Extensive thinning on 20 acres was accomplished. Approximately 275 standing dead trees from mountain pine beetle infestation were dropped, limbed, and resulting slash piled for chipping or burning where not accessible to chipper. Logs were skidded to central location to be hauled to sawmill for lumber. Smaller material and crooked logs were bucked and split, made ready for domestic firewood usage. Some 4 to 5 inch diameter material were set aside to be used for building fences on the land. Standing dead and fallen dead material was removed from drainage areas to prevent excessive ash in event of fire. Conifers were removed from Aspen stands. 90 new trees were planted and watered consisting of five different varieties. All large diameter trees were retained, and small suitable Douglas Fir trees were marked and saved for future Christmas trees. Approximately 80 12 yd.³ piles totaling 960 cubic yards were chipped and spread out on the land. Approximately 30 similar piles (432 cubic yards) were not accessible to the chipper and were burned. (labor for slash pile burning was not included in the labor for this grant) approximately 25 additional piles (300 cubic yards) were generated that will be chipped or burned in the future.

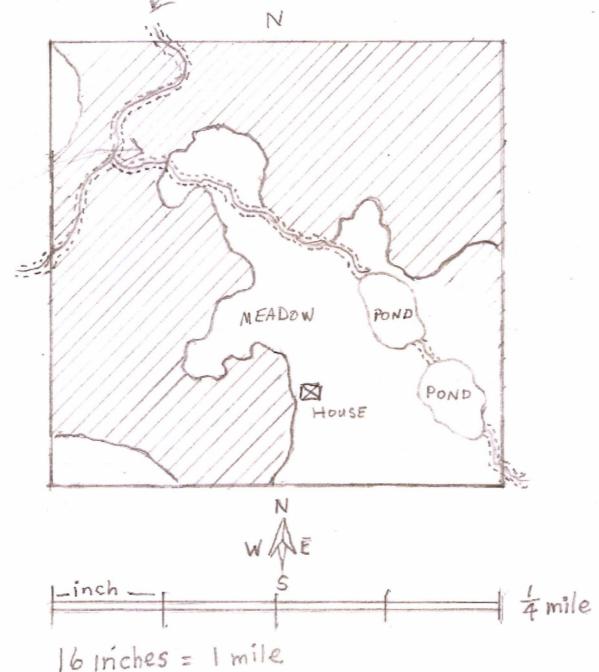

Project is establishing a healthy forest on 25 forested acres of a 40 acre privately owned parcel surrounded by national forest, which was recently thinned under Pingree Hill Fuel Reduction project. It is located 1/4 mile from Shambhala Mountain Center with whom we are collaborating for this grant. Project includes thinning to CSFS guidelines, removal of standing dead trees, removal of excessive dead material in stream beds, and utilization of all resulting material in the form of sawed lumber, firewood for domestic use, fence rails, and chipped/as biomass contribution to the forested areas. All materials will be utilized. Replanting will occur in specific locations, and will provide diversity of native species. Special attention will be paid to thinning along waterways as per Forestry Best Management Practice For Protecting Water Quality in Colorado.

The relevant CWPP is The Manhatten Creek CWPP established 2007 which calls for thinning on our property as one that abutts National Forest Land. Mr. John Ohm who is a contact person for the CWPP, has been contacted and confirms that our project plan is in compliance. Protection of Water Supplies

Project site is at the headwaters of a tributary of Manhatten Creek and includes the only two ponds in the vicinity. The reduction of fuels throughout project site will reduce risk of waterway contamination from high intensity fires. Forestry Best Management Practices for Protecting Water Quality in Colo details a number of relevant practices that will be implemented, including identifying and designating the two SMZs, protecting them from machinery impact, slashpiles, burning or excessive chips. Sufficient trees shall remain to stabilize soils. High stumps will be left after any cutting. Excessive dry fuels exist in one SMZ and will be removed. Ground cover in SMZ will not be disturbed.

Provide labor, materials, equipment, and transportation to accomplish the following: tree thinning for fuel reduction and forest health by means of chain saws, ATV skidding, splitter and chipper on 25 acres. Slash will be chipped where accessible and piled for burning where inaccessible. Larger logs will be hauled to nearby sawmill for construction lumber. Thinned Doug Fir between 3 1/2 and 7 inches diameter will be machine peeled for fence material. Other small material will be bucked, split and stacked on site for domestic firewood. Slash and branches will be chipped and dispursed on site to a maximum depth of 2 inches and also used for mulching new plantings. All small fir trees suitable for Christmas trees will be marked and harvested at Christmas time and donated. All old large trees will be retained. The only exceptions are a few places where excessive competition among large trees occurs. Aspen groves will be protected by removing small diameter conifers. Project design includes replanting 180 trees in areas that will not be naturally restocked, (approx.3 acres) and scattered throughout project area to provide specie diversity. Tree types to be planted: 30 each of white fir, limber pine, pinion pine, juniper, doug fir and ponderosa pine. Tree type retained favors ponderosa. Contract with Elliot Forest Services is already in place. Rental epuipment is reserved.

Assuming Grant is awarded late summer of 2013, marking trees to be thinned and those to be saved will occur in the first month after Grant award. Then in fall 2013 approximately half of the thinning, skidding, splitting, chipping and hauling will be accomplished. In early spring of 2014 all planting will be accomplished.

The remaining work will be accomplished fall of 2014. The entire project will be completed in 18 months.

Project is designed by applicant in collaboration with Jared Leveille, the Land Steward at Shambhala Mountain Center, our nearest neighbor. They have 620 acres and are also applying for this grant. We have been sharing knowledge, experience, contacts, and equipment related to forest land stewardship for several years and will continue to do so for the implementation of this project. Design is also based on guidance from Mike Hughs of CSFS and David Lentz, Larimer County Forester. We worked closely with Dice Gayton of the USFS on the design and specifications of the Pingree Hill Fuels Reduction Project which took place on the National Forest land surrounding our property. The fuel reduction and thinning aspect of our project is a continuation and completion of that work.

The long term benefit will be a forest brought to maximum health, increased diversity and decreased competition, which will improve the watershed condition and reduce risk of high intensity fire. As this is our personal residence and with our strong commitment to proper land stewardship, we will definitely sustain the improved condition and we will teach our children to do the same. We budget \$3,000 per yr for forestry work, which we are increasing to \$4000 per yr for 2013 and 2014.

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
