

# **BIOGRAPHY**

**Dr. Joshua May**, tenor, is an Assistant Professor of Voice and Opera Director at the Schwob School of Music at Columbus State University. He enjoys a diverse career as a professional tenor, stage director, and educator. He has performed over thirty diverse operatic roles and concertized an array of vocal works across the USA, Canada, and Europe. He performed such recent operatic roles as Tamino in Mozart's *Die Zauberflöte*, Male Chorus in Britten's *Rape of Lucretia*, Rinuccio in *Gianni Schicchi*, and Ferrando in Mozart's *Cosi fan tutte*. He is an avid recitalist and oratorio singer, performing recently as a soloist in Bach's *Magnificat*, Mozart's *Requiem*, Handel's *Messiah*, and Dubois's *Seven Last Words of Christ*. He holds a doctoral degree in voice performance from the University of Connecticut (D.M.A.) and master's degrees in vocal performance and vocal pedagogy from the New England Conservatory of Music. Chris Crans began his conducting career in Mannheim, Germany, at the Nationaltheater, where he was invited to assist General Music Director, Dan Ettinger and conduct the historic Mannheimer Orchester. During his six years there he led over 80 performances ranging from *My Fair Lady* to *Die Zauberflöte*, from Prokofiev's *The Love of Three Oranges* to Puccini's *La boheme*. At this famously busy opera house, Chris had the opportunity to coach and rehearse over 30 operas per season and collaborate with such renowned artists as Jonas Kauffman, Krassimira Stoyanova, Michelle Crider, Olga Peretyatko, Lise Lindstrom, Maria Guleghina, José Cura, Erwin Schrott and Peter Seifert.

Chris became the voice teacher for many of the soloists at the Nationaltheater and started a private vocal studio in Berlin, attracting students from both America and Europe. His students sing at leading opera houses of the world, including La Scala, Paris Opera, Zurich, Geneva, Berlin, Vienna, Mannheim, Covent Garden, and the Met.

As a pianist, Mr. Crans has been heard accompanying Metropolitan Opera soprano, Jennifer Welch-Babidge at Carnegie Hall and in various concerts and recitals throughout the United States, Israel, Germany, Mexico, Denmark, Russia and the Baltic States.

His upcoming engagements include conducting rehearsals for the new production of *Manon (Massenet)* at the Paris Opera, and assistant conductor of a new production of *Aida (Verdi)* at the Castell Peralada Festival, Spain, starring Piotr Beczala, Sondra Radvanovsky, and Anita Rachvelishvili.
