filling in of small ponds with sediment after the Crystal Mtn fire in 2011. The High Park fire has created an unstable at-risk watershed in the upper Redstone Canyon. It is imperative that future burns not be intense crown fires in order to maintain watershed stability. Planting a few key private inholdings will provide additional stability and recovery.

One purpose of this project is to reduce fuel hazard and to thin the margins of existing fuelbreaks such as those represented by the 24 miles of privately owned access roads. This project is part of an ongoing and multi-year effort being led by the Redstone Canyon Wildfire Mitigation Group (which has received numerous kudos from PFA for past work). Public education is also an important objective of the project. Tasks for tree planting and noxious weed removal are important for watershed stability.

TASK 1: Treat 20 acres (thin, prune, and pile) of strategically selected areas (locations included on CWPP/project map provided below). Volunteers and the homeowners will perform the cutting and pruning. A hired contractor will chip and broadcast the debris. Need \$14000 chipping, \$2000 operating costs.

TASK 2: 15 acres will be planted of ponderosa and aspen in two areas - ridgetop area along Roan Mtn Rd and a steamside area along Laurence Ck. LCCC will be used along with volunteers. Homeowners will assist in purchase of trees. Need \$4080 for trees, \$4120 LCCC labor.

TASK 3: Treat 5 ac by spraying leafy spurge in areas where it is spreading within and adjacent to High Park burn in Roan Mtn Rd, Laurence Ck and Redstone Ck (milepost 5.2). This will be entirely homeowner responsibility and will continue annually.

TASK 4: A one day workshop on living in fire prone areas - 1/2 day classroom style followed by a field trip to Roan Mtn Rd to view success stories and lessons learned.

This project will consist of several phases including 1) fuel hazard reduction and enhancement of defensible space through restoration of ponderosa pine (20 ac); 2) planting of ponderosa pine in burned over areas from the High Park Fire (15 ac); 3) reduction of invasive species (leafy spurge in burned upper drainages) (5 ac); and 4) conduct a workshop for homeowners living in the wildland urban interface (WUI). The Redstone Canyon area west of Ft. Collins is an unincorporated community in Larimer County. Redstone Canyon consists of approximately 85 residences on 170 lots that are 35 to 40 acres in size (6800 acres). A 7-mile county road (NCR 25E) provides access to Redstone Canyon in the bottom of the drainage, with up to 24 miles of privately maintained roads accessing homes on the upper slopes. Redstone Canyon has a severe community hazard rating by PFA and is considered part of the WUI. Vegetation consists of ponderosa pine, juniper, and some Douglas-fir, with a mix of shrubs and grasslands, with dense regenerative tree growth which are prime ladder fuels for intense fire in the upper drainages. This project will augment completed work in 2010-2013 and extend our mitigation efforts to other areas to enhance defensible space, reduce fuel loads, and create fuel breaks. ~320 acres of the canyon was burned in the 2011 Crsytal Mtn Fire and ~3800 acres in the High Park Fire. Past work prevented loss of 4 homes and over \$500 million in avoided suppression costs (saving electronic site on top of Horsetooth). The workshop will share this success story with other homeowners. Planting trees with LCCC labor will stabilize the upper watershed and improve water quality, along with reduction of noxious weeds by homeowners.

The community has an existing CWPP on-file with the CSFS. A high priority action item identified by the CWPP is the reduction of hazardous fuels and enhancement of defensible space. This project will augment work done in 2010-13. Thinning will follow consultant Dr. Rich Reynolds' of Rocky Mtn Res Station guidelines for ponderosa pine restoration for the Intermountain area. Legacy trees will be left, with a "groupy - clumpy" prescription being implemented, which mimics natural stand conditons for ponderosa pine. Thinning around homes will follow CSFS guidelines for WUI areas. Species compositon and structure will be geared to species (mainly ponderosa pine) that are drought resistant and develop a structure that is resilient to future fire disturbances. Planting in the upper Redstone will stabilize the upper watershed (about 90% was rated severely burned). BMPs for watershed management will be followed, including waterbarring of trails and maintaining streamside zones.

Thining and pruning will create both vertical and horizontal discontinuous fuels, such that the stand could not carry a crown fire under most conditions. Future wildfire would underburn and not damage the watershed nor create hydrophobic soils. Planting will help stabilize the upper drainage. The drainage has seen excessive ersion and filling in of small ponds with sediment after the Crystal Mtn fire in 2011. The High Park fire has created an unstable at-risk watershed in the upper Redstone Canyon. It is imperative that future burns not be intense crown fires in order to maintain watershed stability. Planting a few key private inholdings will provide additional stability and recovery.

One purpose of this project is to reduce fuel hazard and to thin the margins of existing fuelbreaks such as those represented by the 24 miles of privately owned access roads. This project is part of an ongoing and multi-year effort being led by the Redstone Canyon Wildfire Mitigation Group (which has received numerous kudos from PFA for past work). Public education is also an important objective of the project. Tasks for tree planting and noxious weed removal are important for watershed stability.

TASK 1: Treat 20 acres (thin, prune, and pile) of strategically selected areas (locations included on CWPP/project map provided below). Volunteers and the homeowners will perform the cutting and pruning. A hired contractor will chip and broadcast the debris. Need \$14000 chipping, \$2000 operating costs.

TASK 2: 15 acres will be planted of ponderosa and aspen in two areas - ridgetop area along Roan Mtn Rd and a steamside area along Laurence Ck. LCCC will be used along with volunteers. Homeowners will assist in purchase of trees. Need \$4080 for trees, \$4120 LCCC labor.
