In addition to working at the reference desk, Naomi will be developing both traditional and electronic library instruction materials for under-

She will also provide support for the needs of special groups such as non-traditional students, disabled students, and diversity students.

In addition, she has taught as an adjunct professor at the Graduate School of Library and Information Science at the University of Arizona.

SAGE: Libraries' New On-line Catalog

The world of information is changing and so is the Libraries' online catalog. We are introducing SAGE, a system which combines the best features of an online catalog with access to whole new vistas of information.

With SAGE, author, title, keyword and subject searches to locate materials held in the Libraries are only a keystroke away – response time is instantaneous. A new feature allows exclusive searching for journals and magazines. The limit feature can narrow searches by a number of options including date, subject heading, keyword and name. Search results can be sent to an attached printer, downloaded to disk or sent to a personal e-mail address.

SAGE offers gateways to other information resources. The databases menu provides access to electronic indexes such as MEDLINE, PsycINFO, ERIC, UnCover, Magazine Index, WorldCat and many more. Gateways are available for making an interlibrary loan request and for searching reserve lists for courses. Another choice provides easy access to other library catalogs.

Access to SAGE is available at numerous terminals in Morgan Library. Remote access is available by modem at (970) 491-2222 or direct telnet to **sage.colostate.edu**. SAGE is available as well via the Libraries' HomePage at http://www.colostate.edu/Depts/LTS/libhome.html.

Interlibrary Loan is now located in room 108 just east of the new entrance on first floor.


The **reference desks** and **reference collections** have moved to a temporary location in the west wing, first floor. Reference Service for Social Sciences/Humanities/Business, Sciences/Technology, and Government Documents is provided from a single desk staffed with experts from all three areas.

The **electronic information area** and **assistance desk** have also moved to the west wing just north of the new reference area. This move brings together SAGE terminals and electronic databases, including the CD-ROMs and GIS/Mapping databases that were formerly located on the second floor.

Colorado State Librarian Wins Literary Award



Douglas Ernest was presented with the 1996 Colorado Library Association Literary Award at CLA's annual conference in Denver on August 15, 1996. Doug is a Social Sciences/Humanities Librarian at Colorado State University. His publication Agricultural Frontier to Electronic Frontier, is a history of Colorado State University Libraries. The nominator, Joel Rustein, states this work is a "lively, informative account of how institutions adapt in times of change, and this is more than just a library history. Further, Mr. Ernest's background in history serves us well, as his

research into primary and secondary sources reveal thorough scholarship."
