- Remove hazard trees and potential hazard trees from around facilities
- Increase overall forest health
- · Reduce levels of dwarf mistletoe
- Increase forest resistance to insects and disease

General Description of Work:

Work involves technical felling of mountain pine beetle infested and susceptible trees with a chainsaw and piling slash to create patch-cuts around buildings and live power lines. A mandatory site inspection is required for this project.

Legal Description and Location:

Pingree Park is located in Larimer County about two hours or 55 miles west of Fort Collins, CO. To reach Pingree, travel north on Highway 287 to the junction of Highway 14. From this junction, turn west and drive about 25 miles through Poudre Canyon to the Pingree Park Road turnoff. Cross the bridge and drive approximately 16 miles to the main gate to the Pingree Park Campus. Project is located in portions of Sections 16, 17, and 20, Township 7 North, Range 73 West.

Project is described and/or marked as follows: Unit boundaries are flagged in pink.

All lodgepole pine and dead trees within unit boundaries shall be cut. The majority of trees to be felled are between 6-12 inches DBH; however, sizes range from 2-20+ DBH. Contractor may remove and utilize any materials of choice that are designated for treatment. If Contractor chooses not to remove materials, logs shall be limbed, cut to 12'6" lengths and stacked where Pingree staff can access materials but does not obstruct trails or roads. Slash will be broadcast chipped back on to site or piled along roadsides not obstructing trails or roads but in locations where Pingree staff can access materials with vehicles. For all activities, no materials shall be left where they are obstructing roads, trails, or building entrances and exits.

General Prescriptions:

For Treatments:

- Cut and remove all lodgepole pine 2 inches DBH or greater
- Cut and remove all dead trees or those with current mountain pine beetle infestations.
- · Retain all other species unless they are dead or significantly damaged
- Retain all healthy trees with a 2 inch DBH or smaller.
- Wherever practicable, contractor will cut stumps to as close to ground level as possible. Where slope, rocks, or other features prohibit, then a maximum of 4" on the uphill side will be acceptable.
- Slash may be broadcast chipped back onto the site or will be piled next to road for easy access; however, will not obstruct road or trails.

Contract Period and Operational Period:

Project period runs from June 1, 2009 through September 18, 2009. The daily operational period is limited to 7:00 a.m. to dusk. Due to funding constraints, no contract extensions will be allowed. Blackout dates during which NO work will take place due to sensitive campus programs are from May 27th-June 5th and June 22nd-June 24th.

Additional Performance Standards:

- Coordination with Pingree Park maintenance staff will be required for work around power lines.
 No primary power lines will be turned off for this project.
- Adequate barricades or warning devices shall be placed as necessary for the safety of persons and vehicles. Flaggers or lookouts may be required to direct pedestrian or vehicular traffic through work areas when conditions are safe.
- Soil disturbance will be as minimal as possible. Ruts and/or depressions in the soil caused by Contractor equipment will be less than six inches deep. In areas where machines have used a path repeatedly, water-bars will be installed by the contractor if the Contract Administrator deems necessary.
- Ephemeral drainage areas will not be used as primary travel routes.
- Fuel, hydraulic fluid or other chemical spills will be reported to the Contract Administrator and Pingree staff immediately. Soil contaminated by loss of fuel, oil, grease, hydraulic fluid, coolant, or other fluids shall either be removed and placed in covered drums or other acceptable containers for proper disposal by the Contractor or left in place and mixed with an encapsulating product such as RamSorb I, depending on the amount of contamination.
- The Contract Administrator may require the Contractor to cut leave trees that have been significantly damaged (broken top, multiple scars, scarring in excess of 12" x 6" on the trunk, or an area encompassing more than two-thirds of the trunk circumference) by the Contractor. The Contractor must minimize damage to residual trees.
- Damaged gates, fences, structures or signs will be repaired or replaced by the Contractor, at the discretion of the Contract Administrator or Pingree staff.
- Smoking will only be allowed in vehicles. Each vehicle must have a properly serviced Class A, 2.5 pound fire extinguisher and a minimum of one fire tool per cutting crew member.
- Neither trash nor litter will be left by the Contractor anywhere on the Pingree Park campus, along
 access routes, or in the project vicinity. Daily hauling of any trash generated by the Contractor is
 the Contractor's responsibility.
- It is the responsibility of the Contractor to follow all rules and regulations established for Pingree Park. No dogs will be allowed on the site. Camping is available approximately ½ mile down the road on USFS land (Tom Bennett Campground). Contractor may also purchase meal tickets from Pingree Park and eat at the campus dining hall for meals.
- The project site should be left in a safe manner at the end of every work day including no hung trees, safe storage of fuel containers and equipment parked off of main access roads.

- No rootballs should be created by the contractor, however, any exposed rootballs created during this project will be tipped back into an upright position by Contractor.
- The Contract Administrator may suspend or limit operations if excess damage is occurring due to mud, snow, extreme fire danger, etc., or due to the following situation(s): failure to meet contract specifications.
- Improvements and Roads:
 - a. Roads must remain passable at all times. All large woody debris or other materials deposited on access roads shall be removed immediately. Any significant accumulations of slash or material shall be removed on a daily basis.
 - Roads shall be maintained to prevent erosion throughout the term of the project.
 - c. At the end of the project and prior to the final acceptance by the Contract Administrator, roads will be repaired to the same condition as found prior to the start of work.

Plan of Operations:

The Contractor shall prepare a *Plan of Operations* for the Contract Administrator prior to the start of any work. Upon completion and approval by the Contract Administrator, this *Plan of Operations* shall be attached hereto and incorporated herein, the same as if set forth in full. Contractor shall not commence any work until the *Plan of Operations* has been approved. Among other things, the plan shall describe projected start and end dates for the project, the order of work among the various blocks, projected times to complete each block, etc.

Administration:

- At the time of signing a written Operational Plan shall be agreed to between the Contractor and the Contract Administrator. Work must be started within 21 working days of the date agreed upon in the Operational Plan, except as may be approved by the Contract Administrator. For each day past this 21day window, the Contractor may be assessed a \$250 fine.
- Contractor shall notify the Contract Administrator prior to moving any equipment into the project area and also prior to the start of work. No work will begin without the presence of the Contract Administrator.
- The use of sub-contractors must be approved in writing by CSFS prior to contract signing and bid approval.
- Restrictions: The Contract Administrator may suspend or limit operations in cases of extreme fire danger, excessive soil rutting, excessive or potential damage due to muddy or snowy conditions, excessive residual tree damage, road damage, or failure to meet contract specifications.

Damage Penalty:

The Contractor shall conduct all operations in a timely manner and in accordance with the Plan of Operations, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, the same as if set forth in full, and shall take all necessary precautions to protect the remaining forest stand, soils, and any improvements. Excessive damage to the remaining forest stand (broken tops caused by felling operations, etc.), or the removal of undesignated products will be paid for at the rate of \$50.00. All damaged trees may be designated for removal by the Contract Administrator. Penalties may also be assessed for damages to soils, structures, power lines, and other improvements on the Pingree Park campus. Determination of damage is at the sole discretion of the Contract Administrator.

Performance Bond and Damage Deposit:

A performance bond in the amount of 50% of the Project Value or \$5,000.00, whichever is greater, shall be deposited by the Contractor upon signing of this agreement. The bond shall be in the form of cash, certified check or a certified bond from a qualified bonding company. The performance bond shall be used, in part or in full for non-performance of any of the terms or conditions of this Independent Services Contract and/or to correct deficiency in any work not completed to agreement specifications. The bond may be used to cover expenses incurred by the Colorado State Forest Service to complete contract obligations, including re-bidding the entire project if necessary.

A Damage Deposit in the amount of \$1,000 shall be deposited by the Contractor upon signing of this contract. The deposit shall be in the form of cash or certified check. Any damage penalties and charges for damages to soils, improvements or other elements of the forest stand not repaired or corrected by the Contractor shall be deducted from the Damage Deposit. If at any time during the performance of this agreement the Damage Deposit balance falls below \$500.00, it shall be brought back to the original full amount through additional payments by Contractor.

Any remaining deposit balances will be released to Contractor promptly upon satisfactory completion of this agreement.

1. WHAT? Practice, with components, to meet objectives:

Patch-cuts will be utilized around campus buildings and cabins in order to create defensible space and a surrounding fuelbreak, but also to remove mountain pine beetle infested trees and susceptible trees. Efforts will focus on areas within 300 feet of roads and structures where dead trees may pose as hazards. Materials will be removed and chipped. Slash will be chipped within 100 feet of structures not to exceed a depth of 3 inches. Further away from structures slash may be chipped, lopped and scattered or piled for burning at the discretion of the Pingree Park Campus Director and CSFS.

Guidelines, specifications for getting the practice done (Use additional pages or other format if needed for practice specifications, or technical standards required):

2. WHO? Who will do the work?

Grant funds will be used to hire a contractor to assist in cutting, chipping, and utilizing materials from patch-cut activities. In-kind contributions from volunteers and CSFS will include cutting trees, and processing slash and firewood. Firewood will be removed for sale by the CSU student SAF chapter. NR 220 students are expected to utilize a donated portable sawmill to mill logs created from the project and learn about forestry practices and create viable wood products.

3. HOW? How will the work be accomplished (equipment, by hand)?

Due to the proximity of buildings, the work will be accomplished by hand with the use of chainsaws, chippers, a portable sawmill, and possible use of ATVs.

How will you maintain the practice?

The Colorado State Forest Service will continue to work closely with the Pingree Park director and assist with annual maintenance and expansion of project activities. Top priorities for the future will be maintaining defensible space and open fuelbreak qualities around structures and roads.

4. WHEN? When will the work be accomplished?

Work will be accomplished during the grant period and will be complete prior to September 30, 2009.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION, ISSUES:

A current mountain pine beetle infestation is spreading throughout the mature lodgepole pine trees on the Pingree Park campus. Most dead, dying and susceptible mature trees are in close proximity to buildings, trails, and other locations where visitors and park staff will be frequently during the summer season. The intent of this grant is to reduce risks associated with the insect outbreak and increase forest health on the campus.

There is a variety of vegetative cover on the property (see attached draft forest management plan). This project will focus on the mature lodgepole pine stands around the buildings and trails of the main part of campus (see attached application and map).

Approximately 5,200 people visit and stay at Pingree each season with an additional 3,000-5,000 coming up for day trips and hikes. On any given day in the summer season there are usually about 140 people on the campus. There is also a ropes course with an estimated value of \$150,000 and approximately 70 buildings.

This project will be done to protect the campus visitors and staff. Work will be coordinated with the Pingree Park director to minimize impacts on campus visitors and recreation activities.
