Don Quixote, a ballet in 4 acts choreographed by Marius Petipa, was first presented by the Bolshoi Theatre, Moscow, in 1869. Tonight you will see excerpts from the musical score of the ballet with new choreography made especially for the Ballet Repertory Ensemble, in the manner of Petipa, and in the Spanish style of the traditional Don Quixote ballet. The opening adagio of the grand pas de deux, presented in the evening performances, is based on the traditional version, revised by Aleksandr Gorsky for the Bolshoi Ballet's first US tour in 1966.

CAROL RODERICK has taught, coached, and trained teachers and dancers for professional companies, universities, and prestigious schools in the United States, Canada, Japan and Europe. She received her early training in Boston, and later at Butler and Indiana Universities. Her formal pedagogical training was received from the late Jürgen Schneider (Bolshoi Ballet, Stuttgart Ballet, American Ballet Theatre) and Gabriela Komleva (Kirov/

Maryinsky Ballet). She was Principal Teacher at AIS International Ballet in Japan, and a member of the professional division faculties of Boston Ballet School and The Royal Winnipeg Ballet School. She directed the Colorado Ballet School, Tulsa Ballet School, and Academy of Ballet Idaho. She was the Program Manager for the Bolshoi Ballet at Vail, and also served as ballet mistress for the Cleo Parker Robinson New Dance Ensemble. For many years, she ran her own preprofessional training program in Denver: Classical Ballet Ensemble. She has coached and prepared students for the Prix de Lausanne, Japan Grand Prix, New York International Ballet Competition and the USA International Ballet Competition, as well as local and regional scholarship competitions throughout the USA. Many of her students have gone on to professional performance, choreographic, and teaching careers.

JANE SLUSARSKI-HARRIS is a

Professor at Colorado State University where she co-directs the Division of Dance and Theatre. Since 1988, she has been the Director of Dance at CSU where she teaches ballet and modern dance technique, history, pedagogy, and all levels of classical Pilates. Slusarski-Harris has choreographed and performed in numerous works for the concert stage, musical theatre, and opera and for a number of years danced with IMPACT DANCE. She received her MFA in dance from the University of Colorado.



tor of Diavolo Dance Theater. She was a member of CSU's Tour Dance Company and performed at K-12 schools throughout Colorado to share the art of dance with younger generations. Karleen also danced with Canyon Concert Ballet of Fort Collins, performing in the Nutcracker and David Taylor's Contemporary Classics. After graduating, Karleen relocated for a season to Wenham, MA, near Boston, where she taught ballet at the Hamilton-Wenham School of Dance and worked with Boston Ballet's outreach program Citydance. She also danced with modern company Forty Steps Dance under the artistic direction of Sallee Slagle. Since her return to Colorado in 2010, Karleen has been continuing to pursue her passions in the arts. Currently, she teaches early childhood dance classes at Ballet Nouveau Colorado and has danced for two seasons with contemporary dance company Life/Art Dance Ensemble. She is also a certified Zumba Fitness Instructor and a wedding and portrait photographer with Yellow Paddle Photography.

CSU FACULTY BIOS

CHUNG-FU CHANG is an associate professor in the Dance Division of Colorado State University. He has received The 2009 Best Teacher Award from The CSU Alumni Association and an Outstanding Faculty Award from CSU Mortar Board in 2008. Born in Taiwan, he danced professionally with the country's internationally renowned Cloud Gate Dance Theatre and Kaohsiung Contemporary Dance Company. His solo performances and choreographic works have been showcased throughout the United States and abroad, and received near fifty choreographic commissions from both professional ballet and modern dance companies, educational institutions' dance



program, choir and chamber music companies, and dance and film festivals nationally and internationally. This year, he has eight dances premiered and performed in New Zealand, Mexico, the U.S., and Taiwan. He has been able to share his passion of dance by teaching master classes and residencies as a guest instructor throughout the U.S. and overseas.

JULIE BALLARD

Ms. Ballard is full time staff and adjunct faculty at the Dance Center of Columbia College. Ms. Ballard is no stranger to theatre either, working with Signal Ensemble as an Artistic Associate designing both lights and media. Ms. Ballard earned her MFA from the University of Florida.



GUEST ARTIST SOLO PERFORMER

ANDREW SKEELS is originally from the Boston area. He trained at the Boston Ballet School under Carol Roderick, Vladimir Kaleshnikov, and Franco DeVita. Before becoming a member of Les Grands Ballets Canadiens (Gradimir Pankov, artistic director), he danced at Internationale Ballet (Eldar Aliev, artistic director), Festival Ballet of Providence (Mihailo Djuric, artistic director), and Colorado Ballet (Gil Boggs, artistic director). In addition to working with and performing the works of major international dance makers, Mr. Skeels is himself a choreographer of some note. His works have been commissioned by and

performed at the Museum of Contemporary Art (Denver, CO), Colorado Ballet, Colorado State University Dance Division, Neglia Ballet (New York), Festival Ballet of Providence (Rhode Island), University of Massachusetts (Boston), Boston Ballet School, and West Wave Dance Festival (San Francisco).



GUEST ARTIST ALUMNI CHOREOGRAPHER AND DANCER

GRADY SOAPES

is currently dancing in his second season with 3rd Law Dance/Theater under the direction of Katie Elliott and Jim LaVita where he also serves as the program assistant to the company. Mr. Soapes earned his BA in dance from Colorado State University in May 2009. His previous training hails from Beverly Mozzetti in Alamosa, CO, and as an apprentice with the Illinois Ballet, under the direction of Mary Price-Boday. In addition to ongoing study with the CSU faculty including Chung-Fu Chang, Jane Slusarski-Harris, Melissa Corr and Carol Roderick, Mr.

Soapes has had the privilege to also work with artists David Capps, Kim Neal Nofsinger, Mary Wohl-Haan, Jacques Heim of Diavolo Dance Theatre and David Taylor of David Taylor Dance Theatre. He has performed extensively, and his choreographic works have been featured in CSU's main stage performances and American College Dance Festivals around the country. He also was a company member and assistant to the director of the CSU Tour Dance Company, and traveled with the troupe on its tours to the International Festival of Contemporary Dance in Merida, Mexico. Currently Mr. Soapes is teaching classes and workshops throughout the Denver area and recently served as a faculty member at Perry-Mansfield Performing Arts School and Camp in Steamboat Springs, CO for their Discovery program.

GUEST ARTIST ALUMNI DANCER

CHANTEL DOYON is from Del Norte, Colorado and has been dancing for seventeen years. Ms. Doyon graduated from Colorado State University in May 2010 with a B.A. in Performing Arts and a B.S. in Health and Exercise Science. In October, 2008 Chantel had the opportunity to work with Diavolo Dance Theatre, under Artistic Director Jacques Heim. In 2008 and 2010, Chantel performed works by Chung-Fu Chang in the Festival Internacional de Danza Contemporanea Avant Garde



in Merida, Mexico. She has also performed at American College Dance Festivals in Mississippi, California, and Tennessee; and performed in the ACDFA Gala Concert in 2009. Beginning in October 2010, Chantel spent three months in Canada working with Karma Dance Theatre. Her time there culminated in a Contemporary Dance Rock Opera completed in collaboration with Comfortably Numb – Canada's Pink Floyd Show.

Jessica Olin graduated from CSU in 2007 with a B.A. in Dance and a B.S. in Dietetics. During her college career, she had the opportunity to work and study with choreographers and teachers such as Jane Slusarski-Harris, Chung-Fu Chang, Melissa Corr, Linda Harris-Cooper, Lisa Morgan, Judy Bejarano, Hannah Kahn, Gabriel Masson, Katie

Elliot, and Kim Neal Knofsinger. Her own choreography was selected on multiple occasions for showcase in the CSU Fall and Spring Dance Concerts. Her work was also chosen for adjudication in the 2007 American College Dance Festival. After graduating from CSU, Jessica studied at the Houston Metropolitan Dance Center and with Chris Harris, KC Chun-Manning and Debbie Mercer in Denver. She was asked to perform as a guest artist at CSU in 2008 and is a guest choreographer and performer for Colorado Centre of Dance's annual benefit for the Children's Hospital, Hearts for Hearts' Sake. Her choreography was also chosen for Assemblage, an adjudicated showcase presented by Ascential Dance Theatre in 2009. Jessica is the founder and director of Life/Art Dance Ensemble, a nonprofit contemporary dance company based out of Denver. In addition to taking on the exciting challenge of creating and running a dance company, Jessica currently works as a Registered Dietitian for King Soopers.
