I have attached information for two grant applications.

One application is for Front Range Fuels Treatment Partnership (FRFTP) funds. This application is due to the Boulder District Office on or before July 10<sup>th</sup>. This grant has a relatively short turn-around of a month or two. The funds would be available from award date through September 2010; possibly longer depending on the stipulations of the federal funds awarded. Please note that a project map is required. These grant funds would initially be awarded to the CSFS Boulder District account, making us the party responsible for its completion. The funds would then be signed over to the awarded agency or community. With this in mind, our district may have to make minor edits to the application.

The other application is for the 2010 SFA WUI Grants. This application is due to the Boulder District Office on or before August 14<sup>th</sup>. All applications are bundled together at the state office and sent in as one large grant application to the federal government. This grant has an average of about a 10 month turn-around. The funds would be available from the summer 2010 award date through September 2011. These applications must be filled out in the PDF format.

Instructions are included for the SFA grant. The same basic rating criteria is used with the FRFTP grant. Both grants require a hard dollar for dollar match. Please note that our district now has many grants and projects that are active. We may not be able to serve as anything more than an inspector for future projects. All work must be done to CSFS standards. Include any project administrative needs into your planning for these projects.

We will prioritize and package these at our office before forwarding on to the state office. Our prioritization will be based on CWPP overall community risk and the cost per acre charged to the grant dollars.

Currently, there are multiple local grant applications that are still going through the review process. If you are not sure what applications your agency/group has out, please contact me. I expect that application period for Colorado's Watershed grant and the Federal Bark Beetle grant will come out around August. We do not have any additional information on the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act funds. More information on that should be available within a couple months.
