



With more than 150 programs of study and 78 undergraduate degree programs in eight colleges – and a faculty-to-student ratio of 16.5:1 – students have access to a wealth of educational possibilities. Colorado State leads the world in disciplines such as human and animal health, clean energy and the environment, global and sustainable business, engineering, and climate research. Along with outstanding programs in the liberal and performing arts, humanities and social sciences, Colorado State offers some of the top professional programs in the country in construction management, occupational therapy, psychology, communications, and agriculture—and is home to the top-ranked public business school in the state.

Challenging academic programs and world-changing research are hallmarks of Colorado State, and it is our special commitment to service, outreach, and transforming our world through innovation that sets this university apart. Even more important, CSU's character is reflected in the quality of our students and graduates, who embody the university's mission of service and go on to make a significant impact on our world when they graduate.

### World-Class Academics



olorado State University takes very seriously its role in educating studentathletes. Excellence is expected on the field and in the classroom.

The most recent NCAA academic statistics reveal that Colorado State leads the Mountain West Conference in graduation rate for student-athletes at 66 percent – well ahead of the conference's overall student-athlete graduation rate of 57 percent. In football, Colorado State is second in the MWC, graduating 68 percent of its student-athletes – again, well ahead of the conference average of 49 percent.

Colorado State, however, is not resting on its reputation for graduating its studentathletes. The state-of-the-art Anderson Academic Center, which will greatly enhance



the academic facilities available for student-athletes, opened in August 2009.

While the athletic department takes its role in the educational process very seriously, Colorado State's mission to provide a world-class education is at the core of academic success. U.S. News and World Report ranked Colorado State in its top tier in its annual "America's Best Colleges" report. The university offers 79 majors and 27 minors, and many of its programs are ranked among the best in the country.

Colorado State continues to push forward in its mission to provide the best possible education. Construction recently was completed on the state-of-the-art University Center for the Arts and Computer Science buildings, along with the indoor practice facility, academic and training center, and the Rockwell Hall expansion at the College of Business.

- CSU's Veterinary Medicine program ranks second in the country and is the national leader in federal research dollars.
- BusinessWeek ranked CSU's undergraduate College of Business program 67th (up
  from 73rd in 2008). The program ranks 30th among all public schools and 14th
  among all colleges and universities in the West and Southwest. The marketing and
  business law programs were ranked in the nation's Top 10 by the magazine.
- In December 2008, CSU conferred its 150,000th bachelor's degree and 200,000th overall degree.
- According to NCAA statistics, CSU's graduation rate for student-athletes is higher than the graduation rate for the overall student body.

ne of Colorado's most vibrant cities, Fort Collins is the best place in the country to live, work and play. Located on the northern Front Range of the majestic Rocky Mountains, the city is within an hour's drive of Denver, the nation's 25th-largest metro area.

This city of 137,200 residents basks in 300 days of sunshine per year — more than San Diego and Florida — and includes the historic Old Town district with its restaurants, shops, and entertainment, all within walking distance of Colorado State University's campus.

Since its founding as a military fort in 1864, Fort Collins has anchored northern Colorado's rich heritage of academic, business and recreational pursuits. Hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, river rafting and rock climbing are just a few popular outdoor pursuits for students and residents.

The city maintains more than 600 acres of parks, 5,000 acres of natural areas, 20 miles of off-street trails for hiking and biking, and three golf courses. The Lincoln Center and the University Center for the Arts, anchored in Fort Collins, are northern Colorado's cultural arts centers.



# The Mile High City



he Denver Metro Area, with a population of 2.4 million, is less than an hour's drive from Fort Collins. A major-league metropolis, named by the *Sporting News* the best sports city in the United States, Denver is home to three teams that have competed for their respective world championships in the past 12 years — the Super Bowl XXXII and XXXIII champion Denver Broncos, the 1996 and 2001 Stanley Cup champion Colorado Avalanche, and the 2007 National League champion Colorado Rockies, who lost the World Series that season to the Boston Red Sox. The Denver Nuggets, meanwhile, have mad the playoffs in XX consecutive seasons, including a trip to the 2009 Western Conference finals against the evential champion Los Angeles Lakers.

Sports fans in Colorado are among the most passionate in the nation, and for good reason — their teams are winners.


Denver has all the features of any big city, including great shopping and nightlife on the 16th Street Mall (Denver Pavilions, below left), a one-of-a-kind concert venue in Red Rocks Amphitheatre (below, second from right), an adrenaline-inducing amusement park in Elitch Gardens, and the world's 10th-busiest airport, Denver International. Nicknamed the Mile High City because it is one mile above sea level, downtown Denver is home to the Colorado state capitol building, the 13th step of which is exactly one mile in elevation.





#### **Home-Court Advantage**

oby Arena is one of the most distinctive and effective homecourt playing facilities in the nation. Colorado State boasted a 15-3 mark at Moby Arena in 2009

Since Tom Hilbert's arrival in Fort Collins in 1997, the Rams have hosted 33 nationally ranked opponents, coming away with victories in 23 of those contests. CSU's NCAA tournament victory last season over No. 6 Washington (above) marked the Rams' fifth consective home victory over a ranked opponent, dating back to a 3-0 victory over No. 13 Ohio State on Aug. 30, 2007. During that stretch, the Rams have also hosted and beaten opponents from Florida (No. 8 on Sept. 13, 2008), BYU (No. 24 on Sept. 20, 2008), Arizona (No. 25 on Oct. 4, 2008), and Washington (No. 6 on Dec. 4, 2009).


#### Bigger, Faster, Stronger



The Colorado State women's volleyball program has become synonymous with consistent winning under the guidance and tutelage of Head Coach Tom Hilbert, who enters his 14th season with the Rams and his 22nd overall as a collegiate coach in 2010.

With seven Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year awards to his credit, in the league's 11-year existence, it is clear why Hilbert's program has risen to the top of the MWC and become a stalwart on the national stage as a perennial Top-25 program.

Under Hilbert, who was inducted in the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame as the Hall of Honor recipient in 2006, the Rams have developed into one of the top programs in the nation, qualifying for the NCAA tournament for 15 consecutive years. The streak is a school record for consecutive postseason appearances in any sport.

A deeper look inside Hilbert's coaching record reveals some remarkable achievements. Hilbert has amassed a 164-28 record in Mountain West Conference play and has led the Rams to seven regular-season conference titles.

He ranks 11th among active Division I head coaches in winning percentage (.763). In 2009, Hilbert eclipsed the 500-win mark for his career, becoming one of 29 active head coaches with as many victories. At the time, Hilbert also ranked as one of just two on that list with

### **Hilbert's Coaching Philosophy**

Like life in general, athletic development is a growth process, not a means to an end. To get the most out of life one should continuously set and re-evaluate performance goals in all areas; athletics, academics, career, etc. Through athletics young people learn how to set long- and short-term goals and build self-esteem through achievement of those goals.

I believe in a democratic style of team management. Teams should set their own goals, make their own rules and make major team decisions. Peer influence is much more effective than authoritarian influence. When an athlete takes part in successful team building, it is a very rewarding and educational experience.

In practice and in competition volleyball is a game of emotion and intensity so it is important to train with emotion and intensity. We combine high-repetition teaching drills with intense competitive game drills. Colorado State players learn to embrace competition and mental toughness. When the game is on the line, I want players who have looked pressure in the eyes and conquered it.

College coaches have an awesome responsibility in guiding young people through such an important segment of life. It is a time of emotional, intellectual and physical growth. We must take this responsibility seriously. When an athlete leaves a program under my direction, I want her to look back on her college athletic experience as one of the most rewarding times of her life.

fewer than 22 years of head coaching experience. That accomplishment came just more than one year after Hilbert distinguished himself as the winningest coach in CSU annals, surpassing the 300-win mark as a Ram and moving ahead of Rich Feller, who won 299 matches from 1983-96.

Hilbert has coached five different players to AVCA All-America honors, and one to *Volleyball Magazine* All-America.

While at CSU, Hilbert has an overall record of 332-85 (.799), and is 506-157 (.763) overall in 21 seasons as a head coach. He has led his teams to 20 or more wins every season since 1992 – a span of 18 straight years – with the 1999 Rams setting the school's single-season record for winning percentage after going 30-3 (.909).

Before coming to Colorado State, Hilbert led Idaho to the Eastern Division title in 1996 (its first season in the Big West), and in the Big Sky Conference his teams won either the regular season or the tournament championship from 1992-95.

Hilbert accumulated a 174-72 (.707) record at Idaho. He coached the Big Sky's only All-American in Mindy Rice. Hilbert also guided Idaho to its first national ranking and the Vandals were the first Big Sky institution to ever be nationally ranked.

Prior to Idaho, Hilbert spent five seasons as an assistant at his alma mater, the University of Oklahoma, from 1984-88.

A native of Norman, Okla., Hilbert earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing from OU in 1984. He also received a master's in sports and recreation management from Idaho in 1993.

Hilbert has resided in Fort Collins for 14 years and has a daughter, Myles, who will be 10 in September.





Jesse Mahoney enters his sixth season with the Rams and his third as associate head coach. Mahoney serves as the recruiting coordinator in addition to working with the blocking schemes and middle blockers.

Since his arrival in Fort Collins, Mahoney has put together three recruiting classes ranked in the top-25 in the country by PrepVolleyball.com. The 2007 class was ranked 14th in the country, while the 2008 squad stacked up as the No. 22 class in the nation. The 2010 freshman class steps on campus this year as the No. 15-ranked group.

Mahoney's coaching presence has also been felt on the court as he has turned CSU into one of the top blocking teams in the country. Since his arrival in Fort Collins, CSU middle blockers like Dre Downs (all-conference and all-region in 2005, her first at the position), Mekana Barnes (three-time all-MWC, 2007 Mountain West Player of the Year, 2007 third-team All-American), and more recently, Tessa Nelson (2009 MWC Preseason Player of the Year, 2009 NCAA all-tournament team at Minneapolis Regional, two-time All-MWC selection) and Megan Plourde (2009 AVCA all-West region selection, 2009 all-MWC), have thrived under Mahoney's watch and established themselves as some of the top players in country at the position.

Since 2005, the Rams have ranked nationally in the top-25 in terms of blocking four times, ranking fourth in 2008, fifth in 2007, ninth in 2005 and 22nd in 2009. CSU has ranked consistently first or second in the Mountain West since Mahoney's arrival.

Mahoney came to Colorado State from Fort Hays State, where he was the head coach from 1999-2004. While at Fort Hays State. Mahoney tallied a record of 107-82, including a mark of 56-12 in

both 2003 and 2004. His Lady Tigers went 31-5 in 2004 as they posted the best record in NCAA Division II competition and finished the season ranked 11th nationally. Mahoney led Fort Hays State to its first regional tournament berth in 2003 and then led the squad to the regional finals in 2004. Fort Hays State participated in four consecutive Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) tournaments under Mahoney's guidance.

At Fort Hays State, Mahoney coached the only three All-Americans in school history, Ashley Holt, Kelly Skidmore and Amber Zoglman.

Prior to Fort Hays State, he was the assistant coach at Colorado Christian in 1998, helping lead the Cougars to a tie for first place in the RMAC East Division (17-2 record).

Mahoney was the head coach of the University of Colorado men's club team for two years and was an assistant with the team the year prior to that. He also helped coach the 18-under Front Range Volleyball Club team that captured the USA Junior Rocky Mountain Region championship.

Prior to coaching, Mahoney spent four seasons as the starting setter on the CU men's club team. He earned all-tournament honors in 1993 after leading the team to the NIRSA collegiate club national championship.

A native of Boulder, Colo., he received a bachelor's degree in psychology from CU in 1995 and a Juris Doctorate degree at the University of Colorado School of Law in 1999. He is married to the former Gwen McEntyre and the couple has three children: Macy James (4), Griffin Mack (3) and Declan Thomas, who will turn 1 in September.

Director of Athletics | Fifth Year at CSU | Kent State; '80, '86

Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk has placed Colorado State's program on an ambitious path toward national prominence with his insightful and visionary leadership.

Kowalczyk is in his fifth year leading CSU's program, demonstrating an unmistakable commitment to the university after signing in 2010 a five-year contract extension, through 2015. From the moment he arrived on campus in 2006, he has shown a leadership style that is steady and consistent with ambitious goals clearly established. Under his watchful eye, a foundation has been built to cultivate long-term success throughout the program. With the foundation firmly in place, Colorado State's program stands on the threshold of taking a bold step forward nationally to reach "stretch goals" established by the Board of Governors when Kowalczyk arrived.

Perhaps nothing better illustrates the progress toward prominence that CSU's program has made during Kowalczyk's tenure than the changing skyline surrounding Moby Arena and the McGraw Athletic Center, both of which serve as centerpieces of the athletics department.

During the summer of 2009, CSU opened two state-of-the-art athletics facilities that are visually prominent to any avid Rams fan upon arriving on campus.

A training facility includes an indoor football practice field plus basketball and volleyball practice courts, adjacent to Moby Arena. Also, a new academic and strength and conditioning center is next to the McGraw Athletic Center.

Over the last year-plus, Kowalczyk also has stewarded significant upgrades to Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium, including a \$2.5 million landscaping initiative following the 2010 season that will make the venue's grounds at the base of the Rocky Mountain foothills even more attractive. Additionally in the last two years, Kowalczyk oversaw improvements to several CSU team locker rooms, and this fall, has spearheaded a \$1 million project that will furnish Moby Arena with new state-of-the-art video boards.

The two new facilities, along with upgrades to CSU's stadium, arena and McGraw Athletic Center offices, make CSU's resources among the finest in the nation. Those additions and improvements also have made CSU competitive nationally while enhancing the institution's image across a broad spectrum. The facilities represent one of Kowalczyk's primary goals when he was appointed to his position at CSU. Almost immediately upon his arrival, he worked closely with campus leaders to develop the facilities initiative.

"These buildings show that Colorado State is unmistakably serious about achieving its stretch goals," Kowal-czyk said. "Combined with the recent renovations at our football stadium, this puts us where we need to be in terms of offering quality, state-of-the-art facilities for our coaches and student-athletes, those who are here now and those who are thinking about coming here."

The facilities, along with recent contracts he negotiated with Russell Athletic (apparel and uniforms), Under Armour (footwear), and a deal with the University of Colorado to keep the Rocky Mountain Showdown at Invesco Field for the long-term future, also reflect Kowalczyk's commitment to excellence throughout the program.

"Average is simply not good enough," he said. "We must continually find ways to improve every aspect of our program while meeting the needs of our student-athletes and providing resources for our coaches -- not just to compete, but to win, and do it while serving the university, the community and the region."

Soon after Kowalczyk's arrival in Fort Collins, he worked closely with the Board of Governors of the Colorado State University System and the university leadership to set in place a set of "stretch goals." "The support of the board and campus administration, which was there every step of the way, was critical," Kowalczyk said. "We have leadership on this campus that not only recognizes the importance of investing in athletics, but also what a successful athletics department can do for the university."

Colorado State's stretch goals include:

- Achieve a No. 1 ranking in the Director's Cup, a ranking system that reflects overall program success;
- •Annual Bowl Championship Series inclusion;
- •NCAA men's and women's basketball tournament participation. While the entire program under Kowalczyk's guidance has moved forward with the completion of the facilities, he readily admits there are more challenges that lie ahead.

"We will never stand still. We will continue to move forward. As a program, we will strive for excellence in every area, just as we challenge our student-athletes in competition and in the classroom.

"Our efforts will always include continually and diligently working to expand our ticket and Ram Club donor base as a means to generate additional revenue and scholarship fund support."

Colorado State's expected emergence nationally has provided followers of the program optimism and excitement.

Kowalczyk brought a wealth of experience and knowledge to Fort Collins when he was named the school's 16th Director of Athletics on April 11, 2006, after having served for six successful years in the same capacity at Southern Illinois University.

In the spring of 2008, he was named to the prestigious NCAA Division I Leadership Council, an advisory body to the Division I Board of Directors. The council identifies issues important to the future of Division I and offers its expertise in defining appropriate action items. Reappointed in June 2010, his current term expires in 2014.

Kowalczyk also remains involved in NCAA, NACDA and MWC activities.

During his tenure at SIU, he led the Salukis' emergence into a successful, nationally renowned athletics program, including 15 conference championships in seven sport programs.

Before his tenures at CSU and SIU, he was senior administrator at Northwestern University during a time in which the Wildcats program enjoyed national success. He also served as assistant athletics director for business operations at Kansas State, business manager for athletics at Portland State, and assistant to the associate athletics director at Kent State.

Kowalczyk holds a master's degree in sports administration and a bachelor's of business administration in accounting from Kent State University

A native of Warren Ohio, Kowalczyk was inducted into the Warren High School Distinguished Hall of Fame. The award recognizes and honors individuals for their achievements and performance. In 2004, he received the National Football Foundation's Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding A.D. Award, and in 2006 was named the Athletic Director of the Year for the Division I-AA Central Division. Kowalczyk in 2010 concluded a four-year term on the NACDA Executive Council, representing District 7.







### 2010 Season Preview



or the Colorado State volleyball program, the 2010 season appears to be shaping up just as each of the previous 13 under Head Coach Tom Hilbert has.
Colorado State returns five starters and 10 letterwinners from a squad that went 25-6 (15-1 MWC), won the Mountain West Conference title, ranked No. 17 in the final top 25 poll, and appeared in the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2009.

Add to that a recruiting class ranked No. 15 nationally by PrepVolleyball.com, and you have a team poised for big things in 2010.


Colorado State returns a decorated roster, including three players - Danielle Minch, Megan Plourde and Evan Sanders - who earned all-Mountain West honors in 2009. Minch, a senior outside hitter, was named the 2009 MWC Player of the Year. Hilbert is coming off of his seventh MWC Coach of the Year award.

Minch, who was also honored as the preseason favorite to repeat as conference Player of the Year, and Plourde are coming off of breakout seasons in which each was named to the AVCA all-West region and honorable mention All-America teams. Sanders has been recognized as the MWC's preseason Setter of the Year after spending the summer of 2010 training with the USA A2 National Team.












Jacque Davisson remains the Rams' emotional leader on the court. A fiery outside hitter with talent to match her enthusiasm, she will be in the hunt for her first all-MWC nod as a senior in 2010.

But perhaps it is senior Audrey Hemmings who will have to fill one of the biggest voids for the Rams. The defensive specialist from Greeley, Colo., will open the season as the starting libero, filling in for departed senior Katelin Batten, the program's all-time leader in digs, to help anchor the Rams' defensive efforts.

Fellow defensive specialist Emily Koenning, who is often called upon to serve for the Rams in tight instances, will look to help her classmates Minch, Davisson and Hemmings lead the Rams back to the postseason in 2010.

Katelyn Steffan looks to return to her 2008 form, after a switch of positions in 2010. The junior from Dickinson, N.D., spent most of 2009 as an opposite hitter for the Rams, missing some time early in the year because of a foot injury. This year she is expected to compete for playing time at both outside hitter and middle blocker.

Additionally, sophomores Dana Cranston, Izzy Gaulia, and Brieon Paige return after making major contributions as sophomores in 2009. Redshirt freshmen Tori Brummett and Michelle Smith are also back and ready to compete on the court.



In addition to the Rams' returning lineup, CSU welcomes one of the top recruiting classes in the nation to Moby Arena. The 2010 freshman class was ranked 15th nationally by PrepVolleyball.com, the highest ranking among Mountain West Conference schools. It marks the fifth time since 2005 that the Rams appeared on the list.

According to PrepVolleyball.com, the Rams' incoming class of Deedra Foss, Marlee Reynolds, Katie Rutherford and Kelsey Snider, will rank as one of the most physical classes recruited by Hilbert and his staff. In addition, the Rams have also added sophomore middle blocker Sam Peters, a product of Englewood, Colo., who transferred to CSU after spending her freshman season at Santa Clara University.

Recognized as one of the most consistent programs in the country over the past 15 seasons, CSU enters this season in search of its 16th consecutive campaign with 20-plus wins and an appearance in the NCAA tournament.

In order to continue their streak of postseason play, however, the Rams will once again have to contend with a challenging schedule that features at least nine matches against six teams - Florida, Long Beach State, Duke, Utah, New Mexico and San Diego State - ranked or receiving votes in the AVCA preseason top 25.

The Mountain West has claimed the 2009-10 Bawl Challenge Cup for the third time in six years after sending five football teams into postseason action and finishing with a 4-1 mark. For the third time in five seasons the Mountain West sent a team to a BCS Bowl game.





TCU finished the 2010 season with a 54-14 record, advancing to the College World Series semi-finals. In 2009, the MWC sent three teams - TCU, San Diego State and Utah - to the NCAA Baseball Championship for the first time in league history, as well as had the #1 pick in the Major League Baseball draft - Stephen Strasburg.



Colorado State, New Mexico and TCU were selected to the NCAA Women's Volleyball Champtonships, marking the eighth year the MWC has had at least three teams in the tournament. CSU won the league title for the third time in four years and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.



### 2009 Review

■he Colorado State volleyball program entered the 2009 season with a sense that the team was on the cusp of doing something great. The Rams returned four players with at least one season of starting experience, led by seniors Tessa Nelson. the preseason MWC co-Player of the Year, and Katelin Batten, widely regarded as one of the nation's top defensive players. Nelson and Batten provided the veteran leadership, while a host of up-and-coming Rams had breakout seasons to help guide CSU to one of the most successful campaigns in the history of an already storied program.

The latest chapter, however, began with some adversity. The team opened the season suffering a pair of setbacks to Pepperdine which snapped a 28-match home win streak - and Oregon State. Sitting at 4-3 following a loss at Duke, something clicked for the Rams. The team went on to win 12 consecutive matches, and 19 of the final 21 contests of the regular season.

The Rams rolled to a 15-1 mark against Mountain West Conference foes, earning the program's seventh MWC regular-season title, and entered the 2009 NCAA tournament looking to make some noise on a national level. And there was plenty of noise in the Rams' postseason run, much of which was fueled by the Moby faithful during thrilling home victories in the first and second rounds.

The Rams defeated a strong Middle Tennessee State program, 3-2, to advance to the second round against the No. 6-seeded and sixth-ranked Washington Huskies, setting the stage for CSU to take down a program just a few years removed from a national championship. And with nearly 3,000 screaming fans firmly behind them, the Rams dispatched the Huskies, 3-2, thanks to strong

performances from their 1-2 punch at outside hitter, Danielle Minch and Jacque Davisson. The win avenged postseason losses to UW in 2002, 2005 and 2006, and earned CSU a trip to the NCAA regional semifinals, where they fell in the Sweet 16 to host, and No. 11-seeded, Minnesota.

The Rams closed the season with an overall record of 25-6, peaking at No. 17 when the final AVCA national rankings were released.

Minch was recognized as the Mountain West Conference Player of the Year, one of five Rams to earn all-MWC honors. Batten was tabbed as the conference's top libero, while Nelson, sophomore setter Evan Sanders and redshirt freshman middle blocker Megan Plourde were selected to the all-MWC team.

Hilbert, who earned his 500th career victory with a win over Air Force, was selected as the MWC Coach of the Year for the seventh time.

Minch, Batten and Plourde received further recognition from the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA), earning spots on the all-West region team, and honorable mention All-America nods. Nelson was distinguished as a member of the NCAA tournament all-Minneapolis region squad.

# Mountain West Conference 2009 Champions

25-6 Overall, 15-1 MWC

After opening the season 4-3, the CSU volleyball team hit its stride in early September, winning 19 of 21 matches to close out the regular season. The team rolled to a 15-1 mark in Mountain West action, claiming the program's seventh MWC regular-season championship. Junior Danielle Minch was named MWC Player of the Year, while senior Katelin Batten was tabbed the MWC's top libero. Senior Tessa Nelson, sophomore Evan Sanders and freshman Megan Plourde each garnered all-MWC honors. Head Coach Tom Hilbert was named MWC Coach of the Year.

# Champions on the court

Over the years, Colorado State University athletic programs have captured multiple conference championships and Colorado State volleyball has led the way with 14 conference titles to the program's credit.

The Rams have won or shared 11 Mountain West Conference regular-season and tournament championships in the league's 11-year existence. CSU also boasts titles from both the Western Athletic Conference and the High Country Athletic Conference.



# Mountain West Conference 2007 Champions 23-8 Overall, 13-3 MWC

The 2007 season saw the Rams earn their sixth MWC regular-season championship since 2000. Junior middle blocker Mekana Barnes was named the MWC Player of the Year while junior setter Ashley Fornstorm earned all-conference honors as the Setter of the Year. Tonya Mokelki and Jaime Strauss also earned all-conference honors. The Rams went a perfect 14-0 at home including a perfect in MWC play.

# Mountain West Conference 2006 Tournament Champions 20-10 Overall, 11-5 MWC

The Rams captured their fourth tournament title in eight years as they upset No. 9 Utah in the championship match. In dramatic fashion, the Rams topped the Utes in five games. CSU trailed 20-11 in Game 3 and faced one match point before winning the third game 34-32 and then rolling to the title. Sophomore outside hitter Jaime Strauss was anmed the MVP of the tournament.





# Mountain West Conference 2004 Co-Champions, Tournament Champions 21-9 Overall, 13-1 MWC

In 2004, Colorado State won at least a share of the Mountain West regular-season title for a fifth straight season. CSU won its first five conference matches before falling to No. 18 Utah in four games in Moby. The Rams then rallied to win their final eight league matches, including a three-game sweep over the No. 17 Utes in Salt Lake in front of a national television audience (CSTV). Colorado State went on to become the first host school in league history to win the Mountain West tournament, winning its second straight automatic berth to the NCAA Championship.



# Mountain West Conference 2003 Champions, Tournament Champions 30-5 Overall, 14-0 MWC

Colorado State became the first team in Mountain West Conference history to go through the regular season undefeated, and then became the first team to ever win both the regular-season and tournament crowns in the same year, winning three matches at San Diego State. Nine of the 14 regular-season matches were three-game sweeps for the Rams, including six straight.

# Mountain West Conference 2002 Champions 22-10 Overall, 12-2 MWC

2002 was considered by many to be a rebuilding year, but CSU again proved to be the dominant team in the league, posting a 12-2 record for its third consecutive title. The Rams won their first four matches, then fell in five games to BYU in Moby. Winning their next three matches in four games each, the Rams headed to San Diego State, where they were swept for the first time in 27 league matches -- a feat that had only happened three times in the existence of the Mountain West. CSU rebounded, however, to win its final four matches and again bring home the title.



# Mountain West Conference 2001 Champions

29-4 Overall, 13-1 MWC

Probably the most dominant team in Mountain West history, the 2001 Rams posted a 13-1 record and won their first 11 matches -- all in three -game sweeps -- before falling in five games at Utah. They then went on to win the final three matches, again in three-game sweeps. That year, the Rams won 37 straight games, second longest in school history to the 40 straight by the 2000 squad.





# Mountain West Conference 2000 Champions

32-5 Overall, 13-1 MWC

The 2000 team started a streak of five straight regular-season titles, posting a 13-1 record with the only blemish being a three-game setback at BYU. The Rams started the conference season with eight three-game sweeps before losing to the Cougars. The Rams then defeated New Mexico in four, swept Air Force, defeated San Diego State in five and swept UNLV to win the title. In the tournament, BYU defeated the Rams in the championship match in Moby, snapping a record 44-match home winning streak.




# Mountain West Conference 1999 Tournament Champions 30-3 Overall, 13-3 MWC

The Rams began their dominance in the newly created Mountain West Conference. After a 12-2 mark in the inaugural season of MWC play, the Rams dominated the postseason tournament to lock up an NCAA tournament berth. Five players earned all-conference recognition, led by tournament MVP Catie Vagneur.

# Western Athletic Conference 1998 Mountain Division Champions 24-8 Overall, 12-2 WAC

Colorado State won its first conference title in 13 seasons winning the Mountain Division of the WAC in its final year in that conference. The Rams posted a 12-2 record, dropping only decisions at Rice and at UNLV. CSU won its first seven matches before losing in Houston, then tallied four straight three-game sweeps and a five-game thriller against Wyoming before losing in four to the Rebels. The Rams won their final match to enter the WAC tournament as the No. 1 seed in the Mountain Division.




# High Country Athletic Conference 1985 Champions




1987 HCAC Offensive Player of the Year



### **Practice Guidelines**

 All Colorado State volleyball practices are open to the public and to the media in their entirety unless otherwise noted. All interviews will take place following the conclusion of practice on the Moby Arena floor. Contact Danny Mattie for the exact time and place for each day's practice.

### Student-Athlete Interviews

- Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's volleyball coaching staff and studentathletes must be coordinated through assistant media relations director Danny Mattie.
- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media, by the coaches, studentathletes, or the athletic department. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal e-mail and cell number, but rather to contact Danny Mattie.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of daily practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room. Interviews will not be granted on match days until following the contest.
- Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through Danny Mattie. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewee.

### **Post-match Procedures**

- At the conclusion of every match, Colorado State Coach Tom Hilbert will proceed immediately to the post-match interview in the Coors Family Foundation Auditorium in the McGraw Athletic Center.
- Colorado State student-athletes will join Hilbert in the postgame area and then will be available by request through Danny Mattie.
- No student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the match from Danny Mattie. There are no exceptions



### Broadcast Rights and Restrictions

Colorado State, its opponent and the respective conference designate the broadcast rights for all games. CSU follows the guidelines established by the NCAA Championship Events Committee. Radio and television stations and Internet sites that have not purchased rights shall not carry any broadcast report from the arena on a live basis or any live description, footage of any game action while it is still in progress. No pregame and, or postgame live coverage shall be permitted for two hours before and one-half hour after the sporting event without the express permission of the university. Per NCAA guidelines, stations are limited to three minutes of highlights per news show. Television stations also are prohibited from selling, loaning or giving away footage to any individual or agency for use on any non-sports-news program produced or aired by the station. Matches that are broadcast by television networks may have additional restrictions. Also, per NCAA regulations, footage and photos of athletes with eligibility remaining may NOT be used to commercially promote any product, service or media outlet and may not be sold, loaned to other individuals, agencies for this purpose. Disrespect of credential privileges will result in withdrawal of all future credentials

Zak Gilbert enters his fourth season in Colorado State's athletic department. He officially joined the university on July 2, 2007.

# The Mountain West Conference

### This is the Mountain West

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West Conference has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MWC continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 12th year, the MWC has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West Conference has marked several achievements over its first 11 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in and win two BCS bowl games. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MWC was founded in 1999. The Mountain West also ranks second in No. 1 draft picks in the NFL, NBA and MLB over the last six years with three overall.

The Mountain West Conference is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West Conference boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MWC schools (Air Force, BYU, Colorado State and Utah). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert city of Las Vegas (the fastest growing metropolitan area in the West) and the Pacific Ocean locale of San Diego State. The southwestern flavor of New Mexico complements the western heritage and culture of Fort Worth, Texas, home of the MWC's most recent member. TCU.

### History

The Mountain West Conference was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from the former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Five of the MWC's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (BYU, Utah, New Mexico, Wyoming, Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MWC in 1999. TCU rejoined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. On June 17, 2010, Commissioner Craig Thompson announced the addition of Boise State University to the Mountain West Conference, effective July 1, 2011.

When the MWC officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MWC football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Craig Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three years (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002. Entering the 2011 season, the MWC has five contracted bowl affiliations – the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, San Diego Country Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowl, Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl and New Mexico Bowl.

### Exposure

The Mountain West Conference continues to receive unprecedented national television exposure through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and VERSUS. In 2009-10, 46 football, 94 men's basketball and 34 women's basketball Conference-controlled contests were broadcast nationally.

On Aug. 26, 2004, CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and the Mountain West Conference announced a visionary partnership that revolutionized the college sports landscape. The landmark agreement was the first NCAA Division I football and men's basketball conference-wide deal for CSTV and provided the network exclusive rights to all Conference events, including cable and satellite television coverage, national over-the-air and satellite radio, video-on-demand and online broadcast rights.

In the summer of 2006, the centerpiece of this historic relationship was realized with the launch of The Mtn. – MountainWest Sports Network – the first sports network dedicated to serving a single collegiate athletic conference. Nearly 25,000 hours of MWC programming have aired on The Mtn. since the network's launch on Sept. 1, 2006, and over 260 MWC events are shown live annually through a combination

of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network and VERSUS. CBS College Sports Network is currently in 38 million homes, and available in 89 million nationwide. VERSUS is in 79 million households across the U.S.

### Opportunity

The MWC provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for more than 7,000 student-athletes each year. Over the past 11 years, 34 Mountain West student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 22 student-athletes have been named MWC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Three student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars (Jessica Mellinger, Wyoming and Delavane Diaz and Brittany Morreale. Air Force).


Conference student-athletes are also given a voice regarding pertinent issues within the MWC and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The Mountain West Conference SAAC consists of 19 representatives; two student-athletes from each member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the Conference constituent groups or committees related to the student-athlete experience.

### Achievemen

The MWC has produced 595 All-America selections among its 19 sponsored sports in the last 11 years, including a league-record 53 All-America honorees in 2004-05. A total of 110 MWC student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades in that span, while 34 MWC student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. The MWC has sent at least 30 teams to NCAA postseason events each of the past 11 years. Mountain West teams have captured three NCAA team championships over the last 11 years, with BYU claiming three national titles in women's cross country. Additionally, the MWC has produced 24 NCAA individual national champions in the sports of men's golf, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field.

MWC members have participated in 41 bowl games in 11 years, led by Utah's 9-0 mark in postseason contests. The MWC has earned 50 postseason bids in men's basketball, including 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT Final Four berths. MWC women's basketball has tallied 51 postseason bids, including 29 NCAA bids, five Sweet 16 appearances and one Elite Eight berth since 2000. Wyoming won the MWC's first WNIT championship in 2007 with a win over Wisconsin. In women's volleyball, the MWC has had 31 NCAA bids with eight Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. Women's soccer has earned 23 NCAA bids since 1999, with BYU advancing to the Sweet 16 in 2000 and the Elite Eight in 2003. MWC men's golf has had at least four representatives in each of the last 11 NCAA Golf Regionals, while women's tennis has had at least two teams participate in NCAA Regionals each of the last 10 years.


